"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven."

Ecclesiastes 3:1

The writer of Ecclesiastes was a part of the wisdom tradition in the Old Testament that proclaimed there was a certain order to life, created and sustained by God, "a time for every matter under heaven."

So in January, it was time to study the Old Testament prophets, not in the order they appear in the Bible, but in the order in which they actually spoke, from the earliest words of Samuel and Nathan to the latest from Malachi and Joel.

Then during Lent, it was time to shift our attention to the Passion Stories of Jesus, comparing this story as told in the four Gospels. We followed the same pattern during Easter, comparing the resurrection stories in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

Throughout the summer, it was time to prepare for our November trip to the Holy Land. We studied the person of the Apostle Paul, the places he visited which we also would see, and the Holy Land itself. All culminated with three days in Rome and then two weeks to those special sights in Italy, Greece, and Israel.

Meanwhile, throughout the fall, it was time we explored the letters of Paul, again not in the order in which they appear in the New Testament, but in chronological order, beginning with 1 and 2 Thessalonians, and ending with 1 and 2 Timothy and Titus. A special word of deep appreciation is extended to Pastor Curt Gerald for teaching while I was in the Holy Land. His knowledge, wit, and faithfulness are blessings to us all. To those who traveled with us—thank you for going! You were a delight to travel with. And to Carolyn and Ed Cuttle and Sharon and Chuck Little: the trip would never have occurred without your travel expertise. Thank you for your diligence and hard work!

Finding the right place to teach has been a bit of a challenge this year, especially on Sunday mornings. In September we moved from the traditional adult ed classroom across the hall to accommodate more people. As it turned out, that wasn't necessary based on numbers alone. But it did afford us a much larger screen for video presentations. Continuing to meet on the west end of our building, however, has caused some challenges for a number of people, since the walk from the new nave to the current classroom is quite long. We hope to find a remedy as we move into 2019.

I want to offer a final word of thanks for the support adult education has received from staff and from the number of people who continue to participate in our adult ed classes both on Sundays and Wednesdays. Without you our classes wouldn't exist. I am so grateful that, week after week, you take your time to honor our classes with your presence.

In December we held a Ministry Fair, set up in the former Crossroads area. Over 200 people attended after all three services and over 60 people signed up for more information on one or more ministries. Ut Ministry leads did a great job in contacting all who expressed interest.

Our new Barnabas Caregiving Ministry took off during the summer of 2018 and is doing well, with another training session planned for February 2019. This is a program to train people in how to come alongside those with various struggles and challenges in life to listen, encourage, and be, as Luther said, "little Christs" to our fellow sojourners.

Shepherd of the Prairie has been blessed to have built such a beautiful addition consisting of our New Sanctuary, Gathering Space, Office Suite, Music/Education wing and enlarged parking area that has more than doubled our original footprint. All of these improvements will certainly help further our Outreach into the community, as well as assist and expand our Ministry programs. Much excitement has been generated over the past few years to see what our building will be. Now it is time for SOTP to focus on what the Lord has planned for our congregation by concentrating on building relationships within the Community through our Ministry Programs.

Our "Strategic Direction at Shepherd of the Prairie" is changing. In October,2017, Shepherd of the Prairie was blessed with a 2-day visit by a team from the ELCA. 2018 Building Team Report

Your SOTP Building Team:

Our Building directive to build a Sanctuary and Gathering Area took a few twists and turns. Because of frugality on the Building Team's part, and due to generous donations, the Building Team was able to finish FOUR PHASES of the new building.

- Phase I: New Sanctuary and Gathering Area completed in time for first church service; July 21, 2018. Dedication 8/5/18.
- Phase II: Due to savings as a direct result from the Building Team's frugal spending, the Office Suite, alternate #2, was built. Four additional offices, and workroom constructed resulting in the New Office Entrance from south lot.
- Phase III: Parking Lot completed to Maximum Capacity, alternate #6. This resulted in DOUBLE the parking spaces from original parking lot footprint built in 2008. Christmas Eve services 2018, with over 530 attending the 5:00pm service resulted in our members and guest having no problem finding a parking space! Halleluiah!
- Phase IV: Music/Education Wing completed thanks to a generous onetime estate donation directed to complete the Music/Ed Wing, with the balance of funds to be used to help pay down the mortgage. Music/Ed room, New Nursery, Quiet room, as well as 2 additional bathrooms completed. Alternate #3 buildout completed.

Important dates in Shepherd of the Prairie's history:

- July 21st, 2018; First Church Service held in the New Sanctuary
- August 5th, 2018; Dedication of our New Sanctuary and Gathering Area

The building Team has worked tirelessly for over *three years* to complete this project. There are still a few projects yet to be completed and we continue to work on:

- Keyless Entry System
- Security Cameras
- Landscaping completion following up from Tile placement on North grounds

It has been an honor to serve alongside such dedicated workers as your Building Team.

Building on Faith – 2018

The Building on Faith campaign was formed in February of 2018, a repeat of a similar campaign of 2008-09 when funds were needed to furnish our original church building. All Ministry team members were asked to compile a list of what was needed for their particular team for the new addition. Included was worship/music (pews, friendship pads, hymnals, hearing assist installation); gathering area (tables/chairs, furniture); offices; sound board (audio/visual camera and video screens; computer); sacristy (refrigerator, banner racks, cabinets and storage); property team storage; welcome center (TV monitors); coffee bar (appliances, coffee system, vacuums,); Security (Video access system, Keyless entry, camera security system); and extensive landscaping. From the information gathered members and friends were asked to "gift" any and all items on the BOF board listing having the opportunity to dedicate their gifts to the memory of loved ones or to honor or celebrate special family members/friends or events. The response for gifting was amazing. During the five month campaign \$126,897.00 was raised to purchase the above items and trees, plants and bushes. Thanks be to God for the wonderful response from all who were able to participate in Building on Faith to complete the furnishings and landscaping for the sanctuary and other areas. Finance Team

The Finance Team is responsible for overseeing the day to day and month to month financial activities of the church. The 2018 Team members were Don Schneider, Devin Burg, Rich Juergensen, Ed Cuttle, Bob Mollis, Jim Henley, our Church Treasurer Dan Wentzloff, and Dave Shotick our Accounting Administrator.

The Finance Team monitors all financial activities and meets monthly to review the church's financial reports. We report monthly to the Church Council with our analysis of the church's financial position as well as with any recommendations that we think appropriate. We are responsible for the preparation of the church's annual budget and the monitoring of our actual financial activities against that budget.

In addition to the above we are responsible for managing the church's building fund, maintaining adequate reserves for the maintenance of our building, periodically reviewing the church's insurance coverage and policies, reviewing contracts for services, being alert to compliance issues, and assisting with an audit of the church's accounting records.

In 2017 the Team reviewed the church's Financial Policies and Procedures and provided the Congregational Council with recommended changes and additions. These policies were implemented in 2018 and are being monitored and adjusted as necessary.

Throughout 2018 the Finance Team monitored all expenses associated with our new building project assuring that the project remained on budget. On completion of the project we converted our \$3,750,000 Construction Loan to a 25 Year Conventional Mortgage. Principal and Interest payments began on November 1, 2018.

You will find our 2018 Financial Reports and 2019 Budget enclosed elsewhere in this Annual Report.

2018 Year End Treasurer's Report

The faithful and generous support of this congregation has made 2018 another successful year for Shepherd of the Prairie as once again, you have provided the resources needed to do God's Mission and Ministry.

GENERAL FUND

The General Fund Balance as of year-end was \$182,477 an increase of \$35,238. We finished 2018 with Operating Income exceeding our budget by \$29,296. Expenses were under budget by \$5,942. This combination of increased giving and controlled expenses resulted in an operating surplus of \$35,238. Thanks to all of you for making the year a success!

As of December 31, 2018, our Fund Balances are as shown in the following table.

BUILDING FUND

For the Forward in Faith Building Campaign we received \$432,908 in Donations this past year and as of December 31st we had a Building Fund Balance of \$33,269 which was used towards the January Mortgage Payment. Mortgage payments are to pay the \$3,750,000 Commercial Loan from the Mission Investment Fund of the ELCA. In 2019 this Fund will be called the Mortgage Service Fund.

BUILDING ON FAITH FUND

During the Fall members generously contributed \$126,897 to the Building on Faith Campaign which provided needed pews and furnishings for the new Sanctuary. A tremendous success!

OPERATING BUDGET FOR 2019

We are presenting for your consideration a Budget for 2019 which will meet the Mission and Ministry needs of our church. 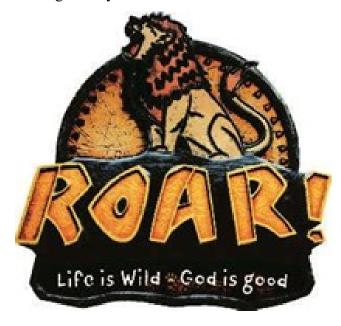

2018 was the first year of our new Barnabas Caregiving Ministry. Beginning a Barnabas Caregiving Ministry was one of the recommendations that resulted from our ministry review from the ELCA in October of 2017.

We held a training session on April 14, 2018 led by Pastor Chuck Olson, the creator of the program. This program is similar to Stephen Ministries, but more easily adaptable for SOTP. Thirty-one people attended the training session. Out of the group who attended the training, twenty people became Barnabas Ministers and were commissioned on May 20, 2018, Pentecost Sunday.

The charge to Barnabas Ministers is to provide a listening ear to those dealing with illness, grief, recovery, loneliness, or any other trauma in their life. The goal is to encourage through listening. Barnabas Ministers don't attempt to "fix" the situation, or provide physical care to their carereceiver, but simply to listen and encourage.

Currently, Barnabas Ministers give their listening care through one on one pairings with another member of SOTP. They visit either in person or by phone call on a weekly or by-weekly basis. Other ministers are on the "Pastoral Care Team", and they help Pastor Mark with hospital and care facility visits each week. There is another set of Barnabas Ministers who take care of the administrative items and the prayer chain, and another who participate as "Communion from the Assembly Ministers. All Barnabas Ministers are trained to take Communion for the Assembly to their care-receivers and many do once or twice a month.

This has been an exciting first year and we look forward to 2019. There is another training session set for February 9, 2019 here at SOTP. Come and see what we are all about!

GRIEF SUPPORT

This ministry provides booklets on grief that are mailed four times over the first year after the death of a loved one. The booklets offer comfort and insight into the grieving process. This year thirty-five families/individuals received this set of books.

Outreach Ministry

In 2018 we purchased new SOTP pens, created a Ministry Moments final edited video featuring SOTP ministry highlights and on March 3, 2018 we participated in the Huntley Home, Business & Wellness Expo. We used the above-mentioned video at our 2018 event booths to help tell our story. Throughout the year, the OUTREACH ministry partnered with the SOTP Crafters to support the booth set up for the Farmers Market in downtown Huntley on selected dates as well as the craft show at Leggee Elementary school. The OUTREACH committee will continue to work closely with the Crafters and we will be helping with table and canopy set up for craft shows in 2019. We will supply the crafters with items promoting the church as well as half sheet advertisements for upcoming events that can be handed out during the craft shows.

With help from the members of SOTP, we assembled a float for the Huntley Memorial Day Parade. We provided each OUTREACH team member and each congregation parade participant from our church with a "God's Work, our Hands" t-shirt. We featured a LIVE praise band on our float with a supporting audio system. In doing so, we created a mobile concert and handed out sunglasses and beachballs along with other promotional Shepard of the Prairie materials, as we shared our Love for Jesus by inviting the community to attend SOTP Vacation Bible School over the summer. This event was a great opportunity for our church family to work together to spread the Good News of Jesus' Love to our community.

In 2019 we will continue advertising selected SOTP events in local papers with the help of Michelle Rankin and the office staff. We will once again be utilizing opportunities with papers that provide free listings and announcements for the community. New giveaways will be distributed through the Huntley new resident totes as well as other community events that we participate in 2019. The Shepherd of the Prairie OUTREACH ministry will continue participating in Huntley annual events supported by members of the church.

This year at the welcome center we counted over 40 completed membership cards for 2018. Out of those, over half became members. We handed out cutting boards and multi tools as well as pull string backpacks to every family at our Christmas and New Year's Eve services. We will continue to provide welcome mugs to all visitors at our regular service times.

Once again, the Huntley community has seen what a great church family we have as we work together to tell others about Jesus and continue to invite people to our church. We continue to greet guests that come to visit. Our mission has been to

continue spreading the Love and the Good News of the resurrection of Jesus, while creating more recognizable branding for Shepard of the Prairie. We continued featuring reflex blue as our primary color for giveaway items that we purchase to help promote the church, as well as, display items for community events that we participate in. This year we purchased matching blue table cloths that pair nicely with our branded canopies, displaying the church logo on them, along with logoed walls and half walls for the canopies. Fall Fest, in September, was once again, our biggest community event in 2018. We featured carnival style games and giveaways again this year with our two-booth space set up, where the SOTP Crafters displayed and sold crafts for the church in one space and in the other space we featured games. Prizes were distributed featuring the Shepherd of the Prairie logo as well as information about our church for booth visitors. We encourage all church members to consider helping to host our booth next year.

Overall the Shepherd of the Prairie OUTREACH ministry was more amply supported in 2018 but the ministry is currently in need of more planners and volunteers to support events that SOTP participates in with the Huntley community. Please consider joining this important community ministry.

STEWARDSHIP

Stewardship is essentially how we manage God's creation and his many blessings to us. Think of it as our being entrusted with God's resources and how we would manage those resources for the good of all, both inward and outward. That's what we aim to do in this ministry.

We focus on three key issues: TIME, TALENT, and TREASURE.

Our theme this year for our 2019 financial program was God's Grace...Our Response. During the four weeks of worship from October 12 through November 4, we were privileged to have five different perspectives on why giving was an important part of these people's financial discipline and what giving to SOTP has meant to them. Marian Mesenbrink, Ralph Wehnes, Becky Tuzik, and Orion & Gloria Samuelson spoke from their hearts, encouraging us to put God and Christ first in our financial planning. We had two areas for giving considerations, the General Fund and the Mortgage Service Fund. We complete the Building in Faith three year campaign at the end of this year.

On Sunday, November 4, we consecrated our Estimate of Giving cards before our sanctuary alter in a special box made by Chris Trodahl for this occasion. Afterwards, we adjourned to our Multipurpose room for a free luncheon catered by Butcher on the Block.

Going forward into next year, we will revisit prospects to add a way to receive credit/debit cards contributions for a variety of circumstances. Plans are to review presentations by our current **Simply Giving** provider, Vanco, and a synod partner, Tithe.ly, who manages credit/debit card payments to churches. Our aim is to have a system in place no later than the end of March next year.

This brings up a point to consider the use of **Simply Giving** as a means to provide financial support to our church. By filling out a special form, you can have your weekly, bi-weekly, monthly, or quarterly offerings directly sent from your financial institution to our local bank checking account on the day that you select. A good thing about EFT is that if we are sick, travelling, or simply unable to be in worship, our offering is always there!

In addition, if you are age 70 or older, you may make a Qualified Charitable Distribution from a Traditional IRA to satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution, thereby lowering your Adjusted Gross Income which reins in taxes on Social Security Benefits and avoids Medicare premium surcharges. You can also donate stock that has appreciated in value and you will not owe capital-gains taxes. We suggest you confer with your tax advisor regarding your specific situation.

Congregation Support Ministries (cont)

We have been blessed in adding new members to our committee. Our current members are Ralph Wehnes, Warren Brody, Doug Sandberg, Ron Mudge, Jodi Dowell, Chris Brolsma, and Matt Greene. Matt, Vice President of our Church Council, acts as our liaison with them. All have provided important input on various topics that we discuss and their time and talents are appreciated.

Lastly, we look forward to representing our committee at our Mission and Ministry Fair after worship on December 1 & 2.
