I invite you read the above text in preparation for reading my remarks regarding our shared life together at SOTP.

The above statements represent our working ministry directives guiding the ministry at SOTP. As you read through this Annual Report it is my hope you will see how these directives have affected our vision for ministry and the good work being done by God through his people here.

This year for my report to the congregation I would like to offer a prayer in response to the challenges which presents itself to us as we seek to be in God will and discover the Spirit's guidance as a Great Commission Church (Matthew 28:19-20).

In the latter part of John's gospel (the 17<sup>th</sup> Chapter) Jesus prays for his followers, the church. He prays for oneness in ministry and mission. He prays for his followers to be strong in relationship to God and seek goodness in their relationships with one another.

With these things in mind, I invite us to pray together...

Jesus asks you, his heavenly Father, the very Creator of this Universe, that we might be one with him, as he is one with you. We realize this is the very foundation of his ministry, and yet, we sometimes wonder if we, his church, truly grasp and understand the importance of his prayer for us.

For to be one with Jesus, and to be one with you, not only assures us of your adoption of us as your own, not only assures us we participate in Jesus' victory over sin and death, but it also calls us to be at one with Jesus in his ministry, the ministry to which you sent him to this earth to accomplish.

By the power of your Holy Spirit, move among each of us here at Shepherd of the Prairie, and inspire us to envision ways we might reach out to others with the saving grace with which your Son reached out to those of his day. Help us envision new avenues of ministry, so we don't just talk about the ills of our society, but actively invest our time and energy and resources to do something to meet the challenges of our day.

Help us to realize we now stand at a crossroads in our ministry. Guide us by your Spirit's power to take the necessary steps to move forward faithfully. As you send more and more to come and see, create in us a deep desire to provide necessary programs and opportunities for these new sisters and brothers to not only feel welcomed, but also be inspired to grow as disciplined followers of yours. Help us be innovative in our approach to ministry through small groups.

Inspire us through your Holy Spirit, to seek new ways to become more dynamic in helping our youth grow in faith. Your Spirit has led us to improve our confirmation program, but there is more to be done. With all of the pressures of this world that tug and pull at the faith of our youth, open our hearts and minds to find ways to support them.

Help us to realize we might not be able to meet this challenge on our own, that we might need to engage others with special skills to assist us.

We have seen the enthusiasm and excitement generated in the lives of our youth as they prepare for time away during summer mission trips. Bless our youth and their leaders as they prepare once again to go and even more especially bless them in their return. May what is done be a touchstone to inspire their lives of living service to you and the people you call on them to bless with your grace.

Oh Lord, help us become more dynamic in our ministry to our youth. Help us to envision and develop programing that will be exciting for them to attend, within the context of our own faith tradition. And grant us the courage to see it through.

And dear Lord, enable us to envision new ways of supporting our parents to nurture their own faith, as well as assisting them to fulfill their vows to raise their children to affirm the faith of their baptism. To be a parent is an awesome responsibility, especially in this time, when so many outside influences in our world would undermine our parental leadership, as well as the fabric of the relationship between husbands and wives.

In his prayer, Oh Lord, Jesus asked that we not be taken out of the world, but that we might be protected from evil. He asked this of you through the assurance of having given us your word. Inspire us, Lord, to find new and exciting ways of proclaiming your word, that it might strengthen the bonds between husbands and wives, parents and children.

To this end, may our worship not only become more dynamic, but may we also seek to provide other activities that will increase fellowship and support among our families. For your word, is a dynamic word, which encounters us in a variety of ways and in a variety of activities. Grant us opportunity to bring families together in your presence, that we might come to grow in fellowship and support of each other.

And grant that we might find ever increasing ways to support our senior members to enjoy fellowship in your presence, and to share their faith and experience with others. Over the years, oh Lord, I have discovered the richness of your grace ever present in the lives of those who have lived their lives in faith. They have been an inspiration to me, as I myself have grown in faith.

Grant us your vision, oh Lord, to find new ways to support these persons of faith, and to encourage them to share their experiences in ways that create deeper faith in us all. I have heard of programs that pair youth preparing for confirmation with senior members of the congregation, in which relationships have been formed that deepen the faith, not only of the youth, but also the senior. Help us to discern ways in which we might also support our senior members and encourage their witness.

Oh God, Jesus prayed that we might be one, as he was one with you. So unite us through the power of your Holy Spirit, that we might embrace the ministry that you set before us. We do not claim to know all of the ways in which we might achieve this. We are only your humble servants, who seek your guidance and trusts in you to help lead us do what we are able, to further your kingdom. Grant us the courage and inspiration to do what we can, and the wisdom to realize limitations and seek the expertise of others to do what we can not do.

And finally, Lord, Jesus prayed that you might sanctify us in the truth, that your word is truth. And then he assured you that he has sent us into the world, just as you had sent him into the world. So, help us raise up bold new leaders to serve.

We echo Jesus prayer, oh God. We pray through your Holy Spirit, you would sanctify Shepherd of the Prairie Lutheran Church. Give us clarity in the midst of an ever-increasing secular world of the richness of what it means to be distinctively Lutheran in living out our faith. We pray you would make us holy – not in the sense of being devoid of sin, but in the sense of being about the business to which you have consecrated us to carry forth.

Inspire in us a renewed sense of mission, centered in your word, which we might embrace with enthusiasm. Help us to realize that you have blessed us with this facility in order to use it to proclaim your word, to deepen the faith of each other, and to reach out to our community with your grace. Grant us a renewed vision of our purpose, which might unite us as a people dedicated to the ministry your Son initiated.

Where our vision is limited, open us to see new opportunity. Where we need help, grant us the courage to seek it. When we fail, grant us your forgiveness and the ability to try again. Never let us tire of embracing your ministry, as you never tire of embracing us with your grace. Protect us from the evil of this world, especially the evil of indifference and hopelessness. Rather, inspire us to care about making a difference in the lives of those around us, and grant us the means to do so.

Sanctify us Lord. Make us holy. Make us your church. Amen (Let it be so)

## **Director of Adult Education**

"...and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us."

"...I am with you always to the end of the age."

Matthew 1:23 and 28:20

These two verses form the bookends for Matthew's Gospel. They are incredible promises, reminding us of the God who accompanies us along life's journey. "God with us."

Along that way, we pause to read, reflect, and study the words of this God-among-us. It's called adult education, or life-long learning, or better—faith formation. That's what 2019 has been about.

We opened the year inquiring into Luke's Gospel because Luke was the primary Gospel for this past year. Then, during Lent, we explored the Ten Commandments in a new way, combining the Commandments together with common themes. Following Easter, we looked at the Inter-testamental period, the years between the last writings of the Old Testament and the coming of Jesus. What was happening during these years? What significant writings were written, and how did they shape the Jesus story?

After a summer break, we began fall by delving into the Wisdom Literature of the Old Testament, those odd writings that are so different from the rest of the Hebrew Scriptures: a few of the psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Job, and Song of Songs. Then came the Gospel according to Matthew since the first writing in the New Testament is the primary Gospel for 2020.

We also offered Bible 101 for the fourth time in the last two years. This one-day, four-hour event has (hopefully) benefited the 230 people that have attended.

This next year we'll begin by asking, "What does being a 'God-with-us' people mean for living life in the present moment?" This will be followed by a study of the book of Exodus during Lent, the Old Testament story of redemption that parallels our own journey to the Cross.

Summer will bring a time for examining the Oberammergau Passion Play and the land of Luther in preparation for our trip to Germany in September.

Once again, it's been a joy to be with the folks who are so faithful week after week as we meet to wrestle with the Scriptures on Sunday and Wednesday. And it's been a blessing to work with a wonderful staff here at SOTP. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to be among you.

#### **Annual report 2020**

This has been a busy year. We hosted four New Member gatherings in February, May, August, and November where we welcomed 67 adults and 20 children. Many of these new members have become involved in the life of Shepherd of the Prairie and have become friends and fellow minsters in God's kingdom.

We have continued our Grief Journey Group this year and is has been heartwarming to see people connect with others who are grieving to offer and receive comfort, support and insight. A special joy this years was that we are not only reaching people here at SOTP, but in the community around us as well. Several people who are/were not members of SOTP attended the group. In December we held a Blue Christmas Service and shared our loves and losses. We invited the Huntley community to share in this special service with us.

Our Barnabas Caregiving Ministry took off during the summer of 2018 and is doing well, with another training session planned for some time in 2020. This is a program to train people in how to come alongside those with various struggles and challenges in life to listen, encourage, and be, as Luther said, "little Christs" to our fellow sojourners.

We have created a Connections Team to find ways to follow up with members, both new and existing to make sure they are connected in some way to programs and ministries here at SOTP.

Our goal for 2020 is to get Small Groups in place and thriving. We will hold a leadership training session on Jan 12<sup>th</sup> and will be launching our Small Group program the first week in February. Our initial program with be an 8-week commitment and take us through most of Lent. We will be holding a allgroup get together at the end of the 8 weeks to celebrate our groups.

It has been very gratifying to serve God and this congregation as we work together to bring his kingdom and will "on earth as it is in heaven". Thank you for the opportunity to serve in this capacity!

## **Business Administrator**

Dear Congregation Members,

Thank you for the privilege of allowing me to serve as your Business Administrator throughout 2019. This past year continued to be one, of ongoing change, in the Business, Human Resources and Operations areas, of Shepherd of the Prairie Lutheran Church. In 2019, following Shepherd of the Prairie's prior year, of physical growth and expansion, our valued staff, Congregation members, Ministry leads and dedicated Council members and volunteers all set about performing the continuous mission, of aligning SOTP operations, to a changing environment. The aforementioned was accomplished, under Pastor Mark Boster and the Council's leadership and ongoing openness, to support future changes, while balancing the same, with respect, for traditional Church liturgical values and foundations.

In Human Resources, we clarified policies and procedures to better serve and protect Shepherd of the Prairie Church's legal interests and compliance requirements. Focusing on reviewing, revising and clarifying internal practices, policies and procedures, we streamlined processes, where needed, and made sure that the same were being administered fairly and consistently. For example, with our increased number of staff, SOTP is now required, by law, to comply with additional Federal and/or State of Illinois regulations, with respect, to employment practices, insurance, facility management, safety and security and other operational requirements. It is, with everyone's cooperation and dedication, that we have been able to progress forward during 2019's past year of change.

Strengthening SOTP policies, compliance and operations, included initiatives such as implementing SOTP's Child Protection Policy which entailed us making sure that all employees and/or volunteers, who work, with children, under the age, of 18, have undergone a criminal background check and received Child Protection training. To ensure excellence, in how SOTP manages this policy, the content, of our Child Protection Policy and training, was aligned with the State of Illinois's Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) laws and procedures for mandated reporters.

Many meetings and discussions transpired, throughout 2019, on the above mentioned and numerous other topics, including sensitive and confidential matters, that required review, analysis and open dialogue. As you know, change is not always easy. We were all required, to not just review and apply policies and/or to comply, with legal compliance drivers, but to also reexamine SOTP's core values and, often times, our own hearts, when defining and implementing policy, administration and operational changes. Collectively, we all strived to balance policy and compliance, with caring and compassion, toward those affected by the changes.

In 2020, I'm looking forward to coaching our SOTP team, with aligning our everyday work performance, in ways, that will continue to serve and support our Congregation and Church. Please join Pastor Mark, our Council, the SOTP team and myself as we plan and offer new and exciting services, missions and ministries to serve you in 2020! Thank you for all your past support in 2019!

## Youth and Family

- Food Pantry Collection: Confirmation Students and Leaders are assisting with collection of Food Pantry donations each month as well as helping to unload the donations at the Grafton Food Pantry
- Fall Fest, Oct 20: Youth and parents were invited to join the team for lunch, pumpkin bowling, pumpkin putt putt as well as pumpkin carving and painting.
- Green Trees Service Project, Oct 27: A large group of students and confirmation leaders helped with fall clean-up. We trimmed bushes and branches, planted shrubs, raked leaves and spread mulch in addition to cleaning the grounds of loose branches, etc.
- Operation Christmas Child: Throughout October and November students distributed empty boxes, led discussions with confirmation small groups, collected donations and filled boxes. We then held a packing party on Nov 17<sup>th</sup> where we packed <u>189 boxes</u> to send to children worldwide.
- Friendsgiving 11/24: A great afternoon of food, fun and fellowship was had by all who attended. A HUGE thank you to the Greene family for hosting.
- **Bowling** @ **Bowlero 12/8**: a fun afternoon with 2 hours of bowling, food, arcade games and Lazer Tag.
- Culver's night 12/9: Thank you to all who came out to support the youth group as they started their fund raising efforts for the 2020 Mission Trip. Through your support of the dinner and the 50/50 raffle we raised close to \$800!
- Christmas Progressive Dinner and Lock-in Jan 3 & 4: The team held a progressive dinner on 1/3 with a stop for snacks/appetizers and drinks followed by a stop for dinner and finally back to SOTP for dessert, white elephant gift exchange and a night of fun activities, movies and fellowship

#### **Finance Team**

The Finance Team is responsible for overseeing the daily, monthly, and year-end financial activities of the Church. Our 2019 Team members were Don Schneider, Devin Burg, Rich Juergensen, Jim Henley, Bob Mollis, Church Treasurer Dan Wentzloff and Dave Shotick Accounting Administrator.

Your Finance Team monitors all financial activities and meets monthly to review the Church's financial reports. We report monthly to the Church Council with our analysis of the Church's financial position as well as with any financial recommendations we think appropriate. We are responsible for the preparation of the annual budget and the monitoring of our actual financial activities against that budget. Financial policy and procedure recommendations are submitted to Business Manager and Council for approval to improve cost control and financial processes.

We are also responsible for managing the Church's mortgage service fund, maintaining adequate reserves for the maintenance of our building, periodically reviewing the insurance coverage and policies, reviewing contracts for services, being alert to compliance issues, and assisting with an audit of the Church's accounting records.

In 2019, total General Fund contributions increased by \$35,818 over 2018. It did not increase at the pace budgeted for, in order to accomplish all our ministry goals in 2019. The total General Fund contributions were \$757,401 compared to a budget projection of \$799,873. This income short fall was offset with Council and staff controlling cost for a total expense decrease of \$54,269 against budget. This leaves a positive year to date balance of \$11,796.83 to carry forward to 2020.

You will find our 2019 Financial Reports and 2020 Budget enclosed elsewhere in this Annual Report.

Please join us in thanking Dave Shotick for his dedication, service, and knowledge in his role as Accounting Administrator. Dave is retiring from his SOTP position effective 01/31/2020. Best wishes Dave.

## **Community Outreach Ministry**

In 2019 we renamed the OUTREACH ministry to Community Outreach to reflect our focus bonding with the Huntley community. In March we participated in the Huntley Home, Business & Wellness Expo. We used the SOTP Ministry Moments video at our 2019 event booth at the Expo to help tell our story. Throughout the year, the Community Outreach ministry partnered with the SOTP Crafters to support the booth set up for the Farmers Market in downtown Huntley on selected dates as well as the craft show at Huntley High school. our committee also partnered with the Youth and Family, as well as, the Artist Series to help promote and advertise events at the church. We placed several advertisements in local papers along with digital ads on community bulletin boards. The Community Outreach team will continue to work closely with other ministries in 2020. Our goal is to help host more community wide activities at our church and we will also help with table and canopy set up for any community shows that Shepherd of the Prairie is present for in 2020. We will supply SOTP with items promoting the church as well as half sheet advertisements for upcoming events that can be handed out during the shows or community events when possible.

With help from the members of SOTP, we assembled a float for the Huntley Memorial Day Parade. We provided each congregation parade participant from our church with a "God's Work, our Hands" t-shirt. We featured a LIVE praise band on our float with a supporting audio system. In doing so, we created a mobile concert and handed out candy and promotional Shepard of the Prairie materials, as we shared our Love for Jesus by inviting the community to attend SOTP worship services and activities. This event was a great opportunity for our church family to work together to spread the Good News of Jesus' Love to our community.

Fall Fest, in September, was rained out in 2019. We encourage all church members to consider helping to host our booth next year.

In 2020 we will continue advertising selected SOTP events in local papers. We will once again be utilizing opportunities with papers and digital bulletin boards that provide free listings and announcements for the community. We will be also trying to utilize more social media platforms to help creat awareness of SOTP activities in the community. New giveaways will be distributed through the Huntley new resident totes as well as other community events that we participate in 2020. The Shepherd of the Prairie Community Outreach ministry will continue participating in Huntley annual events supported by members of the church.

This year at the welcome center we counted over 30 completed membership cards for 2019. Out of those, over half became members. Besides obtaining information from our visitors, engage them in conversation, provided them with a folder that tells them about all areas of our church and send them a postcard. And, of course, we mug them before they leave. We handed out insulated grocery bags to every family at our Christmas Eve services. We will continue to provide welcome mugs to all visitors at our regular service times.

Once again, the Huntley community has seen what a great church family we have as we work together to tell others about Jesus and continue to invite people to our church. We also continue to greet guests that come to visit. Our mission has been to continue spreading the Love and the Good News of the resurrection of Jesus, while creating more recognizable branding for Shepard of the Prairie. We will continue feature reflex blue as our primary color for giveaway items that we purchase to help promote the church, as well as, display items for community events that we participate in. This year we purchased matching blue table cloths that pair nicely with our branded canopies, displaying the church logo on them, along with logoed walls and half walls for the canopies.

Overall the Shepherd of the Prairie Community Outreach ministry was more amply supported in 2019. We were able to add three new members but the ministry is currently in need of more planners, event hosts, and volunteers to support events that SOTP participates in with the Huntley community. Please consider joining this important community ministry.

## **Barnabas Caregiving Ministry**

#### BARNABAS CAREGIVING MINISTRY

The Barnabas Ministry began in February 2017. Since then two workshops led by Pastor Chuck Olson guided a group of people to encourage and care for God's People through listening with a heart of caring. It's named after St. Barnabas, the Encourager Apostle first mentioned in the book of Acts 4:36-37.

Our primary mission is visiting shut-ins living at home or in assisted living facilities, the hospitalized, those with chronic health problems and those experiencing acute or chronic grieving.

Currently there are 21 active Barnabas Ministers. During visits we engage in conversation, laughter, memorable experiences, sing, administer communion, share news of the church or brighten a day. Hospital visits are shorter with prayer and a reminder Shepherd of the Prairie is praying for their recovery. The Prayer Chain often is the first prayer raised and continues its power as members continue to pray for that need. Four "Card Ladies" send monthly greeting to the shut-ins, another reminder of God's love from SOTP. Lastly, a vital Grief ministry with bi-weekly gatherings round out Barnabas Ministry.

After visits are made a brief note of the visit is placed in a drop box in the church office, later to be recorded in spread sheet data. One member faithfully records this information. If a visit deems more attention, we are encouraged to share immediately with Pastor Mark or Donna Kelly.

The group meets monthly on the 2nd Tuesday at 7pm or 10 am during the winter months. Pastor Mark or Donna Kelly assist in facilitating the meeting. Members lead in devotions and discussion using "Christian Caregiving Handbook".

## MEMORY GARDEN COMMITTEE

At the August meeting, the church council gave the Memory Garden Committee (MGC) permission to apply for a permit from the Village of Huntley to construct a Memory Garden (MG) on the Church property. This will take several months. In the meantime, the MGC has been creating guidelines and regulations for the use of the columbarium. The MGC has decided the location for the MG will be outside the west doors of the Church. This will allow for the funeral flow to move from the sanctuary down the hallway to the MG where the urn will be interred in the columbarium. Following the interment, if there is a luncheon the mourners can return to the all-purpose room. There will also be easy access from the West parking lot to the MG. The sketch we received from Wilbert Monument Co. (on our web site) illustrates how they think the finished MG could look. The MGC will determine the style and quantity of niches we will start with. The major factor will be the number of niches that are presold. Each niche will hold up to two urns. After we receive the permit from the Village of Huntley, the MG design will be brought to the Congregation for approval. Once the congregation approves, we will be able to publish the guidelines, regulations, and cost for each niche. The MG will be self-sustaining. ## **Congregation Support Ministries**

#### STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

Thanks to our Stewardship committee members Ralph Wehnes, Warren Brody, Chris Brolsma, and Matt Green for their service, thoughts, and ideas in directing our stewardship efforts in 2019. Our committee works to include members at SOTP to engage in time, talent, and treasure opportunities within the Body. Our stewardship financial drive is a key focus and this year we began with our introduction to our campaign on Oct 5/6 followed by four temple talks that stressed the importance of our 4 Rocks in building up the mission and ministry programs at SOTP. Thanks to Darren Wolloch, Tessa DeLong, and Bob Malm for their presentations at the Saturday night and both Sunday worship services.

Results of our efforts for congregation members to fill out their Estimate of Giving Cards for Calendar Year 2020 totaled \$814,818.48 for both General Fund and Mortgage Service Funds. This was 4.55% less than the pledges made in 2018 for calendar 2019.

#### Footnotes:

- **1.** Calendar Year (CY) 2020 Estimates of Giving were 4.76% less than those received in CY-2019. Member Contributions for CY-2020 are budgeted to be essentially equivalate to Member Contributions received in CY-2019.
- **2.** SOTP's contribution to the ELCA Northern Synod is budgeted at 10% of expected Member Contributions and will be paid at 10% of Actual Member Contributions received during CY-2020.
- **3.** SOTP's contribution to Local Mission is budgeted at 1% of expected Member Contributions and will be paid at 1% of Actual Member Contributions received during CY-2020.
- **4.** In CY-2019 Outreach Ministry was funded by Outreach Reserve Funds. In CY-2020, and going forward, Outreach Ministry will be a budgeted expense.
- 5. The Youth Ministry Mission Trip will be self-funded.
- **6.** In the past 18 months we have taken steps to Staff for Growth. We have added the positions of Business Administrator, Director of Children and Family Services, and have increased the hours for several other positions. In CY-2020 SOTP Staffing Ministry will remain flat by holding compensation at CY-2019 levels and eliminating the budgets for Staffing for Growth and Custodian.
- **7.** In CY-2020 we are not budgeting to fund Provisions for the Future (Reserves). Based on current estimates, we were unable to fund these Provisions and present a balanced budget.
