Pastor's Report to the Congregation

What a year!

2020 was a year like no other in our lives.

It was full of processing heartaches and hurts as well as embracing new ideas, staff and ministry while trusting in the gracious love of God.

It was a year in which I was reminded of the importance in telling and sharing our stories. In being open to new ideas and ways to make meaningful connections with people. The importance of the word engagement. Asking each day who I have engaged in ministry to further the Kingdom. Also, realizing often, feelings of falling short.

What we've learned and how we experience brokenness and joy becomes part of the larger story of God's love in the world.

"That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched – this we proclaim concerning the Word of life."

1 John 1:1-3

In the middle of 2020 I was given a daily devotion book called "Savor: Living Abundantly Where You Are, As You Are" by Shauna Niequist.

It's a book that plays off of cooking. Cooking – of all things, the devotional piqued my interest. As many of you know cooking is one of my many joys in life. One of those joys this year has been to finally be able to cook a great slab of ribs. Certainly 2020 was a year when we had to search diligently to find joy.

I found this devotion to be particularly meaningful.

The book uses cooking in a different way - a way to remind its reader of the joy of "savoring" each moment, each meal, each table at which God's people are gathered as we proclaim the Word of life.

The introduction reads: "What I want to do is savor this life – my life, my children, my community, this gorgeous world God created. That's what we all want, right? To soak up the goodness all around us, to be aware of holy fingerprints everywhere, to walk through each day expecting and noticing those glints and shimmers of the divine right in the daily – in a hug, a tomato sandwich, a quiet moment, a text from someone we love. That's what I want, and so often I miss it. I lay in bed at night frustrated with myself that I allowed the minor annoyances of life to obscure the rich melody underneath it. I rush and push and don't even see the beauty all around me. I let my fear about the unknowns in our future or my desire to control everything and everyone around me cover over the deep beauty and grace and peace that are playing like a drumbeat under everything. This collection [of daily devotions] is my attempt at paying attention, at clearing away space and noise, and inviting you to hear the drumbeat, too. God's always speaking, always. He's always moving, always present, always creating, always healing. The trick, at least for me, is paying attention. The trick is savoring."

Savoring...

- Paying attention.
- Seeing the divine in the daily.
- Participating at the table (worship).
- Hearing and sharing the stories of God's love and grace with those around us.

This is the work of the church.

This is the drumbeat that we are a part of through the ministry of Shepherd of the Prairie.

Now is the time to look back, remember and savor the memories and learnings from 2020. We will take time to learn from our mistakes as well as celebrate new joys and hopes God has provided through SOTP's ministry.

And then we are invited into 2021's new hopes and adventures!

2021 will bring continued work on strategic planning in the ministry areas of worship, Christian education, service, and God guiding us to raise up new leaders to serve in ministry within and outside our church.

We will be invited to savor our God moments as we live our story as a church and community. By God grace we will once again all be invited back into public worship and continue to live out our Lord's Pray, "Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

Thanks be to God for this place, this work, this table, and these moments to savor and pay attention to in 2021. So thankful to serve as your pastor at Shepherd of the Prairie, a growing church, for growing people!

2020: perhaps the strangest year of our lives! COVID 19; a pandemic; a contentious political season; a nation divided, not seen since the Civil War; Black Lives Matter; civil unrest swamping the streets of our cities; and the list goes on and on. Because of the pandemic, our Germany trip to see Luther-land and the Oberammergau Passion Play was cancelled. Maybe in another life-time!

I am so deeply grateful, not only for all who made our adult education possible, but especially for those who participated in class and for those who joined us on-line week after week. It's always heartening to receive a text or email that some part of our study was meaningful or comforting or challenging. It is my profound hope that we will return in person—soon, very soon! Until then, our thanksgiving continues.

Youth and Family

The Youth and Family Ministry Team had an interesting year, as did most ministries within SOTP due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. Unfortunately, we had to cancel most of our planned events in early 2020 such as Culver's fundraising night, Trivia Night and ultimately our Mission Trip to the Chattanooga, TN area was cancelled.

However, we were able to conduct several successful fundraisers in order to raise funds for youth to attend future youth ministry activities. We were extremely pleased to collect almost 7,500 pounds of donations for Savers which raised \$1,100.

Confirmation Program:

SOTP had 18 students participate in their Affirmation of Baptism ceremony, held this year on Oct 25 (Reformation Sunday) in front of family members. In Sept, we also began our Confirmation Program with a few changes from prior years. We meet Wednesday nights from 6:30 – 7:30 with students meeting in their small groups as well as spending a short time with large group leaders who teach the lesson for the evening. Our focus this year is on building relationships between the students and their small group leaders. There are 52 students currently enrolled in the Confirmation Program.

High School Youth Group:

We spent the early part of 2020 holding HS Youth Group meetings on Sunday following 2^{nd} service and then met on Zoom for a time when we were unable to meet in person. In October we were fortunate to bring Kurtis Arndt on board as an intern who is focusing his efforts on revamping the HS Youth Program. We've since changed meeting dates and time (Thursday night from 7 - 9PM) and have been seeing a consistent group join us for these nights. We've just finished lessons on the Gospels and will be starting a new set of lessons in January. We encourage any students in 9 -12th grades to reach out with an questions, or join us any time.

We look forward to 2021 and our continued work to help make Christ known to the youth of SOTP.

Congregational Council Report

It has been an honor and a pleasure to serve such a faithful and generous congregation. Even though Covid-19 has disrupted the normalcy of our lives we have remained steadfast in serving our Lord and our community. We have found ways to stay connected as a church through audio and visual ministry team efforts, streaming church services, on-line giving, Zoom, Facebook, Parking Lot services via FM radio and various other ways.

Many have been touched by our outreach and Mission team, both locally and globally. More than \$100,000 has been given to charities by our congregation in 2020. We gave to the ELCA synod to support global ministries. Many local charities such as Grafton Food Pantry, Pads, Home of the Sparrow, Senior Care, Turning Point and LSSI Addiction Center (Elgin) to name a few have also benefited.

Two Leadership Retreats were held in 2020, the February meeting was attended by the Council, Staff and Key Ministry Leaders and the May meeting was Council only due to Covid-19 concerns. During these retreats, we discussed our Statement of Purpose and Vision statement for Shepherd of the Prairie.

Finance Team

The Finance Team is responsible for overseeing the daily, monthly, and year-end financial activities of the Church. Our 2020 Team members were Don Schneider, Devin Burg, John Throckmorton, Bill Nesta, Cliff Dungey (Church Treasurer), Melanie Chesney (Accounting Administrator) and Bob Mollis (Finance Chair).

Your Finance Team monitors all financial activities and meets monthly to review the Church's financial reports. We report monthly to the Church Council with our analysis of the Church's financial position as well as with any financial recommendations we think appropriate. We are responsible for the preparation of the annual budget and the monitoring of our actual financial activities against that budget. Financial policy and procedure recommendations are submitted to the Church Council for approval to improve cost control and financial processes.

We are also responsible for managing the Church's Mortgage Service fund, maintaining adequate reserves for the maintenance of our building, periodically reviewing the insurance coverage and policies, reviewing contracts for services, being alert to compliance issues, and assisting with an audit of the Church's accounting records.

In 2020, total General Fund Member Contributions declined by \$6,992 compared to 2019. The imposed COVID-19 restricted public worship affected both our attendance and contributions. The total General Fund contributions were \$730,507 compared to a budget projection of \$757,680. This income short fall was offset with Council and Ministry staff controlling expenses. The 2020 General Fund expenses were \$710,946 against a proposed 2020 General Fund budget of \$757,680. This leaves a positive year to date balance of \$19,561 in General Funds to carry forward to 2021.

You will find our 2020 Financial Reports and 2021 Budget enclosed elsewhere in this Annual Report.

Please join the Finance team in thanking Susie Wehnes for her dedication, service, and knowledge in her role as the Financial Contribution Secretary. Sue has been a constant in recording and tracking our members and visitors' contributions and memorial gifts. Sue will be retiring in January and the Finance team welcomes Linda Dungey as the new Financial Contribution Secretary. Please reach out to both Sue and Linda and thank them for their dedication and service.

2020 Year End Treasurer's Report

It has been my privilege and pleasure to serve you this past year as your Church Treasurer and Council Member. The Church Treasurer is the financial officer, responsible for general oversight of all SOTP finances including income, expenditures, signing checks, and reporting to Church Council on the overall financial condition of the church. It was my honor as Treasurer to sign the Certification of Beneficial Owner. The treasurer also signed the Certificate for the Paycheck Protection Program, a loan during the economic uncertainty to support the ongoing operations. These funds were used to retain workers and maintain payroll, make mortgage interest payments, and utility payments. Our request for \$95,000.00 was approved on April 24, 2020. The PPP forgiveness for loans of \$150,000 or less has not yet been released by the SBA; they still await the new form to simplify the forgiveness process.

Our Congregation was generous especially during the Covid-19 pandemic. The General Fund Balance was \$196,796, an increase of over the prior year.

First I would like to thank Sue Wehnes for her over 15 years of service as Contribution Secretary; she has devoted many hours to ensuring that your donations and memorials are correctly accounted for. I would like to thank our Accounting Administrator, Melanie Chesny for keeping our Financial Records accurate this year. In addition she has maintained accounting for the Paycheck Protection Program and the new Giving Plus (Credit Card) program.

Connections Ministry

What a year this has been; but the Connections Ministry has been hard at work to continue to connect and engage people into the life of Shepherd of the Prairie!

GRIEF MINISTRY & JOURNEY GROUP

Our Grief Ministry sends books to help those who are mourning a loved one. They receive four books over the course of the first year. This year we have sent the series of books to about 20 people, some of whom are not members of the church.

We have continued our Grief Journey Group this year and is has been heartwarming to see people connect with others who are grieving to offer and receive comfort, support and insight. For a few months we met via ZOOM, but as soon as possible, we began meeting in person and found that being together in person brought much in the way of comfort and engagement. Our group meets every Tuesday night from 6 to 7pm in the Fellowship Hall and all who grieve are welcome.

I also attended a webinar where I received certification as a Grief Counselor.

BARNABAS CAREGIVING MINISTRY

Our Barnabas Caregiving Ministry was unable to make visits to hospitals, care facilities and homes for most of this year due to Covid. But our ministers were faithful and made at least monthly phone calls and mailed 2 sets of cards each month to those we were unable to visit in person. We look forward to when we are able to share the love of God in person once again. We hope to conduct another training session in 2021.

SOTP CALLERS

The entrance of Covid into our lives brought on many challenges to connection, but also a couple of opportunities. The first was our SOTP Callers Ministry, a branch of Barnabas Caregiving Ministry. We began with Barnabas Ministers, and added more volunteers as time went on. There were 26 callers who made weekly phone calls to almost all of our members over the age of 65 to check on them and make sure they were OK and had all they needed. Many of those who were called originally volunteered to help make calls. There was an additional team of 10 who stood ready to run errands or drive people to appointments.

CONNECTIONS TEAM

Our Connections Team has been making some calls to try to help engage people, especially new members, in the life of SOTP. We were also called on to conduct a survey for the Worship Team about members' preference concerning returning to Saturday Night Worship.

LIFE GROUPS

Our Life Groups ministry started off well in 2020, only to run straight into Covid. Several of our groups continued to meet via ZOOM, but even that became difficult for many as some were unable to connect with ZOOM. Several of our Life Groups are still meeting either via ZOOM or in person. We set up a four-week Life Group program during the month of November with the theme, "In Everything Give Thanks", and invited the entire congregation to participate.

FOOD DRIVE

Our Friday morning Life Group heard God's call to them to minister to God's people and began to look for a way to serve our community. They decided to host a drive-through Food Drive for Grafton Township Food Pantry. The first one was held on June 6th; followed by drives on August 8th, October 3rd, and November 14th. Truckloads of donations of food and personal care items were collected and delivered each time. We also collected monetary donations and the total from the four food drives was \$14,750 collected for the pantry. Special thanks to the Friday Life Group who organized the drives, to the Tuesday Life Group who helped, to the Mission and Outreach teams and all those who participated with the drives. What a wonderful way to do kingdom work in our community!!

Connections Ministry (cont)

BUTTON BRIGADE

Another Covid-driven new ministry was our Button Brigade (and our Bitty Button Brigade). These ladies crocheted mask extenders and sewed buttons onto them for healthcare workers to use to relieve some of the pressure of their required facemasks. Approximately 13,000 mask extenders were made and delivered to Nursing Homes, Hospitals, Hospice Facilities, Home Healthcare Agencies, Doctor's Offices, Clinics etc. Many of these ladies purchased the yarn and buttons necessary themselves. These extenders were delivered all over Northern Illinois from Rochelle to Lake Zurich, from Lombard to Marengo and all points in between.

NEW MEMBER GATHERINGS AND VISITOR AWARENESS

Three New Member Gatherings were held during 2020; February, July, and November and we welcomed 9 new families, some of whom have never worshipped in our building! Some of our newest members have already become actively engaged in the life of SOTP! Welcome to our all of new members and we look forward to worshipping together in person soon and getting to know you better!

We also set up a Visitor Contact link on our website enabling visitors to connect with us by filling out virtual "Welcome Center" information. Many people from all over the country have connected with us in this way. It's a beautiful thing to have people from all over our country and the world worshipping God through SOTP.

NORTHERN ILLINOIS SYNOD

This year I served on two Northern Illinois Synod Committees; The Nominating Committee as chairperson and on the Ministry Support Committee as the lead for Anti-Sexual Harassment Awareness Training subcommittee. Due to both the Congregational Resourcing Event and the Synod Assembly being cancelled, I helped to prepare and lead an online forum for Anti-Sexual Harassment Awareness Training. I also serve on the Bishop's Advisory Cabinet and the governing board for NIS Diakonia program.

MINISTRY TEAMS

As you read through the ministry reports for this year you will see how even in these difficult days, the SOTP Ministry Teams have continued to serve God, all of you and our communities. Our Ministry teams have been active in working to engage all of us in ways to do kingdom work.

Life has certainly been turned upside down, but here at SOTP we have risen to the occasion to bring God's love to all those we come into contact with. I would like to thank everyone who helped care for God's people during this time of our 'new normal'; whether it was through a ministry here at SOTP, or in your own families or neighborhoods. God has truly blessed us with opportunities to serve him and his people! In 2020 we were not able to participate in our normal activities but we were still able to promote the church through social media, press releases, and ads in the paper. We hired a publicist to help us execute these communications quickly and with efficiency. Because of Covid 19 we were not able spend the Budget we were given. If our 2021 Budget allows, we will use the services of a publicist again; however, after discussion, the team determined that a "PR Coordinator" would be a valuable volunteer role to help feed information to the publicist. Also, Mike Luecht will provide both the publicist and Mike Yndestad with a copy of all of the Ministries and Ministry Leads to obtain additional information on church activities for promotional purposes.

Children & Family Ministries

Like for many, 2020 has been a year to remember full of changes and adaptations. This is especially true for Children & Family Ministries here at Shepherd of the Prairie. This has been my second year here serving at SOTP, and I would say it was a year full of hardship, humility, grace, strength-finding, teamwork, and most of all, change. We started the year in our "normal" fashion in a pre-COVID world with our typical Sunday School program, plans and events for the year, and regular times of meeting. This came to a halt in mid-March when we started to quarantine. The Sunday School team and the Children & Family team adapted quickly, and began meeting virtually to make plans for our new online world we were in.

For our Sunday School program, we adjusted rather quickly and started distributing materials and videos online for parents and their kids to access easily. We changed the name of our program to "Sunday's Cool!" and really hit the ground running. We have continued to distribute Sunday School materials this way throughout the year making sure our families consistently receive lessons for their kids each Sunday. We learned about a variety of topics, lessons, books and more throughout the bible, and I must say I learned a lot as well in the process. The Lord was faithful through this process, and He was not only reaching into the homes of these families, but He was impacting my heart as well each week as I prepared the lesson. Even though it was different, the Lord still used this new adaptation in tremendous ways.

This allowed me, and others, to have more time to make the adjustments for this new virtual experience. I was able to record my volunteers in preparation for what would have been in-person stations, and we were able to create a combined video of these different stations for the week of VBS for each corresponding day. Lots of work and preparation went into this new way of doing VBS, but it was well worth the work! We had fun along the way and we were still able to provide this great program for our kids in our church and in the community!

Along with Vacation Bible School, we were able to still hold some of the same events like the Kindergarten Blessing and the receiving of first bibles. Both these were able to be done virtually during our church services, and I was able to play the role of an "door dash" worker and leave bibles and blessing bags on the doorsteps of our kids! What a fun way to still keep some normalcy in the lives of our families. We also held some fun, social-distancing events such as outdoor firepits, Fall Drive-Inn and Advent Craft Kits. These events were not only popular amongst our families at SOTP, but they were popular amongst the families in our community. What a blessing from God to still be able to join in community and meet new people along the way.

Though, in a lot of ways, it has been a difficult year, it has also been a year of blessings. God has used rough circumstances to create beautiful moments for His glory, and He will continue to do so. I have hope for this upcoming year, and I know for sure that if we can get through 2020, we can get through 2021. WORSHIP TEAM

The Worship Committee has worked through 2020 to reimagine worship with COVID 19. The beginning of the year was normal until March 15th when Illinois closed. Plans for Lent, Palm Sunday and Easter were refigured for Live Stream worship and some events were cancelled. The church remained closed for many months. In July, the committee worked on a congregation survey to determine "how to return to services". Once the responses were reviewed, work began on "the how". There was so much to consider with social distancing, masks, temperature taking, sanitizing, singing, bulletins, etc. The committee presented a comprehensive document and recommendation to the Council and Pastor Mark. Recommendations were accepted and Sunday services resumed at 9am and 1045am. Saturday services were held "drive in movie style" until the end of October when it just got too cold!!! The Saturday night attendees were also surveyed to determine a return to Saturday services. Currently, the return of Saturday service is on hold. As of November 24, all services have gone back to Livestream only due to big rise in COVID-19 numbers. Christmas Eve Services were live streamed in 2020 due to the COVID crisis. A 3pm service was held for younger families; 5pm service was held for families with candle lighting. The 11pm service was a candlelight service with communion

Resuming church services posed another set of problems with our volunteers. Many of our volunteers are older and therefore cautious about volunteering until a vaccine is available. Worship does understand the concerns and has worked around the problem. The need for greeters, communion stewards and ushers continue for each of the leads. Sanitizing the sanctuary is now headed by Tom Polzin (Property) with members of the Worship Committee working with Tom. The committee relied on research that indicated that the virus dies on surfaces after 72 hours. Sanitizing is done between the 9am and 1045am service on Sunday.

Stewardship means marshalling members time, talents, and treasures once they proclaim they believe. I look at stewardship as a three-legged stool. Remove one of those legs and the stool can no longer support you. It's like a body that atrophies. We must continue to apply the many blessings that God has given each of us toward service to Him in building up the Body of Christ here at Shepherd of the Prairie Lutheran Church.

In this most difficult pandemic year, we can count our blessings that offerings could be made on-line through the Vanco GivePlus+ app available on our website or from your cell phone. Current donation offerings are for General Fund, Mortgage Services, Memorials, the Artist Series, and the Grand Piano Fund. We encourage all who use this means to donate by credit or debit card to check the box named "Help off set ACH fee". This is basically the charge by card originators to process the Credit/Debit cards payment to the vendors, in this case, SOTP. For Mastercard and Visa, the charge is 2.35% and for AMEX, the charge is 3.5%. If you withdraw from your checking or savings account, the charge is 0.2%.

Our financial stewardship drive for CY 2021 began on September 26/27 with temple talks recorded virtually by Mike Yndestad over a five-week period. We are deeply indebted to Mike for his wonderful efforts in packaging these presentations. We focused on two ministries that we hope to expand next year, our Music Ministries and our Youth & Family Ministries. Ed & Pam Richard, Curtis Arndt, and Chris Brolsma were presenters and did an excellent job in preparing and delivering their temple talks. Our program encouraged all members to submit their Estimate of Giving Cards designed by and offered electronically by our web guru, Dennis Lilla. He also administered the Cognito forms that sent confirming email to participants on how they apportioned their giving for next year. Our program concluded on November 6th and Pastor Mark dedicated these CY 2021 Estimate of Giving Cards on November 22, his first day back after hip surgery. - 1. CY 2021 Member Contributions are budgeted to be 5% growth over CY 2020 Member Contributions budget.
- 2. CY 2021 Loose Plate offering are budgeted to be 35% less then CY 2020 Loose Plate offering budget due to planned public worship restrictions.
- 3. SOTP's contribution to the ELCA Northen Illinois Synod is budgeted at 10% of expected Member Contribution and will be paid at 10% of Actual Member Contributuions received during CY 2021.
- 4. SOTP's contribution to Local Mission is budgeted at 1% of expected Member Contributions and will be paid at 1% of Actual Member Contributions received during CY 2021.
- 5. Youth Ministry budget has increased by \$3,300 in anticipation that the new Interim Youth Director will drive more programs in CY 2021.
- 6. Staffing Ministry for CY 2021 will remain flat compared to CY 2020. Payroll expenses for the Pastors will be held at CY 2020 levels. A 1.5% increase has been budgeted for laystaff salary adjustments. Some additional hours have been budgeted for laystaff members affected by the restrictions on public worship.
- 7. Providing for the Future Reserves has again been budgeted for in CY 2021 at \$19,000. This was not budgeted for in CY 2020. These reserves are used to replace equipment and repair the facility as required.
- 8. A final CY 2020 ELCA N. Illinois Synod Benevolence payment made in January 2021 for \$6,251. The General Fund surplus for CY 2020 will be adjusted down to \$13,311.
