A Note From Pastor Mark

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,


Matthew 13:1-9 and 18-23

Do you ever wonder if what you say or do has any positive effect on others?

Our words could result in turning someone's life around.

By the same token, our words can be destructive.

If we are going to plant seeds of faith, we need to take care with how we use our words. We need to consider what example we're making. By God's grace we have the



power to be fruitful, and to plant an entire orchard of believers.

The first nine verses of Matthew 13 evoke some questions.

For example, if your words burst with promise, if some seeds of faith begin to grow in someone you have touched, but then begin to peter out, what's your next step? Ignore them and move on? Or continue to nurture that seed?

Personally, I would try to find out what happened.

Sometimes those seeds need our care to be nourished and grow. But ultimately it's not up to us. In all honesty, it may be hard to determine whether or not we're sowing in good soil.

I don't think that's for us to decide.

Perhaps we'll never know if our words fall on good soil or not.

What's most important for us is to simply plant seeds.

Where did you first learn of God, Jesus, and the Bible? Who first spoke those words to you?

Your parents, grandparents, neighbors, friends?

Do you remember your first reaction or response?

If we as Christians are not willing to open our hearts, to be servant examples, sowing seeds of love and faith, who will step in and sow seeds in our place? What do you think could happen in your family, in your neighborhood, in your country, if there is no one around to plant seeds of faith?

As we begin a new year of learning as well as approaching the 500th

Let's celebrate! Let's have a party! It's Reformation time! Beginning in September and continuing for a whole year plus, SOTP will celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. It began on October 31, 1517, when an otherwise obscure



monk named Martin Luther walked to the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany, and nailed a list of 95 topics to the church door that he wanted to debate. Known as the "95 Theses", these brief statements, written in Latin, were quickly translated into German. And with the help of Guttenberg's printing press, they were just as quickly disseminated throughout Europe. The chief concern for debate was the sale of indulgences, whereby people could pay a fee and receive a guarantee from the Pope that their sins were forgiven. Bad choice as far as Luther was concerned! Christ, and Christ alone, he declared, can forgive our sins which he accomplished on the Cross. And thus began the debate--and the Reformation--at least in part.

More information on SOTP's grand party will be coming soon, but for this September newsletter, know that adult education will kick off the year! Beginning on Sunday, September 11, a new year of study and conversation will commence. We'll meet for one hour every Sunday at 10:20, and the class will be repeated twice on the following Wednesday at 11:00 in the morning and 7:00 in the evening. Our initial topic will be"Luther and the Gospel of John" since it was John's story of Jesus that influenced Luther more than the other three gospels.

An hour of study, reflection, and conversation may well be a part of your regular routine. But if it's not, this would be a great time to begin as we celebrate the work of God's continually reforming Spirit! Come join us!

Jesus tells us in Luke 9, "...Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it". Just before he says, "...Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me."

Deny ourselves, now that is a difficult task! Telling ourselves no to the extra cookie, the shopping spree on the credit cards, the demand to have our way, the desire to be right or to have the upper hand, the nagging need to make ourselves appear greater by gossiping about someone else. Your Flexible Building Team is proceeding with the following:

- Have the existing Berm (between our building & the east entrance)
 leveled and dirt moved. There is a buyer for the dirt, and our Gift in
 Kind donors are also flexible and have agreed to do this part of the
 preparation now, and Parking lot later. Time Saved & Money Saved
- Have the Water Main work completed this summer/Fall. This gives us a head start on our build in April, 2017. It also sends a message to our neighbors that something exciting is happening at SOTP!!!!! Time Saved!
- Send out Civil Engineer RFPs to 3 companies, and this would encompass the whole project: Sanctuary/Music Education Wing Shell/ Parking Lot. ONE large project cheaper that TWO projects. Money Saved!
- Our Construction Manager, Shales McNutt would be present for the project from beginning to end since the Parking Lot will be done at the same time as the Sanctuary/Music Education Shell. Money Saved!

So, to Review:

In August/September2016:

- The Berm will have soil removed & sold. The clay will be moved to another site. All thanks to our Gift in Kind Donors!!!
- The Water Main Extension will be done after the Berm removal. This will be supervised by Shales McNutt.

In April, 2017: (Only 7 short months from now!!!)

The Sanctuary/Music Education Wing Shell/Parking Lot will all be started at the same time...supervised by Shales McNutt.

There once was a little girl who needed a transfusion. She had contracted a rare disease, and her only hope for recovery was a transfusion from someone who had already fought the disease and won. Two years earlier her brother had suffered from the same illness and, since the siblings were



the same blood type, he was the ideal donor. Would you give your blood to Linda?" the doctor asked him. Danny hesitated for a moment. His lower lip trembled. Then he smiled and said, "Sure for my sister." When the time came the children were wheeled into the operating room. Neither of them spoke. Linda was too weak to speak and Danny appeared too frightened. But when he saw his sister he gave her a big smile. The nurse inserted the tube into his arm and Danny's smile slowly faded to a look of concern. He watched his blood leave his body and flow through the tube. When the transfusion was almost over, the boy looked at the doctor and said in a very trembling voice, "Doctor, when do I die?" It wasn't until that moment that the doctor realized why Danny had hesitated, why his lips had trembled when he agreed to give blood. He thought he would have to give up his life, and yet he joyously made the decision to give freely to someone he loved. We should remember Danny as we consider how much love there is in our giving. Do we give what others need, of our time, talent and treasure, or do we only give whatever we can do without.

YOUTH CULTURE ~ CONCUSSIONS

CONCUSSION EFFECTS LAST 2 YEARS—As parents, we need to protect our children and teens from harm, while providing for their well-being. In recent years, we've been hearing more and more about the physical dangers related to youth sports, particularly in those sports that are high-impact in nature. Medical experts are calling on parents to understand and respond to the dangers related to concussions. When we were kids we were told to shake it off and get back in there after getting our bell rung. Some new research from York University is now telling us that children and youth take longer to fully recover from a concussion than previously thought. In fact, it might take up to two years to fully recover from a concussion. Since their brains are still developing, kids are neurologically more fragile than adults. Because we live in a culture that idolizes athletics and sports, we need to pause and ask, "What's best for my kids?" Parents, you are called to be a good steward of your child's physical health.



Smartphone Addiction

The folks at Common Sense Media have released some survey data that should serve as a wake-up call to all of us who are concerned about the very real

possibility of smartphone addiction. The new survey found that 80% of teenagers say they check their phones hourly, and 72% felt the need to immediately respond

to texts and social networking messages. This reality has become a point of contention between many parents and their kids. 36% of parents said they argued with their child daily about device use, and 77% of parents feel their children get distracted by their devices and don't pay attention when they are together at least a few times a week. Here at CPYU we believe that parents have a responsibility to set technology limits for their kids. We are called by God to raise children who care for others and who redeem the gift of time. Smart-phone addiction is just another form of idolatry.

FROM THE WORD...

When you discover your kids engaged in sinful or immoral behavior, how do you respond? William P. Smith reminds us that like when our first parents (Adam and Eve) fell into sin (Genesis 3:6) and rebelled against God, "they attempted to hide." Doesn't that sound a bit like our kids?

Smith says that the way we respond to our children's sin can set the table either for more deception, or for



repentance and restoration. He writes, "We provide powerful incentives for others to run and hide rather than confess what they have done wrong." These incentives include pouring out our anger, listing all the ways they have hurt us, ridicule, humiliation, and shame.

But the fact that God is different should point us to a more redemptive and helpful approach to responding to our kids when they

sin. Smith says, "He doesn't swoop down on Adam and Eve and start demanding, 'What were you thinking?!' He doesn't berate, badger, and interrogate them. Nor does he hold himself aloof, waiting for them to make the first move. Instead, he comes to them."

Our kids need us to gently,

yet with conviction, approach them to start the process of making things right. Next time your kids fall into sin, lovingly seek them out, and then parent them through their sin into confession and repentance.
