ADVENT DEVOTIONAL




If you haven't picked up your Advent Daily Devotional yet, please pick one up. They are conveniently placed on the usher's table in the Crossroads.

Welcome to Advent—the time of year we remember Christ's three-fold coming: at the end of all time as King of kings, at his continual coming in Word and Sacrament, and at his first coming as a babe in Bethlehem!

Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas. This year that includes 28 days plus a couple of extra days, taking us to December 26. Here's

one idea for using this book. If you have an Advent wreath, one candle is lit on the First Sunday in Advent and the days following,

two candles on the Second Sunday in Advent, and so on. If you don't have an Advent wreath, a single candle will suffice for proclaiming Jesus as the Light of the world. After lighting the candle, you might observe a time of quiet to prepare your heart. Then there's a suggested Bible verse to read, plus a devotion, followed by a prayer. Often the devotion ends with a question or questions for you to consider.

We all like to send Christmas greetings and love to our family at SOTP. Instead of spending money and time on sending individual cards and postcards, why not bring in one card to post on our


Christmas Bulletin Board in the Crossroads to give your greetings to all at once?

"Other" Religions

Our children and teens have been created in the image of God for a relationship with God. Sin has destroyed that relationship.

Consequently, all creation groans for

redemption, renewal, and restoration to that relationship. The evidence of this groaning can be seen in today's youth culture in the way that so many kids wear their spiritual search on their sleeves. Sadly, the search leads many of our

spiritually broken kids to faith systems and options that are anything but biblical, true, and right. Recent research shows that a growing number of kids are pursuing the spiritual dead-end of what are known as "other religions." These are religions outside of the mainstream religions. Some of the fastest growing include Wicca, which has more than doubled since 2001. neopaganism, and other forms of the occult. We must teach our kids the truths of God's Word. What they need is not an answer, but THE answer.

Latest Research

Teen Rebelion & Food Choices

If you've ever taken the time to carefully observe the curated nature of the grocery aisles, you'll know that the cereal aisle is set-up in ways that catch our attention. The adult-targeted healthy cereals are

> placed on the higher shelves so they are eyelevel with adult consumers. The cereals targeting the younger set are placed on the lower shelves so that their colorful packaging containing sugary flavored treats catches the eyes of kids. Researchers have

found that we might be able to push back on these marketing ploys by encouraging our teenaged kids to indulge their rebellious natures. The study has found that teenagers will make smarter eating choices after learning about manipulative practices used by food companies, such as engineering junk foods to become addictive. Parents, from now on you might want to say, "Eat your vegetables, because junk food companies just want to turn you into a Zombie!" This is one more way to teach your kids to tend to their bodies as a way to bring glory to God!

WHAT KIND OF PARENT? - WALT MUELLER, CPYU PRESIDENT

I've got a 30-year-old memory that still haunts and motivates me to this day. It haunts me because it showed me the kind of pressure too many kids have to endure. It motivates me because it drives me to push myself and other parents to not make the same kind of memory for our kids.



It was a crisp fall Saturday and I was seated with thousands of others in a high school football stadium. Along with lots of other curious folks, I turned to look at the father who was standing and screaming loudly at his son. "Come on! What's wrong with you? You need to make that play!" Finally, another parent couldn't contain himself, and he yelled at the noisy dad. "Come on John! You'd think that was you out there." Without skipping a beat, the accused responded with some frightening words: "It is!"

After years and years of listening to kids, searching the Scriptures, spending time with families, and pondering research, I've come to the conclusion that one of the most unhealthy and destructive things we can do to our kids is to live through them. You see, what happens is that we put undue pressure on our kids to perform and achieve on our behalf. We do this through sports, academics, appearance, and all kinds of other activities. In fact, Christian parents can sometimes seek their own value and worth through the spiritual state of their children. All this does is create an environment where our kids come to believe that our love, time, and attention is conditional on their performance, rather than on the fact that we simply love them.

In his book Parenting, Paul Tripp differentiates between Ownership parents and Ambassador parents. Ownership Parenting is motivated and shaped by what parents want for their children and from their children. If we choose to parent in this manner, we are driven by what we want our children to become so that we get something in return. . . like a stellar and perfect performance on the gridiron so that we can be validated ourselves.

Because our children belong to God rather than to us, we need to

adopt a posture of Ambassador Parenting. Tripp says that an Ambassador is one who faithfully represents the message, methods, and character of the leader who has sent him. Everything she does, every decision she makes, and every interaction must be shaped by this one question: "What is the will and plan of the one who sent me?"

Which type of parent are you? Paul Tripp reminds us that "parenting is not first about what we want for our children or from our children, but about what God in grace has planned to do through us in our children.

What steps do you need to take to ease the pressure on your kids and follow Jesus into His parental calling. . . that you become an Ambassador Parent and avoid the posture of an Ownership Parent?
