A Note From Pastor Mark

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
Welcome to the season of Lent.
This is a time for us as
individuals and community to
reflect upon our relationships
that matter. Jesus. I encourage

your participation in our weekly midweek worship as well as
opportunities for growth through study and prayer.

Lent always begins with the story of Jesus temptation. The story of
Jesus' temptation in the wilderness sticks in our memory as a great
example of Godly strength by God's son, Jesus.

But at the end of Jesus' forty days, we find a warning: "(the devil)
left him until an opportune time" (verse 13).

We need to be aware that the devil is never very far away from
each of us. He waits in the wings to take advantage of the
opportunity when we are weakest. And he rejoices in our falling
down and in our failings. He longs to reign in our feelings of
rejection, discouragement, and despair.

We all need in God's word which can be trusted. "He is with us
always" (Matthew 28:20) and also that he sends a host of angels to
be with us (Psalm 91:11-12). Our beloved Word of God confirms
that "in our weakness God is strong" (Isaiah 40:29- 31). He tells us,
"Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid" (Luke
14:27). Jesus prays to God for our protection in John 17 (verses 11
and 15). And when we need the right words, the Holy Spirit will give
them to us (Luke 12: 11 - 12).

With those helpful words, with the example of Jesus, and with other
godly friends, we can be strong and bold, and invite the Holy Spirit
to keep us from caving in when confronted with temptations.

Take time this month to think about times when you've been helped
or had the opportunity to be a helper through troubled days. How
did those situations impact you? Others?

Pray through some of the above Scriptures and find strength to
meet each day. I look forward to our walk together through Lent
and once again meet Christ on the other side in His resurrection
presence.

Of all the writings that Martin Luther produced, none has had more impact than his Small Catechism. Written for parents to use with their children, the Catechism contains the basics of the Christian faith. In simple language, but with profound insight, Luther gives us a deep understanding of who God is and who we are in relation to God. Many of



us were expected to memorize the Catechism as we went through Lutheran confirmation. In fact, I remember Ed, a pilot who flew rescue helicopters in Vietnam. He told me that as he awaited rescue after his own helicopter was shot down, Luther's Catechism came flooding back to him: what Luther had to say about the Ten Commandments, the Apostles' Creed, the Lord's Prayer, Baptism, and Holy Communion. So there must be something of great importance here! As a part of our preparation for our Reformation 500 celebration this October, we'll explore the Catechism during our midweek Lenten worship and in adult classes during Lent. How about joining us on **Wednesday evenings, beginning March 8, at 7 pm for worship; and on Sunday mornings at 10:45 and Wednesdays at 11 am** for further exploration and conversation? A great Lenten discipline--much better than giving up watermelon!

Have you ever, like me, seen a beautiful sunset, a newborn baby, a vista from the top of a mountain, the first glimpse of spring, the roar of an ocean or the chaos of children at VBS and been struck totally speechless? There are no words at that moment – just pure emotion that fills your heart, soul and mind. That moment is our word for March, and it is expressed as O!. It’s pure amazement and awe for God and his creation and acts.

As in the Psalm verses above, my only response often is, “O Lord”! Even more words of praise and thankfulness form in my mind and look for expression. Worship is the only way to express all that is inside.

“Worship is the practice of all that is within us to celebrate the joyful goodness of God. It invites us to contemplate the glorious, transcendent living god of love, and it so doing to experience transformation in that image ourselves. Worship is an act of the whole being, uniting intellect with emotion, integrating reason with feeling, combining thought with affection, summoning both of our brains hemispheres and all of our brain’s layers and capacities in a joint corruption of joyful love and loving joy.” Brian McLaren, Naked Spirituality.

Whether we worship in a cathedral of pine trees and babbling brooks, or a cathedral of carved stone and stained glass; whether we worship in the form of time-honored liturgy or less traditional contemporary; whether we worship with others or simply on our own, we are still worshipping God with enthusiasm, joy and awe...O!

And O! is not just for communal worship, but is a way of life. It’s seeing and praising God in all moments; the joy filled and sorrowful,

STUBBS FAMILY UPDATE & PRAYER REQUEST

As some of you may know, Carol Stubbs, the wife of Randy Stubbs, the missionaries we help support in Tanzania, has had back pain and a general lack of wellness the last few months. Since her condition continued to deteriorate to the point of her becoming critical she was flown to Pretoria, South Africa for additional diagnostic workup. Before she could finish the workup she had cardiac arrest twice and was thankfully revived. The diagnosis that came back from the doctors was an aggressive and hard to treat form of lymphoma.

So besides treating the cancer her doctors had to rebuild her general health to the point of where she could travel to the United States to be close to family and friends and continue treatment. Surprisingly, over the last two months, through the work of her physicians and many prayers her condition has improved dramatically to the point where plans are being made to transport her home to DeKalb.

It has been a real miracle how Carol has come back from the edge of death to where she is now taking small walks, eating and becoming stronger every day. People have been praying for her here in the states and also in Tanzania. Prayers do work!

Even though Carol has made great progress, the road ahead will be hard and difficult. Randy and the family have asked for your continuing prayers as she travels home and fights her disease. May God comfort and strengthen them in the weeks and months ahead.

FINANCIAL NEWS

Treasurer's Report as of January 31, 2017

Thanks to your faithful and generous support the mission of Shepherd of the Prairie is off to a very successful start in 2017. Through January operating income exceeded expenses by \$4,725. Contributions slightly exceeded the budgeted amount by \$4,591 and expenses were slightly under the budgeted amount by \$659.

As of January 31st the Building Fund Balance was \$ 718,979. During the month of January we received donations of \$75,724. This included \$57, 101 to our Forward in Faith campaign and \$18,090 to our FORWARD campaign. Building Fund expenses for the month were \$50,665. The Loan Balance on our existing property is \$476,749.
