The authorization to acquire financing from MIF not to exceed \$3.8 million dollars


WAS APPROVED!!!

On Pentecost weekend we will read again the story from Acts. The beginning of Acts tells of the disciples waiting around in Jerusalem, after their last moments with their master teacher, for the gift of Holy Spirit baptism to come from God, just as Jesus told them (Acts 1:4). It has been seven weeks since Easter morning. Jesus has returned from the dead and assured them of his promises, and then left mysteriously by ascending into heaven in a cloud.

With all these events the disciples are probably perplexed about what they should do and where they should be.

As God's great timing and staging unveils, this week just happens to be the same week as several Jewish festivals: Pentecost, which Jews celebrate 50 days after Passover; Shavuot; and Feast of Weeks.

According to the dictionary, these holidays commemorate as well the revelation of the Law on Mount Sinai and the celebration of the wheat festival in ancient times. Thus, a multitude of Jews from all over the known world have gathered in the holy city of Jerusalem for celebration and worship.

Onto this stage comes the small group (120 according to Acts 1:15) of disciples of Jesus, perhaps the latest "new" religion to rise up in Jerusalem, the holy Mecca.

As they are gathered, sitting together in one house, God sends a gift. And they are overwhelmed with the power, the wisdom, the knowledge God gives. They are filled upon seeing the fire and hearing the strong wind. They pour into the streets, using languages they had not known before, telling the wonders of God.

Peter is empowered to explain the happenings culminating in thousands of converts, and the Christian Church, the Body of Christ, is launched.

So what happens to the Holy Spirit today? Where have you seen the Spirit active? Any miracles? What action does the Holy Spirit cause within you? Do you believe the power of God's gift? Will it make a difference in your life?

Let's pray during this time of building the Spirit will flow through us to keep the main thing, the main thing. Building the Kingdom of God!

Lord, what would you do through me to achieve your vision for Shepherd of the Prairie. Help me discern a sacrifice that is pleasing and joyful.

PLEASE

Our word for last month was help, and we looked at how help brings our needs before God and binds us to him. This month the word please allows us to bring our neighbors and their needs before God. We sometimes call this use of please in the name of others



intercession. Intercession comes from Latin roots suggesting "going between". Through intercession, or praying for others, we take the hand of God with one hand and the hand of our neighbor with the other and join with God in willing comfort, blessing and grace for our neighbor in need.

Mark 2:1-12 tells the story of a paralyzed man whose friends take him to Jesus for healing. They make a hole in the roof and lowered him down on a stretcher in front of Jesus. They literally carried their paralyzed friend and let the weight of his illness become their burden as well. Whether or not the man had faith, his friends sure did and verse 5 says, "when he (Jesus) saw their faith he said to the paralytic..." Jesus was impressed by the faith of the man's friends and acted for the man. The man is forgiven and healed and walks out carrying the stretcher his friends brought him in on.

When we practice compassionate prayer (please) on behalf of others, we too become stretcher bearers. Whether or not they have faith or hope, when we bear their burdens and bring them before God we put our faith and hope to work for them on their behalf. It doesn't matter if they are family, friends, fellow church members or if they are people suffering from a disaster half a world away. We are called by God as people of faith to bring their needs before him and to bring the needs of those who don't have faith to God and at the same time to bring God to them.

One of the most powerful forms of please and compassion is to pray for our enemies; for those who make fun of us and our faith, or treat us badly, or cheat us, or cut us off in traffic, or are of the "other" political bent. There is a story told of Desmond Tutu walking through an airport in South Africa prior to the end of apartheid. Approaching him was a large white man who had been taught all his life that anyone who fought for the equality of the black man was a trouble maker and simply dead wrong. Overcome with rage, this white man purposely walked into Tutu knocking him down. As this man started to walk on he heard Tutu say, "God bless you, my child". The man stormed off, even angrier that this black man had blessed him. But as time went on, he couldn't forget the incident and eventually this man was brought to repentance by the humble blessing.

We all have the opportunity to come before our God with please for those around us and around the world. We can be stretcher bearers by carrying their needs to God, sharing them with God, and joining with God in compassion, generosity and kindness.



FINANCIAL NEWS

Treasurer's Report as of April 30, 2017

The Mission of Shepherd of the Prairie is proceeding on schedule as approved in the Council Budget adopted by the Congregation. Through April operating income exceeded expenses by \$28,837. Contributions exceeded the budgeted amount by \$17,593 and expenses were under the budgeted amount by \$9,810. The month of April had five (5) Sundays which accounts for the increase in contributions for the month.

As of April 30th the Building Fund Balance was \$775,893. During the month Building Fund income was \$45,514. This included donations of \$42,350 to the Forward in Faith campaign. Building Fund expenses for the month were \$1,056 and Year-to-Date expenses were \$85,813. After applying the monthly loan payment of \$5,273 the Loan Balance on our existing property is \$465,154.
