### **Pre-Construction progress as of July 17th, 2017:**

- Rebar approved by GDG and will be available this week

- Parking Lot Bid has been accepted, and a generous \$30,000 discount to the bid has been presented to SOTP.
- Installation of the water main loop has been mutually agreed upon by SOTP and the Village of Huntley.
- FULL Permits have been promised with Full approval by the Village of Huntley, to be presented this week to SOTP

## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs):

**Q:** Will the carpeting in our current building Crossroads and hallway get replaced as part of the new construction? It is so stained that it will never come clean!

**A:** Although the new construction budget (Forward in Faith) does not accommodate any improvements to our existing building, the Property Team has found a generous donor that has offered to replace the old worn out hallway and Crossroads carpet. The same Carpet Planks that will be used in the new addition's hallways will also be used in our existing building's hallway and Crossroads. This will make for a seamless and contiguous look between the addition and our current building. However, the replacement of our current building's hallways and Crossroads carpeting will NOT be started until after construction of the addition has been completed, so that the Property Team's carpet planks will not be dirtied by all of the construction traffic caused during the building of our new addition.

## *A Note From Pastor Mark*

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am thankful for the good work of our stewardship team at Shepherd of the Prairie. A theme I hear often from members of the team is “stewardship is not something that happens just in the Fall but is our way of life and our response to the One who gives...God.

One of my favorite scriptures related to stewardship is Luke 12:13-21. This teaching of Jesus addresses a problem that can be described by an old fashioned word: covetousness—the desire for possessions.

A person in the crowd gathered around Jesus says, “Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me” (Luke 12:13).

Apparently, there was an issue in the family. The oldest brother was

responsible for managing the family inheritance. The man who calls out to Jesus wasn't getting what he thought he should. He wanted Jesus to help him get his way.

Jesus doesn't get involved with his family dispute. After all Jesus was not in the business of being a judge over a case involving rightful inheritance.

But Jesus was a teacher who would get down to the bottom of the issue presented by this man's request. Jesus said, "...Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions" (Luke 12:15).

The fundamental problem with covetousness and greed is the belief that our life is valued based on our possessions. The more we have the more successful and important we become. It reminds me of the bumper sticker that said, "The one who dies with the most toys wins." American society has become extremely materialistic. Advertising has sold us many products promising to make our lives better, more beautiful, more important, more successful. And we have responded by buying.

- What effect has this had on your life?
- Does your life consist in the abundance of possessions?
- What happens if we lose those possessions, our homes, and our retirement income?

Jesus told a parable about a man who prepared for a long retirement and then died before he could enjoy it. His material preparation was for nothing. But he wasn't prepared for his real future.

He needed to be prepared spiritually, but wasn't.

How are you prepared for the future?

Are the spiritual values of honesty, love, compassion, generosity and relationships a part of the way you live your life?

What does it mean for you to live as a steward in response to the One who gives? What spiritual legacy do you desire to leave? Possessions can drag us down if they become too important. How can we move forward—more lightly and meaningfully?

## Ministry Musings

**NO!**

Last month we talked about the word WHEN...when Lord with this end? This month our word is **NO!** There are times in our lives when it seems our trials will never end and that God is silent, if there at all. The spouse we were supposed to grow old with dies; our beloved is unfaithful; our child will never be well or "normal"; our pain will never end; our loved one continues to suffer with no healing in sight; the finances will stretch no further; we will always be alone; we see no hope, no answer, no way out. And where is God in all of this? Why can't he step in and **DO SOMETHING...ANYTHING?**

In the times when things become so difficult, so dark, so endless we may raise our fist to God and scream **NO!** In those moments groan **NO!**; scream **NO!**; cry, rant, rage **NO!** but whatever you do, don't be silent. Don't let your anger, your fury, your disappointment die or harden into a cold solid piece of ice that will chill and deaden your

soul. Keep your anger hot, don't let it be denied!

Yelling our anger at God may seem to some like unbelief, but in reality it is a sure statement of deep belief in God and his goodness. Fury and fuming at God is a sign of a deeper faith that still survives -

that God is there and that he is a God who is willing to be raged at!

When we rage **NO!** at God, it may not be God at whom we are actually raging, but a failed image of God that we have held. When my husband died, I remember being very disappointed with God and felt as if he had let me down by Russ' death. After all, we loved him and served him together! Because of the image I had of God, I assumed he would have given us the gift of growing old together. After all, Russ and I were special, weren't we? Certainly the ways of the broken world wouldn't be allowed to crowd into our life together! But it was when I let go of that idea of a God who would grant my requests and who owed me for all I had done for him that I was able to see behind that image to a better view of who God truly is. For me it was a refusal to accept the second-rate "imposter" God I had fashioned in my mind, and to begin to accept the presence in my life of the true and living God.

Psalm 77 is a powerful example of a person shouting **NO!** and refusing to reject God or to deny their own questions and anger. "I yell out to my God, I yell with all my might, I yell at the top of my lungs. He listens. I found myself in trouble and went looking for my Lord; my life was an open wound that wouldn't heal. I remember God...and shake my head. I bow my head...and wring my hands. I'm awake all night...not a wink of sleep. Will the Lord walk off and leave us for good? Is his love worn threadbare?" (The Message)

But a few more verses down the psalmist says; "Once again I will go over what God has done. I'll ponder all the things you've accomplished. O God, your way is holy! No god is great like God! You're the God who makes things happen." (The Message)

For the psalmist, ranting and raging **NO!** at God brought him to the place of remembering all that God had done before. And the same was true for me. Yelling **NO!** at God was the beginning of new trust, new intimacy, new faith, and a new vision of who God is! So go ahead, yell **NO!** at God for the struggles of your life; he has broad shoulders and he would rather hear you bluster and rage than for you to be silent and turn away. Maybe in that **NO!** there will be a path for healing and new life.



## FINANCIAL NEWS

Treasurer's Mid-Year Report as of June 30, 2017

The Message: Give Generously

1 Timothy 6:18-19...go after God, who piles on all the riches we could ever manage ... do good ... be rich in helping others ...be extravagantly generous."

Mid-Year Report: Shepherd of the Prairie Income and Expenses are meeting expectations as proposed in the Annual Budget adopted by the Congregation. Through June operating income Year-To-Date(YTD) exceeded expenses by \$36,667. Contributions Year-To-Date exceeded the budgeted amount by \$22,911 and expenses Year-To-Date are under the budgeted amount by \$13,439.

As of June 30 the Building Fund Balance was \$892,017. During the month of June Building Fund donations totaled a staggering \$97,065. This included pledged donations as well as \$7,565 from Memorials to the Forward in Faith campaign. Building Fund expenses related to the new building were \$12,214 for the month and Total Building Fund Expenses were \$130,352 Year-To-Date.

Existing Mortgage Paid in Full: As required to obtain the new Construction Loan of \$3,750,000 a payment of \$458,717.37 was made to pay off our existing mortgage.

2018 Budget Process: The Finance Team has begun the process of preparing the 2018 Annual Budget and a preliminary Recommended Budget will be presented to Council to review in October.
