A Note From Pastor Mark

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have all come into this world with nothing.

We have only survived because someone provided the care and nurturing we needed when, as infants, we were helpless. "Because of God's great mercy", we have been provided for through the grace of God.

God provides for us for two reasons.

First, because God loves us and finds joy in giving us what we need. Second, because God wants us to share with a world that needs his love through us.

Our acts of righteousness and our service to God's world is, in a way, an unspoken "thank you" to God. A generous heart is just as important as the goods we distribute – it defines who we are on the inside.

An attitude of gratefulness allows us to freely give away something of ourselves.

A Note From Pastor Mark (continued)

The decision to share blesses both us and the receivers. They may see your good works as evidence of your faith in Jesus. In the 24th chapter of Deuteronomy, God reminds his people that there was a time when they were slaves in Egypt and had very little of their own. He tells them not to forget that history, so that they will appreciate having something now to share with others.

It's a reminder to not use all that we "harvest" for ourselves, but to allow some to remain as a gift to those less fortunate than us. Some farmers still practice this teaching, leaving some of their crop unharvested as testimony to this admonition from Scripture.

Do you remember a time when you were without something that you now have? (For example, skills, finances, a job, friends, etc.) Share your story, and the gratefulness you feel.

What “seed,” given to you by God, have you stored away? (For example, talents or skills.)

Are you willing to share this with others?

“Because of God’s great mercy” is our stewardship theme this year. The scriptural text comes from 1 Peter 2:9. We are challenged by the writer of 1 Peter to remember how blessed we are as God’s children. We are claimed by God through baptism to proclaim God’s mighty acts.

A word of thanks to all who call Shepherd of the Prairie home and may God bless us as we move forward in faith into this new year of ministry possibilities

YES

Last month when we spoke of **BEHOLD** we were left with a sense of awe as we stood in the presence of God. I'm sure we have all had those mountain-top times when we felt especially close to God and basked in his love and grace. But as wonderful as those times are we cannot stay on the mountain; we must heed God's call to return to the valley of life to do his work. Sometimes that's hard to do and we can feel disappointed and "let down" when we hear God's call to come back down to live in his world.



When Jesus came of age he didn't go climb a mountain and live life above the noise and chaos of life. He didn't dwell alone in a cave or reside in a commune separated from the messiness of life. He did spend a short time in the mountainous wilderness, speaking with his Abba and being cared for by the angels. Talk about a "mountain top"

experience! But from there, God called him to come down into the life of the world and the skirmishes of humanity; to the disarray of human politics and finance; the ugliness of human ignorance, injustice and bigotry; and the horror of human violence and murder. Jesus' answer to his father's call was **YES!**

We too are called by God to come down from our mountain time with him and into the world. God needs our answer to be **YES!** In the beginning of this word study last January, we talked about being **HERE**, present with God, a call to communion with him. Now God is asking us once again to respond to him. This time rather than just saying, "I'm **HERE** Lord", to respond, "YES, **HERE** I am, send me. Send me Lord into the disarray of the world with your message of love and peace". God calls us into a vocation of transforming mission and ministry, to join with him in his work in his world.

Answering God's call with a **YES** isn't always easy or instinctive. We are not automatically born into a spiritual life of ministry like we are born right-handed or with brown eyes. Rather spiritual life and ministry is like a marriage, and you must say **YES** to it. But it isn't a one-time **YES**. Just as a one "I do" is necessary for a marriage to begin it takes many more **YESSES** to keep the marriage going and thriving. The same is true of our life with God. We say our **YES** at baptism or confirmation; but it takes the **YESSES** of attending worship and the Lord's Supper regularly; the **YESSES** to the call of volunteering to serve in a ministry; the **YESSES** to a friend in need, a stranger we encounter, or the "enemy" in the middle of a conflict to make our life a **YES** life of service to God.

Eventually our **YES** becomes less of an event by event happening and more of a way of life which allows us to see others with the compassion (splanchinizomai) of Jesus and to answer **YES** to God's call. So many here at SOTP do answer **YES** to God and his call to join him in bringing his kingdom here on "earth as it is in heaven". This month we will celebrate those who have said and continue to say **YES** in so many ways. But there is much more to do and many others in need of God's grace and mercy. Hopefully you will hear God's call to you and answer **YES!**

PADS

What is PADS?

Public Action to Deliver Shelter (McHenry County founded 1988). This program is not government supported. Since 2009, PADS reports a 51% increase in people needing help (33% increase in homeless individuals diagnosed with mental illness 54% increase in chronically homeless and 46% increase in transitional youth).



How does SOTP help?

We make lunches and serve dinner. Preferably five volunteers are needed. Youth volunteers are welcome (depending on maturity level and if they are able to sit still for one hour following directions without adult supervision). We meet at SOTP Sunday evenings at 5:45 p.m. to make lunches for the shelter, and then transport lunches (including donations) to Bethany. We serve dinner from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. Jill Brown shops for supplies. This is a ministry that is allocated in our church budget.

When?

The 4th Sunday of the Month, October through April.

Where?

We support Bethany Lutheran Church every 4th Sunday at 76 W Crystal Lake Ave in Crystal Lake IL 60014. This is only a 15 to 20 minute commute from SOTP. Linda is our contact at Bethany--she has been in charge of that facility for over 25 years and will assign your job. There are 7 churches in McHenry County that provide overnight shelters (rotated Monday through Sunday) from 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. A transportation bus is used to commute the homeless between the churches.

STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN INTRODUCTION

"Because of God's Great Mercy"



The title of our stewardship emphasis for calendar 2018 is "Because of God's Great Mercy". The scriptural basis of this focus on our stewardship of all that God has entrusted into our care is 1 Peter 2:9, "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of Him who called you out of darkness and into His marvelous light."

We begin by proclaiming all that God has done for us, hence the title "Because of God's Great Mercy." God has made us His own people. He has blessed us with Saints of past and present who have shared the life and love of Jesus with us. We give thanks for all who have and continue to give voice to Christ through words and action.

We will also consider how generous giving is an important part of every Christian's life, and how our combined generosity can make even greater things possible through our congregation at Shepherd of the Prairie.

We will think together about how our giving is an important part of our Christian faith, and how SOTP uses our offerings to do God's work within our walls, in our community, and around the world.

"Because of God's Great Mercy", we will ask you to do three things. First, you will be asked to increase your giving to Shepherd of the Prairie by $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1% of your annual household income. Second, you will be asked to consider increasing your pledged gift in the last year of the three year Forward in Faith building campaign or if you are new and haven't made a commitment to this important building project, we ask that you prayerfully consider giving to this fund. And thirdly, you will be asked to consider using an automatic funds transfer program that SOTP already has in place for your giving.

Our stewardship campaign, which culminates with our offering commitments on Saturday & Sunday, November 18 & 19, will use mail, Email, bulletin inserts, and time during our worship hour to share information with you. Please make a special effort to watch for these materials during this important time in our congregation's life, reflecting on how you have been blessed by His love, grace, and mercy and how you will respond to these precious personal gifts.

TREASURER'S REPORT AS OF SEPTEMBER 30, 2017

The Message: Give Generously

We are Stewards of all we possess 1 Timothy 6:18-19...“be rich in helping others ... be extravagantly generous.”

Income and Expenses are on target with the Annual Budget. Through September contributions Year-To-Date exceeded the budgeted amount by \$22,326 and expenses Year-To-Date are under the budgeted amount by \$17,083. Operating income Year-To-Date(YTD) exceeded expenses by \$38,253.

As of September 30th the Building Fund Balance was \$748,414. During the month Forward in Faith donations totaled \$27,567. Building Fund expenses related to the new building were \$219,019 for the month and Total Building Fund Expenses were \$377,286 Year-To-Date. The large amount is result of construction payments.
