## *A Note From Pastor Mark*

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have had a wonderful week of Vacation Bible School. Over 140 children and volunteers have filled our hallways and we pray lives have been touched by the Savior's love. One of our hopes always is that a young life is forever touched by Jesus during these days together.

In Luke chapter 5, Jesus reveals to Peter what Peter's purpose will be in his life. His life would be forever touched by Jesus' invitation to "drop his nets," and go fishing for something other than fish. Wouldn't that be wonderful if each of us were given that instruction? If each of us would have had some specific invitation as Peter did long ago.

Do you suppose life would have been more simple?

Do you suppose we all would have stayed on track with Jesus' instructions?

Probably not. We all have wills and often want to go our own way.

When Jesus told Peter to go out into deep water and let down his nets, Simon obeyed.

When he saw the great catch he was cut to his heart, his sin was revealed to him and he repented.

God's response to Peter's need caused this. This call from Jesus to Peter would enable a man who was a pro at fishing to use the methods and strategy he used in catching fish, to catch people.

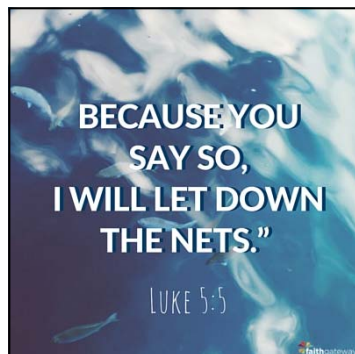
Nothing he had learned up to this point would be lost. Jesus would put it all to use.

As you may be aware, Shepherd of the Prairie was scheduled to have a visit from our sponsored missionary Randy Stubbs and his daughter Marissa this last spring. This visit was cancelled due to the recurrence and advancing leukemia of Carol, Randy's wife. Sadly Carol's battle came to an end May 2nd. She died at home surrounded by her loving family. Shepherd of the Prairie sent a memorial in her honor to support the Stubb's work in Tanzania. We also had members attend a memorial service in DeKalb in June.

Since that time, Randy with Marissa had returned to Tanzania to continue his teaching and administrative work for Makumira Cultural Arts Center, Megan and her husband have returned to Arusha to set up their home and Nathan has returned to college in Texas for summer school.

**The Stubbs family wishes to thank all for their support and prayers over the last 1 1/2 years of Carol's illness and ask for continuing prayers as the family starts to move forward again.**

**May God's grace and blessings be with them in the days ahead.**

We were informed at the end of June that Randy Stubbs and the Stubbs family are no longer in active service as ELCA missionaries. They had been in Tanzania for almost 12 years. The ELCA Global Mission also has asked for our continuing prayers for the family. ## BOOK CHATTERS NEW READING LIST



Book Chatters have been meeting at 1 p.m. on the third Wednesday September through June for several years now; we forget just how many. There are five or six stalwarts who've been in the group all along, but others drop in and out depending on travel plans, book titles or even the weather. We'd like you to join us in whatever method you like and will assume you are a member whenever you can join us. To facilitate your decision, we've picked our books for the next reading season. As leader, I researched book club reading lists and compiled twenty-five titles from which the group chose the ten listed below:

**September 2018** THE CHERRY COLA BOOK CLUB by Ashton Lee. *(We start our year as a book club with a book about a book club.)*

**October 2018** HIDDEN FIGURES by Margot Lee Shetterly. *(We read at least one nonfiction, this one about pioneering NASA mathematicians.)*

**November 2018** ISCARIOT by Tosca Lee. *(Always we do at least one religious or inspirational title, this one a look at Judas' story from his viewpoint.)*

**December 2018** THE DEAL OF A LIFETIME by Fredrik Backman. *(Our Christmas selection this year is a short novella, which makes time for a short holiday discussion and a bonafide Christmas party!)*

**January 2019** BRITT-MARIE WAS HERE by Fredrik Backman *(Yes, Backman is back). One of our fiction selections, this involves a woman who takes over a failing recreation center and its youth soccer team — sure to be a fun read because of Backman.)*

**February 2019** MURDER ON THE ORIENT EXPRESS by Agatha Christie. *(We always choose a literary classic, and after two years ago we promised to actually make ourselves read the choice, no matter how difficult—but this one will present no obstacles.)*

**March 2019** UNDERGROUND GIRLS OF KABUL by Jenny Nordberg. *(Another nonfiction choice about young girls in Kabul who masquerade as boys in order to have safer, less restrictive lives.)*

**April 2019** THE PRODIGAL by Brennan Manning and Greg Garrett. *(A second inspirational book that is a modern application of the Prodigal Son story dealing with a mega church pastor who slips from grace and has some work to do toward redemption.)*

**May 2019** LILAC GIRLS by Martha Hall Kelley. *(This fiction piece involves three women during and near the end of WWII and how their stories intertwine — a thought provoking and somewhat uncomfortable read but worth the time)*

June 2019 THE GREAT ALONE by Kristin Hannah. *(Kristin Hannah always writes a very readable book, this one about a POW who tries to repair his family and himself by isolating them in the solitude of frontier Alaska. We'll read it to see if his plan works, counting the book inspirational if it does.)*

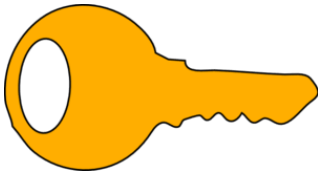

# FINANCIAL NEWS

## Treasurer's Report as of June 30, 2018

**Mid-Year Report** Operating Income and Expenses are within the Annual Budget for Income and Expenses through the middle of the fiscal year. Contributions exceeded expectations by \$21,906. The year-to-date total income of \$368,052 included the transfer of \$26,250 of Prepaid Pledges received in December. Income for June was \$51,459. Expenses were \$55,317 for June and year-to-date expenses totaled \$309,897 which was \$35,267 below the budgeted amount.

**Building Fund** The Building Fund Balance is \$150,391 and Construction Loan funds were used to pay construction and interest costs monthly. During the month Forward in Faith donations totaled \$104,271 and year-to-date donations totaled \$289,951. The very high donations were a direct result of the letter sent by Pastor Mark requesting that members catch up on their pledges. Building Fund construction and interest expenses related to the new building were \$156,037 for the month.

**Building on Faith Donations** The Building on Faith Campaign resulted in donations totaling \$102,482. These funds are used to purchase furnishings for the new Sanctuary. So far \$83,205 has been used to purchase items listed in this program.

**Fixed Assets** As construction progresses on the new building there is a significant increase in the value of the Fixed Asset for Building and Grounds which is now at \$7,058,541.

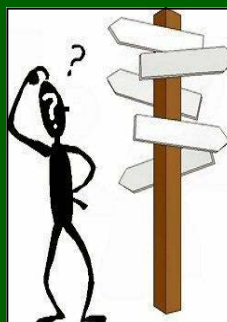
