



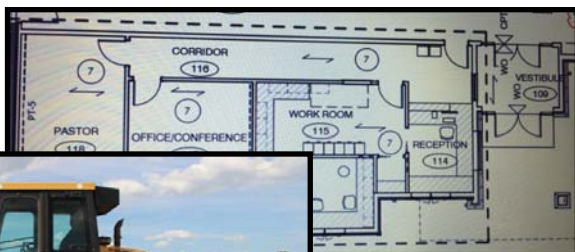

A Note From Pastor Mark

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

How do we manage conflicts when it happens in the faith community? What happens when someone in the church behaves in a way that is harmful to others?

What do we do if they are harmful to themselves?

In the 18th Chapter of Matthew there is an offering made by which one is to confront a member who “sins.” What encompasses sin may be debated and a bit subjective and a controversy all its own. What’s most important is the fact that a dynamic is occurring that causes distress and distance in our relationship with someone. How do we handle it?

In anger someone may say, “If you don’t like what is happening in our church, leave! Go find another church.” In such moments, people are excommunicated by anger and disrespect.

On the other hand, when conflicts are never confronted in a church, people leave feeling defeated and ignored, excommunicated by neglect. These are challenges facing faith communities every day. It is a challenge because every church is filled with people.

How does love triumph over such challenges?

Matthew’s Gospel points us to a process by which to be reconciled with another person. If you have an issue with someone, go to them and tell them what they have done to harm the relationship. If they don’t agree, then bring two or more witnesses so that the conversation can be witnessed by others to confirm the problem.

This follows a Jewish legal requirement described in Deuteronomy 19:15. It protects against bearing false witness against someone when an accusation is made. In a world filled with e-mails, text messages, tweets and Instagrams, there are times when it is important for face to face human interaction. God knew it, so God sent Jesus.

A very wise and gentle pastor once told me that when a person who loves you confronts you about a bad behavior, it is more likely to result in change and restoration than when a person who is perceived to be uncaring does the same.

Confronting one another out of love grows relationships deeper through honest and trustworthy conversation. We believe love really does get

lived out in Christian community. A dad shared with me last week he felt "the church was one place where unconditional love was lived out for his children to see." It is love's vision to reconcile the sinner to Christ. When we live these principles, faith grows and community flourishes.

How do you deal with the reality of human failings and conflict? How is love expressed and lived in your life?

A prayer to pray in relationship to Christ and others...Through your love, O Lord, we seek reconciliation and new life each day. Help us to be reconciled in our significant relationships through the gifts of grace and mercy sufficient for every day. Amen.

Ministry Musings

Recently I attended the NI synod Assembly held at Augustana College. The entire two days was wonderful as I met new people and reconnected with old friends. There were workshops, key note speakers, business conducted and times of worship; and I enjoyed it all. But there was one thing that captured the attention of my mind and my spirit, and it has been in my thoughts ever since then.



Rev Craig Nessen of Wartburg Theological Seminary, was one of the keynote speakers. He asked if we remembered the old song, "I love to tell the story...of Jesus and his love". Then he asked the question that stays with me; "do you love to tell the story, or do you just love the story?". Then he repeated it, "do you love to tell the story, or do you just love the story?". That question really took me by surprise. I had never even considered that idea.

Suddenly I realized that there is a big difference in **loving** the story and loving to **tell** the story! Most of the time we "reserved" Lutherans **love** the story of Jesus. It is close to and encapsulated in our hearts. We cherish and celebrate Jesus' journey from the

manger to the empty tomb. It is a part of our lives, often as familiar as breathing. But **telling** the story, no less **loving** to tell the story is a bit more unaccustomed in our lives of faith.

Rev Nessen spoke of how we, the Christian in pew, are no less ministers than ordained clergy. The job of telling the story belongs to all of us. In fact, he said that our baptism is our ordination and called the ministry of the baptized the “work of God in public lives”. He also pointed out that we as a baptized people need to cross over the threshold of the sanctuary and into the streets with the story of Jesus and his love.

St. Francis of Assisi is credited with saying, “Preach the Gospel at all times and when necessary use words”. Our task as God’s “public life ministers” is to tell the story in word and deed. We are good at the deed portion of our task. Every time we care for the sick, the lonely, the homeless, the hungry, the fearful, the grieving, the youngest and the oldest, we are telling the story. But we must not forget to “use our words” as well. Those whom we serve need to hear that God loves them and welcomes them into the family and to his table.

May God give us the desire and the daring to **love to tell** the story as much as we **love** the story.

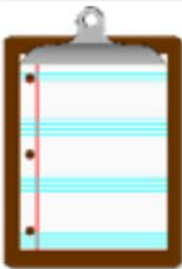
There will be a box in the Narthex to collect the items. The Mission Team will be collecting these items **from August until the end of September.** Thank you so much for your help!

FINANCIAL NEWS

Treasurer's Report as of July 31, 2018

July Report Operating Income and Expenses are within the Annual Budget for Income and Expenses through July. Contributions slightly exceeded expectations with Income for the month of \$63,966 and Expenses of \$58,355 for the month and year-to-date expenses totaling \$368,252 which is \$36,106 below the budgeted amount.

Building Fund The Building Fund Balance is \$314,401 and Construction Loan funds were used to pay construction and interest costs. During the month Forward in Faith donations totaled \$39,057 and year-to-date donations totaled \$329,008. The letter sent by Pastor Mark requesting members catch up on their pledges was very helpful. Building Fund construction and interest expenses related to the new building were \$266,981 for the month.

Building on Faith Donations The Building on Faith Campaign resulted in donations totaling \$115,967 through July. These funds are used to purchase furnishings for the new Sanctuary. So far \$105,429 has been used to purchase items in this program.

Fixed Assets With construction of the new building there has been a major increase in the Fixed Assets for Building and Grounds which is now at \$6,773,799.
