Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

John 11:32-53

The first weekend in November is the time in the church year we pause to light candles and remember we are surround by a great cloud of witness. It is fitting that the raising of Lazarus story, be used to commemorate All Saints Weekend. Through it we speak with confidence of those believers who have gone before, knowing that because of Jesus' authority over death, they are and we are spending eternity with God.

We give witness to statements as above, and yet we, like Mary and Martha, the sisters of Lazarus, express the same doubt when experiencing the death of a loved one, the fears or dark times of our lives and when facing death ourselves.

"Oh, sir, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." Wasn't she asking, "Why did you delay?"

Do we not, when God's answers to our prayers are not in our expected time frame or as we anticipated, confront God with similar questions, "Oh, God, why did you let him die?", "Why didn't you prevent the cancer from spreading?", "Why was I retired before I was ready?", "Why did my grandchild make such life threatening choices?"

Our faith in God's being able to bring good even from the bad which occurs in our lives is shaken.

And yes, the world is there just as the crowds were with Mary and Martha at Lazarus' grave, questioning their faith in the one whom they followed. So the world questions today, "Why do you believe in Jesus? Why hasn't he answered your prayers?"

Even Martha, who has just previously confessed, "Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, he who is coming into the world," in response to Jesus' statement that he was the resurrection and the life now cautions Jesus when he calls for the tomb to be opened, "But Lord, Lazarus has been dead four days. By this time he will be decaying."

Do we, too, put our human reason, our commonsense in front of believing in God's miracles?

Before asking Lazarus to come out, Jesus prayed, thanking God for having heard him, knowing that God always heard his prayers. He said this for the sake of the people standing there so that they would believe. Jesus, the mind of God, knows us; he knows that we will have doubts. For this reason he sent the Holy Spirit to increase our faith; to be the strength we need to be his stewards into eternity.

As those saints who have gone before us, we, too, must witness to

God's glory through our words and, most importantly, through our actions, remembering that it is in the ordinary doings of life that we show that we belong to God.

Jesus lived to show only the glory of God.

On the first weekend of November we will sing "For all the saints who from their labors rest, All who by faith before the world confessed, Your name, O Jesus, be forever blest. Alleluia! Alleluia! (Evangelical Lutheran Worship, #422). It is the day we remember, and recommit ourselves to carry the Good News forward for the world to hear and see through our lives!

With time, love and patience we will find ourselves "at home" in our new home as well.



NORTHERN IL FOOD BANK—THANK YOU!

Thank You!

I simply can't thank you enough for your wonderful service on Saturday morning, October 6 at the Northern Illinois Food Bank. Most of the people that signed up were able to attend but it is totally

understood why people cannot attend for various reasons, including attending a funeral at the same time as NIFB program. You are all very kind, wonderful servants that did quite a bit of God's work with your hands (and other parts of your bodies). Our group was divided into 3 for different projects each accomplishing quite a bit:

- ⇒ One group worked on canned green beans. They managed to pack up 6,952 pounds of food providing 5,793 meals for hungry neighbors in Northern Illinois.
- ⇒ A second group packed up fresh onions. They packed up 12,100 pounds of food providing 10,083 meals for hungry neighbors in Northern Illinois.
- ⇒ A third group that needed sit-down jobs helped prepare bags to be used in the near future to help recipients prepare turkey gravy. This group prepared 2,500 bags for the upcoming holiday. *"This was definitely a day that the Lord had made, so let"*

"The Giving Tree" has been set up in the Mission area, just past the coat racks, with drop off boxes too. SOTP will again provide 25 families with gifts, fifteen families from Grafton Food Pantry and ten families from Turning Point, who provide shelter for abused women and children.

PADS

PUBLIC ACTION TO DELIVER SHELTER MODEL NEY COUNTY

What is PADS?

Public Action to Deliver Shelter (McHenry County founded 1988). This program is not government supported. Since 2009, PADS reports a 51% increase in people needing help (33% increase in homeless individuals diagnosed with mental illness 54% increase in chronically homeless and 46% increase in transitional youth).

How does SOTP help?

We make lunches and serve dinner. Preferably five volunteers are needed. Youth volunteers are welcome (depending on maturity level and if they able to sit still for one hour following directions without adult supervision). We meet at SOTP Sunday evenings at 5:45 p.m. to make lunches for the shelter, and then transport lunches (including donations) to Bethany. We serve dinner from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. Marty Jacobson shops for supplies. This is a ministry that is allocated in our church budget.

To help out:

Bring in items for SOTP volunteers to take to PADS. Items currently needed: individual/travel size toiletries (especially deodorant), paper towels, napkins, twin blade disposable razors, bleach (any size), \$5 fast food certificates, ear plugs, cereal, new or gently used long johns (especially bottoms).

Where?

- We support Bethany Lutheran Church every 4th Sunday at 76 W Crystal Lake Ave in Crystal Lake IL 60014. This is only a 15 to 20 minute commute from SOTP. Linda is our contact at Bethany--she has been in charge of that facility for over 25 years.
- Help is also needed Wednesday nights at the Woodstock PADS shelter, contact Vik Bekeris at 224-629-8615 for information.

There are 7 churches in McHenry County that provide overnight shelters (rotated Monday through Sunday) from 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. A transportation bus is used to commute the homeless between the churches.

FINANCIAL NEWS

Treasurer's Report as of September 30, 2018

Below is a summary of the church's income and expenses for the month of September and Year-to-date. We encourage everyone to give regularly, proportionally, faithfully, and generously to support our church's mission and ministry all year long.

<u>General Fund Report</u> The General Fund balance is \$411,159 Operating Income and Expenses are within the Annual Budget for Income and Expenses, with Income for the month of \$54,491 and Expenses of \$58,846 for the month. Cash in the checking account is \$411,159 of which \$213,371 is restricted and reserved for future expenditures.

<u>Building Fund Report</u> The Building Fund Balance is \$244,114. Building construction and interest expenses related to the new building were \$79,967 for the month. The first mortgage payment will be made in November.

<u>Building on Faith Donations</u> The Building on Faith Campaign resulted in donations totaling \$126,867 and these funds are used to purchase furnishings for the new Sanctuary. To date \$110,902 has been used to purchase furnishings.
