A Note From Pastor Mark

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A stranger or a neighbor calls you over and asks if you would mind holding a nail while he pounds it in. He'd do it himself, but he hit his thumb pretty bad on the last swing and it's turning an ugly color.

A Note from Pastor Mark...

You don't know too much about this guy's ability as a carpenter and, of course, you really don't want to nurse your own multi-colored throbbing thumb. Do you have the confidence to hold the nail while he gives it a good whack?

12-year-old Jesus is found (Luke 2:41-52), after his parents' frantic three-day search, in the temple courts listening and asking questions of the Jewish leaders. These leaders were astonished by his understanding and the depth of his questions.

Aren't we all, at one time or another, stumped by some of the questions or explanations emanating from the mouths and minds of our children and grandchildren?

But Jesus was asking questions of a different nature, and learning more about his Father's house.

What do you feel confident about in your own faith?

Is there any issue or verse in the Bible that bothers you on your Christian journey? Many of us read the Bible daily, but how many of us really search, question and take the time to understand what is being said and how it may pertain to our own journey with God?

How many of us listen and question?

If you don't read the Bible, how do you know that what's flowing out of the Pastor's mouth, or some other believer's mouth, is the truth? What is guiding you? How much more do you think you have matured in your faith and understanding of the Bible in the last six months? In the last two weeks? Are you growing confident in your walk or do you feel unsure?

As we move into this New Year, I invite you to consider how God is calling you to grow into that seed of faith entrusted to you in baptism. What will you do to nurture your relationship with Christ and others?

Jesus' reply to his mother that day was this: "Why were you searching for me? Didn't you know that I had to be in my Father's house?" Shouldn't that response motivate us, too, to learn more what the Bible has to teach us, so that we can grow more confident in our journey through a Christ-filled life?

Peace is a commodity we all seek: peace in our world, peace in our families, peace in our cities and neighborhoods, peace between friends and neighbors, peace within ourselves. Peace on earth seems to be the last thing we will be able to find here on earth.

Jesus promises his peace; Paul calls it "the peace that passes all understanding" (Phil 4:7). This peace brings together an inner tranquility with outward acts of 'beating swords into plowshares'. We can bring that peace through care & visitation ministries, feeding the hungry, caring for the homeless and helpless, listening to the heartbroken and hurting, lifting our hearts and hands together in prayer, forgiving and being forgiven.

Jesus associates the peace he promises to them and us with the coming of the Advocate, the Spirit, the helper who will link Jesus' survivors with their deceased beloved and with God. (The Holy Spirit is often called the Comforter.)

Often when we think of the Holy Spirit we think of the wind at Pentecost (Acts 2: 1-4). The Hebrew word is rauch which means wind/spirit/breath of God. God breathed into Adam the breath of life (rauch) and man became a living being. (Wind) at Pentecost (acts 2:1-4), (breath) of Jesus in upper room (John 20:22). The roots of the concept of the Holy Spirit are multiple and many faceted. The animating principle of life, Pneuma (Greek) can be translated as breath of spirit.

In John 14, Jesus speaks of the Spirit not as a force of nature (wind), but as another Advocate, "I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you... But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and remind you of everything I have said to you... Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubles and do not be afraid." As he prepares his disciples for his leaving, he promises not to leave them alone but to come to them and be present with them through the Spirit, the breath of God. They will receive the Spirit of Truth, who will come in Jesus' absence and "be with you forever"; "he will abide with you" and "be in you".

Today that inspiring and illuminating work of the Spirit shines light on the ongoing efforts of believers to discern the will of God in their

lives. Living in God's will and trusting in him brings peace into the lives of his people which we then in turn bring to those around us.

Peace should be understood here in the sense of the Hebrew Shalom. Shalom is not just getting along or that absence of tension or conflict. Shalom peace refers to the blessing of the Lord that results in harmony, wholeness, completeness, prosperity, welfare and tranquility. This is the peace Jesus breathes on us as he gives us the Spirit. May you have Shalom-peace in this new year!

BARNABAS CAREGIVING PROGRAM

The First Duty of Love is to Listen - Paul Tillich
We are sponsoring another day of training for new
Barnabas Ministers with Pastor Chuck Olson on
Saturday, Feb 9, 2019 from 9 – 2, with lunch provided.

What is the Barnabas Caregiving Program?

It is a simple, effective program for training volunteers to give care in most institutional and home situations. Giving care means having conversations with those who are homebound, in care facilities or facing some of life's most difficult seasons to provide a listening ear and encouragement to those who need to be heard and cared for. The ministry is named after Barnabas, the apostle first mentioned in the book of Acts (4:36-37) who encouraged the twelve by selling a piece of property and laying a gift of the money at their feet. In their gratitude the renamed him "BarNabas" – "Son of Encouragement". Barnabas later traveled with Paul in bringing care and continued encouragement, along with the gospel, to the gentile world.

What is a Barnabas Minister and what do they do?

A Barnabas Minister is a skilled listener who encourages others by that listening. They are trained in how to listen effectively, how to build relational skills, and in how to encourage others. They will also be trained to bring Communion from the Assembly to the special person they visit.

There are several ways to serve as a Barnabas Minister:

- Caring for a loved one in your home
- Caring for a congregational member who is homebound
- Caring for a congregational member in a care facility
- Serving on a hospital visitation team
- Caring for a person dealing with a life issue

After attending the training, participants are eligible to be commissioned as Barnabas Ministers. After training, each trainee will be able to choose whether or not they wish to make a commitment to be a Barnabas Minister, and what form of service that will take. Once a minister is commissioned, they will be matched with the care-received they will minister to.

Training is Saturday, February 9th, 9am to 2pm (lunch and all materials will be provided). Come and see if this is where God is calling you to serve. To make a reservation for training or for more information Donna Sorensen, sorensensid@comcast.net

Giving Tree Thank You. A BIG thank you to our great congregation




FLOWERS FOR THE ALTAR 2019

FINANCIAL NEWS

Shepherd of the Prairie Financial Update

<u>Treasurer's Report as of November 30, 2018</u> Below is a summary of the church's income and expenses for the month and Year-to-date. All are encouraged to give regularly, proportionally, faithfully, and generously to support our church's mission and ministry all year long.

<u>General Fund Report</u> The General Fund Balance is \$178,726. Operating Income for the month was \$49,549 and Expenses for the month were \$62,143.

<u>Building Fund Report</u> The Building Fund Balance is \$21,736 after paying all the expenses related to the new building. The first mortgage payment of \$19,536 was made November 1st. and there was an additional principal payment of \$13,881. Forward in Faith donations totaled \$401,433 Year-to-Date.
