

A Note From Pastor Mark

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Jesus brought so many gifts to us in his first coming at Christmas, and we are still unwrapping those gifts and trying to understand them 2000 years later.

Pastor, s In this week's Gospel reading from Luke the 4th chapter, we read about Jesus' return visit to his birthplace of Nazareth, after his baptism, his forty days of contemplative time in the desert wilderness, and the beginning of his notoriety as a traveling preacher-teacher. He attended synagogue as we would expect of him. He stood up when it was time for the reading of the scroll and they passed it to him.

In reading the text from the prophet Isaiah (ch. 61), he announced his public ministry and the fulfillment of one of many prophetic promises about him. No wonder it amazed his old neighbors. And they begged him to stay in his hometown and continue the wonders of his holy power and become their full-time teacher.

Human nature tends to be self-centered and self-serving, not humbling and serving of others. But Jesus' coming was to cover a much wider circle of ministry.

It is not surprising that the tribe of Israel had no idea that the Savior would come for more than just them and come in the character of this seemingly ordinary man. They were a group that was in the habit of bargaining to get what they wanted or what they thought was due them.

God had worked for centuries molding and shaping their attitudes. God had given them rules and consequences for living. And now God gave them himself, to model in the flesh the depth of kindness God expected of them.

God gave himself, not only to Israel, but to the whole world, and to us today.

When the time was right for Jesus to begin the public ministry that God had planned, news quickly spread, even in that time period of archaic communication, about Jesus and what he was doing to turn the world around.

Jesus launched an evangelism program that blew them away. Back in his home town, he was operating in full Spirit power, and in the synagogue when he stood up to read Scripture.

- What does it mean to operate "in the power of the Spirit" or to have "the Spirit of the Lord on me"?
- Do you have that availability of the Spirit?

 Jesus announced to Nazareth that he was anointed to bring justice: good news to the poor, freedom for prisoners, recovery of sight to the blind, release of the oppressed, and the time of the Lord's favor. What does this mean to you?

As we begin this new year of ministry together I pray God would give you wisdom to faithfully follow where the Spirit leads to use your gifts for the purpose of bringing in the Kingdom. Your Kingdom come, your will be done, on earth, as in heaven. Peace.

The minister then took off the other shoe and gave it to her as well. The woman remarked that she couldn't take this minister's shoes but was assured by the minister that she had another pair at home.

As the street woman left, the room was filled with stunned silence. Another Stephen Minister asked the one who had given up her shoes how she was going to get home as it was cold and wet outside. She replied that she had on thick socks and that she did have a pair of shoes to wear. She then put on the tattered shoes the woman had left behind and proceeded to walk outside. The shoes were badly worn and caused her to limp as she walked. The other minister warned her to be careful and to not fall and get hurt. As she hobbled out, she remarked, "Now I really know what it's like to walk in someone else's shoes".

What else is there to say? May God help us to be as generous and caring as this woman was to share his love and grace with our neighbors.

BARNABAS CAREGIVING PROGRAM

The First Duty of Love is to Listen - Paul Tillich

We are sponsoring another day of training for new Barnabas Ministers with Pastor Chuck Olson on **Saturday**, **Feb 9**, **2019 from 9 – 2**, with lunch provided.



What is the Barnabas Caregiving Program?

It is a simple, effective program for training volunteers to give care in most institutional and home situations. Giving care means having conversations with those who are homebound, in care facilities or facing some of life's most difficult seasons to provide a listening ear and encouragement to those who need to be heard and cared for.

The ministry is named after Barnabas, the apostle first mentioned in the book of Acts (4:36-37) who encouraged the twelve by selling a piece of property and laying a gift of the money at their feet. In their gratitude the renamed him "BarNabas" – "Son of Encouragement". Barnabas later traveled with Paul in bringing care and continued encouragement, along with the gospel, to the gentile world.

What is a Barnabas Minister and what do they do?

A Barnabas Minister is a skilled listener who encourages others by that listening. They are trained in how to listen effectively, how to build relational skills, and in how to encourage others. They will also be trained to bring Communion from the Assembly to the special person they visit.

There are several ways to serve as a Barnabas Minister:

- Caring for a loved one in your home
- Caring for a congregational member who is homebound
- · Caring for a congregational member in a care facility
- Serving on a hospital visitation team
- Caring for a person dealing with a life issue

After attending the training, participants are eligible to be commissioned as Barnabas Ministers. After training, each trainee will be able to choose whether or not they wish to make a commitment to be a Barnabas Minister, and what form of service that will take. Once a minister is commissioned, they will be matched with the care-received they will minister to.

Training is Saturday, February 9th, 9am to 2pm (lunch and all materials will be provided). Come and see if this is where God is calling you to serve.

FINANCIAL NEWS

2018 Year End Treasurer's Report

The faithful and generous support of this congregation has made 2018 another successful year for Shepherd of the Prairie as once again, you have provided the resources needed to do God's Mission and Ministry.

General Fund

The General Fund Balance as of year-end was \$182,477 an increase of \$35,238. We finished 2018 with Operating Income exceeding our budget by \$29,296. Expenses were under budget by \$5,942. This combination of increased giving and controlled expenses resulted in an operating surplus of \$35,238. Thanks to all of you for making the year a success!

As of December 31, 2018, our Fund Balances are as shown in the following table.

Building Fund

For the Forward in Faith Building Campaign we received \$432,908 in Donations this past year and as of December 31st we had a Building Fund Balance of \$33,269 which was used towards the January Mortgage Payment. Mortgage payments are to pay the \$3,750,000 Commercial Loan from the Mission Investment Fund of the ELCA. In 2019 this Fund will be called the Mortgage Service Fund.

Building on Faith Fund

During the Fall members generously contributed \$126,897 to the Building on Faith Campaign which provided needed pews and furnishings for the new Sanctuary. A tremendous success!

Operating Budget for 2019

We are presenting for your consideration a Budget for 2019 which will meet the Mission and Ministry needs of our church. Pastor Mark explained in the Cover Letter what is being proposed and where we as a congregation are heading. We believe that this is a budget which supports the growing needs for Children's Ministry and the growing needs of our members here at Shepherd of the Prairie. The detailed budget is contained within this Annual Report and questions on dollar details may be addressed to David Shotick our Accounting Administrator.
