A Note From Pastor Mark

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pastor; Corner On May 5, 16 Confirmation Students will affirm their baptismal vows during the 10:45 a.m. worship service. The congregation is invited to join us on Wednesday evening, May 1st as they share their statements of faith. Over the past couple of months these students have been crafting these statements as a reflection of their relationship to Christ and their involvement in helping to build the Kingdom on earth.

I would invite you to do the same this month. Think about life and your place in life. Think about your relationship to God and God's activity in your daily life. One of the things we have been diligent in sharing with our students is that before you can believe anything, you must seek to find out about it.

And to find out about God, the best place to go is the Bible. Here much is written about what God does, what God says, and what God asks in return for breathing life into us. The more one reads and cross-references Scripture, the more one sees truth and consistency in God's words, deeds, and plans. Some Scripture, perhaps, will be difficult to comprehend. Many written Bible resources as well as computer resources can offer suggestions at meaning. A Bible Study group gives us the opportunity to pick each others' brains for getting perspective on application and meaning.

Another place where you can get to know God is in church. Here you are exposed to God in music, in Bible reading, in prayer, and in a pastor's perspective in the sermon. You also have the opportunity of meeting other people who are on the same search as yourself-to know and see God as being real in your life. As you listen to God's voice in the Bible, you may be able to see God more clearly in your own life.

A look at nature may show you happenings that only God could create and cause. There are occasions that, even in nature, show a rebellion to God's way.

A look at events in your life, that some people call coincidences, may begin to show you where God is interacting.

Praying to God for enlightenment and understanding God's truths will deepen your search. As your understanding grows, so will your belief and knowledge of God grow. This growth leads to trust, faith, and insight into God's workings in your daily life.

This is what walking in God's path and doing things God's way means to me. Every believer needs to ask three big question:

What do I believe? What should I do? Who am I becoming? Do you have a plan for reading the Bible?

How can you apply the words and truths in the Bible to your own life?

Do you have someone in your life who holds you accountable for integrity?

Think about a time in your life that God interacted in your circumstances, or about a time that God used an event to bring you to a more mature faith.

Share with another how this impacted your life.

Some random thoughts as I pray you reaffirm your baptismal vows along with our 8th grade students this month.

Are you listening? God is speaking; are you listening?

That's a question we all need to ask ourselves. Sometimes we think God isn't listening or speaking because his answer is different from what we think it should be. Sometimes it's because the answer isn't coming as quickly as we want it to or in the way we want it to.



But if we are patient and listen for God's answer in his time, it will come. Recently I have heard God speak in many different ways. A ministry here at SOTP had been on my mind for some time. There was also a place where I saw a need for possible new ministry. The two were somewhat related and I wasn't sure how to integrate the two. I had been praying about how to handle this when one of our newer members came up to me and suggested the same new ministry and offered to head it up. When I spoke with the person leading the ministry I was concerned about, they were eager to integrate with the new ministry! All of this happened within a timespan of less than five hours! I immediately realized God was speaking in the situation. During the time he was speaking to me about these ministries, he had been speaking to the new member and the ministry leader! And because we were all listening, he made clear his answer to the need.

God doesn't usually speak in an audible voice; most of the time he uses other people to speak his words. Many times, something is weighing on my mind and someone will come and talk to me about just that thing, and together we will find the answer. Sometimes God speaks through something we hear or read. I can't tell you how often I'm thinking about a topic or a question, and I'll read about it in a commentary during my daily "coffee time with God", or Pastor Mark will mention it in his sermon, or I'll read it in a blog.

So, listen carefully... and hear God speaking to you. God is speaking, are you listening?

GREEN TREES APARTMENTS, OUR NEIGHBORS

Most of us have passed by this little development just .3 mile west of Shepherd of the Prairie on Main St, and never even knew it was there. (or what it was)

Green Trees is a housing development, owned and managed by the McHenry County Housing Authority. Occupancy is limited to those who are disabled or those with low incomes.



Funding for this housing is always limited. As a result, organizations have provided support in such areas as painting, window washing, trimming, etc.

Over the years SOTP has provided help in many areas, all on a one-time single project basis.

In 2012, the County was given a special grant to landscape the property. SOTP was asked to oversee this project. With the involvement of many other community organizations, over 1,000 trees and shrubs were planted. The Village of Huntley supplied the Mulch. Many organizations such as Boy Scouts, Trinity Lutheran & St Mary, provided help.

This was done with a "one time" involvement of SOTP.

Please note that a project like this provided SOTP with "Mission" opportunities right in our community and for peoples of all generations to interact.

Unfortunately, no one gave much thought as to how this property was going to be maintained. Weeds were higher than the plantings and there was the most colorful field of dandelions. So, SOTP was asked to help, again on a "one time" basis, and the weeds were brought somewhat under control.

Members of our Mission Team made a decision to support with manpower and some funding the ongoing maintenance of Green Trees. Jules Pelka "volunteered" to coordinate efforts at Green Trees.

Next month, I will share with you what we are doing at Green Trees to make this effort more viable on an on-going basis and how multiple elements of the Huntley community have provided support. Specific plans will be included in the Friday Flourish.
