A Note From Pastor Mark

Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are my God my savior, and my hope is in you all day long (Psalm 25:5). Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

These are honest open words asking for guidance.

Asking in such a way seems simple doesn't it? Our problem is usually waiting for an answer. We want an answer immediately, and in a way we think is best for us. We are not good at taking time to listen, or searching the Bible for further guidance.

We forget that our way is not God's way. We get impatient. Sometimes we give up. Maybe we think it wasn't the right time to pray. Maybe we feel guilty about what we perceive as God's lack of response because we don't think we measure up.

We're not good enough. We forget that we live in grace and that our heavenly father hears us and is concerned about our needs.

Psalm 23 is another example of praying for guidance. It reflects peace, comfort and guidance, assuring us that God is constantly watching over us and knows our every need.

Daily prayer helps us feel connected to God. It strengthens our soul. When we pray for guidance, we also need to listen. Listening is a trait that seems to be in short supply ... ask any spouse!

And often, when we do attempt to listen, we take words the wrong way, or ignore them, or respond unkindly ... because what we hear is not what we want to hear. What can we do about that?

Is it possible to be an openminded listener? Will this take practice? Have you ever thought about how you listen to God? Do you offer long prayers filled with lamenting in hopes of convincing God about something? In hopes of making a deal?

Or do you honestly tell God what's bothering you, and admitting that the burden is too heavy for you to bear alone?

Do you set aside a quiet time for prayer, or are you prone to fire off a prayer like a TV commercial?

Do you get frustrated or impatient if you don't see immediate results? And what are "results," exactly? What does that mean?

As we move into this season of Thanksgiving. I encourage you to set aside time for prayer. Take time to speak as well as time to listen. As you do, be open minded to listen for God's answer. Give thanks to God who takes time to listen and respond (Luke 18:7).

Ministry Musings

Prayer...one of the staples of our Christian faith. But, what is prayer? How should we pray? Our Gospel lesson a couple of weeks ago (Luke 18:1-8) talked about a widow who was persistent in her appeal to an unjust judge who wanted nothing to do with her or her case. Yet she never gave up her petition; she kept on badgering the



judge until he finally gave in and gave her a just ruling, just to get her off his back!

So, is this telling us that if we pray for something and God doesn't answer the way we want we should just keep on pestering him until he gets tired of hearing us and gives us what we want? I don't think so. I do think God wants us to continually pray for those in need either of physical or emotional healing, or for those in other needs. But to focus on our persistence is, I think, missing the point.

I think we need to concentrate on God's persistence rather than

ours; the good news of the Old and New Testament is about God's persistent, unshakeable, everlasting love for us and for all of creation. God is so persistently in love with us, God's love is sovereign and unshakeable that we can trust in this God to bring about justice.

God hears our prayers, those cries in the night as we call out to him with longing and emptiness. He hears our prayers of joy and thanksgiving. We may not always see the results we want, in the time-frame we want, but God has not forgotten us. Sometimes we grow impatient, losing heart and hope, but God never loses his hope in us. Theologian Fred Craddock puts it, "All we know in the life of prayer is asking, seeking, knocking, and waiting, trust; sometimes fainting, sometimes growing angry."

But this is the point when our faithful persistence enters the picture. Because we know and have experienced God's persistent love in Jesus, we can work everyday to persist in praying, "They kingdom come." Prayer is hard work while we wait during the time between God's promise and its realization. Praying means hopeful trusting in God, not in ourselves.

Our life of faith is not only about telling God what is on our wish list, but is about constantly lifting up every joy and concern, fear and doubt, every lament and plea to the one who hears us and answers. The answers may not come when and how we think they should, but God's love remains constant and persistent in the face of it all.

We, like to widow in the story Jesus told, can keep praying, hoping against all odds, persistent, determined and relentless; yet always praying, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done." The Holy Spirit gives us the courage to pray without ceasing and trust in God's goodness and love in this broken and fear-filled world.



GREEN TREES—END OF YEAR WRAP UP

The Green Trees Low Income Housing Development has for many years been a major focus of our Mission Program at SOTP. While it has been a difficult season to recruit volunteers, a lot has been accomplished in maintaining grounds that would otherwise be overrun with weeds.



Before next season, SOTP will

have to examine its future role in this project. The minimum, would, most likely be a periodic "work day" project each year.

To go beyond that, as we have over the last few years, and do a constant maintenance is a much larger undertaking. All types of potential resources need to be examined for future commitment. Community help, an expanded role of the McHenry Housing Authority, resident involvement are examples of this.




