A Note From Pastor Mark

"Marked With the Cross of Christ"

Friends, as believers, we believe in body piercing! It's not something I would ever do in reality, but spiritually this is most certainly true.

Pastors Corners It is our faith in Jesus that brings us the Grace and Peace that Jesus earned for us on the cross. The Lenten Season begins on Ash Wednesday, February, 26. I hope you will make a point to worship with us during these midweek services with our theme "Marked with the Cross of Christ." These are the first words spoken following baptism.

Through our faith, we are pierced on that cross just as Jesus was. Through our faith, we die on that cross, just as Jesus died. We die to sin and are born again to new life, everlasting life. See the common theme here? It's faith!

"Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed!" Friends, do you believe in body piercing?

You see, we're no different than Thomas, the one who spoke these words long ago.

We are all doubting humans. Jesus went to the cross for you and for me and as He completed His work. He also made a profound statement from that cross: "it is finished." In that moment, as Jesus died on the cross, Satan was defeated. But we still doubt.

Luther explains our doubting predicament like this: we are simultaneously both sinner and saint! It means we believers are simultaneously in a relationship of merciful justice with God through Christ Jesus, while at the same time, being human, prone to our sinful nature, prone to sin. As we often say in our Sunday confession, "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.

There is a wonderful new book out there by the famous Christian author Max Lucado entitled, Resurrection Morning. If you are looking for a book for a small group it would be a good one to read together. It's a fictional story about the Roman guard named Claudius who actually drove those nails into Jesus' hands. In this story Claudius comes to understand Who Jesus is and through the book, Lucado teaches how each one of us is in part responsible for Jesus' death on the cross and how each one of us really helped Claudius hammer those spikes through Jesus' hands and feet.

Please join us in our Lenten journey this year. Two services on Ash Wednesday at 12 noon and 7:00 p.m. Soup suppers begin the following week at 5:30 p.m. with worship at 7:00 p.m.

We all are marked with the cross of Christ. We believe in "body piercing."

We will remember and recognize God's purposes as we have been (Continued on page 3)

marked with a blessing. Our Lenten journey will remind us that God's promises are fulfilled and sins are crossed out only at the cross of Jesus. We will wake to Easter morning (and I pray each day) remembering "it is finished" and now Jesus has risen from the dead. He has risen indeed! And because Jesus lives, God claims us as His own.

I'll look forward to being with you in worship.



1 Corinthians 13 says:

"Love is patient. Love is kind It does not envy It does not boast It is not proud It does not dishonor others lt is not self-seekina It is not easily angered It keeps no record of wrongs Love does not delight in evil But rejoices with the truth It always protects. Always trusts Always hopes Always perseveres Love never fails."



I remember as a child that a teacher told us that there were two exercises we could do with this passage. The first was to replace the word 'love' with the word God. So, it would begin, "God is patient, God is kind... And then to apply that to how God loves me. That's an overwhelming thought that this is how God loves me.

The second exercise was to substitute the word I in place of the word love so that it would now read, "I am patient, I am kind... That was very humbling. The point of this experiment was not to shame us or make us realize how unloving we really were, but to challenge us to become what we could be in Christ. To work with Jesus in becoming more loving as he is.

So, as we celebrate love this month, let us truly be "The road that Jesus takes...the path of love."

They strive to prepare quality choral literature, both old and new, with flexibility, stamina and dramatic flare.

The Kammerstreicher is the Wartburg College chamber orchestra. Led by Dr. Jacob Tews, who also conducts the Wartburg Community Symphony Orchestra. The group is comprised of Wartburg students who pursue a variety of majors but have in common skills on violin, viola, cello, and bass. Repertoire for Kammerstrecher concerts is best described as "eclectic." Recent performances have featured Baroque and Classical works by Bach, Corelli, and Mozart, standard string orchestra pieces by Britten and Warlock, and arrangements of songs by the Beatles and Radiohead. The group even branches into the realm of improvisation, exploring jazz and bluegrass alongside contemporary classical improvisations and aleatoric music.

FINANCIAL NEWS

2019 Year End Treasurer's Report

It has been an honor and a pleasure to serve you for the past three years as your Church Treasurer and Council Member. The Church Treasurer is responsible for general oversight of all SOTP finances including income, expenditures, signing checks, and reporting to Church Council on the overall financial condition of the church. It was also an honor to serve as the Administrator of the Fund Drive for the new Sanctuary.

Our Congregation was again faithful and generous in providing resources in 2019 for our Ministry and activities including the addition our new staff member the Director of Children & Family Ministry. The General Fund Balance was \$194,421 an increase of \$11,797 over the prior year.

Accounting Administrator Dave Shotick deserves the credit for his effort and exacting detail which made exceptional financial records possible over the past few years. He made my activity as Treasurer very straightforward and simple. Thank you Dave!
