A Note From Pastor Mark

Dear Constant Reader,

Pastors Corners As we journey through Lent under the theme "Marked with the Cross of Christ" I have been reading through the book of Psalms. This morning my devotion led me to Psalm 119. The Psalm celebrates God's word as the inspiration for life. The psalm is also a prayer to God which expresses praise and makes promises of commitment. It expresses a relationship between the psalmist and God.

One hears a yearning for God's law, a desire to meditate upon God's precepts, and to live within the beauty of the guidance and generosity of God. Verse 9 addresses the question of a young man. "How can young people keep their way pure?"

The answer lies in seeking God and living in and with the word of God.

This scripture reminds us of the relationship we have with God which hopefully has grown over years of life.

I grew up in a church which believed in challenging children to read the Bible and to memorize some of its most powerful verses.

The word of God lives in one's heart. When we were young, we were faced with making important choices in life. Which path will we travel? What crowd of kids do we follow? What values do we choose for life? Sometimes we chose the wrong crowd and suffered for it. Other times we made better choices and good things happened.

One of my childhood friends chose a good education, worked hard and eventually became an environmental engineer. Another childhood friend turned to a life of crime. Eventually he was convicted and incarcerated.

American society is littered with people who have suffered from poor life choices and a lack of a relationship with a loving God. But there are also those who have chosen well who have a relationship with the God who loves them and shows compassion.

As you look back on your life, what themes do you see? What promises did you make regarding your relationship with God? Was there ever a time of rebellion, wandering and searching? Where did your life's journey take you? How is life now? It's never too late to renew a prayer of promise and desire for a closer relationship with God's word of promise.

We'll read, listen, and wrestle. The thing we won't do is look for easy answers. Come join us!

We have been talking a lot about Discipleship here at SOTP. In his message a few weeks ago, Pastor Mark asked how we lived out our Mission Statement; "Caring for God's Children of All Ages by Growing Disciples Who make Disciples". He pointed out how we do a really bang up job of "caring for people of

all ages"; but not so such a good job of "growing disciples who make disciples".

That got me thinking about what it means to be a disciple. Jesus called 12 men to be his close, small group so that he could "disciple" them in the ways of God. But he had many other men and women who were disciples. He spent three years teaching them, helping them to become the people he needed them to be in order to continue with the Kingdom-life he had be launching while he was here on earth. The disciples needed to learn how to see things from God's perspective instead of the notions they have been taught and raised with. Those existing ideas and doctrines were good, as far as they went. But he

wanted them to see that they could be so much more! Jesus taught them to love their enemies, to love one another with a self-sacrificing love akin to his for them. To be great was to choose to be least. To be first was to choose to be last. To follow him was to take up their cross; to give up their will for God's, just as he did when he picked up his cross.

Discipleship is all about following our master Jesus and learning to live by the wisdom of his words. It's about walking together in the way of Christ, learning to die to ourselves, learning how to leave what we were and learning who we now are in him. Discipleship is a churchy work meaning how we mature in Christ, how Christ is formed in us, in our thoughts, our actions and our lives.

Discipleship isn't just about worship attendance, or Bible study, or even serving on a Ministry team; although certainly those things are very important in living out our discipleship. Discipleship is walking together in the way of Christ, learning to do things his way, to be more like Jesus and less like the world. Remember, we are to be salt and light to the world; to add the flavor or God and the light of his love to this world that is often dark and tasteless. It is growing in our faith, stretching our minds and hearts to take in more and more of Jesus so we can be more and more like him and live in his love for others.

Lent Season

Season of Lent...what an interesting time in the church year. There are many traditions that circulate around the season of lent, but these traditions are pretty similar. Some people choose not to eat a specific food like beef and chicken. Some people find something else to fast from during the season like soda, television, social media, etc. What these traditions have in common



are a form of fasting, or sacrifice, for a specific amount of time leading up to Easter. Now that we have covered what people usually do, we should really talk about why we do these things. I have two main questions that I would like to discuss and that have been the main things I have contemplated during this season. The first question is: Why do we choose something to fast from? Following that is: How

should we choose what we should fast from?

Growing up in the church, I always thought we just chose something to fast from because that's what you do, but I never really gave any thought about it. I'll be really honest, I wasn't always so great at keeping with that fast either. As I got older, I wanted to know more about why we do this. Why is this a big tradition in the Christian world? As I navigated this question, I found some really neat answers. You usually created a habit, but I created a sense of desidon't fast for the sake of fasting but for the sake of reminding. For me, I usually choose something that I enjoy, and partake in often. I do this because it provides frequent reminders when I want to use or consume the thing I chose. But what am I being reminded of? I'm being reminded of my relationship with the Lord. It is a great reminder to spend time with Him, and often.

Now this allows us to move into our next question. How should we choose what we should fast from? For example, one year I chose to fast from watching Netflix. Now if you know me, you know I love a good show to binge watch, but every time I wanted to watch Netflix, I was reminded of my fast for the lent season. With this reminder came a substitute. Instead of my desire to watch tv, I decided to replace that time by spending time with Jesus. I would pray, read my bible or even just meditate. The hope is that I would do this enough during the lent season to create a habit! A habit of actively pursuing a relationship with God. Now after the Lent season, I could still watch Netflix, but I noticed that my desires changed a bit. Don't get me wrong, I still enjoyed a good show now and then, but I noticed how much time I gave to mundane things like Netflix and how much time I really wanted to be giving to my relationship with God. I not only re. A desire to spend more time with the Lord!

So, this season, join us in the practice of being reminded! Reminded of what a gift it is to be able to spend time with Jesus. Pick something in your life that you give time to often or you desire greatly (within reason) and use it as your reminder.

Easter Lilies may be taken home after the 11am Easter Service. Lilies will need to be picked up by Tuesday, April 14th or they will be disposed of.




