

Dear Constant Reader,

Pastors Corner This Easter we again hear the story of the resurrection and this will be a year unlike any other Easter we have ever faced together. For one, we will not be together in worship corporately. We will be together using the gift and power of technology to link us together as the Body of Christ. The gift of "live streaming" is keeping us connected as God's people worshiping together.



Now we find ourselves once again preparing to hear the earth shattering news from the tomb, "he is not hear, he has arisen. We are invited again (be it in a very different atmosphere) to hear the story and be reassured that we, too, will be taken from the grave and given a new life?

This year, maybe we should be

doing more than just watching on our screens and listening with our ears into worship. Maybe this year we need to ask ourselves if we need a resurrection of the heart?

Let's use a bit of the extra time we have around the house and dig around in our hearts and throw out anything which hinders us from being better and more faithful servants?

Why not resurrect the spiritual life we once had if it has somehow gotten buried in the ashes of daily living?

In our present state we cannot be resurrected physically until we have died, but we are in the position to resurrect our dormant feelings of the good news. Isn't that a big step toward a richer life with Christ?

The world as we know it has changed drastically, although temporarily. I don't know what it will be like when you read this.

Today I was reading and studying in the Gospel lesson for this Sunday, John 9:1-14. This is a long story of a man born blind and Jesus' healing of him. But the story is much more than just a "miracle" story. Once he has been healed, the religious leaders become angry and question first the man and then his parents, wondering if



this man was truly born blind. When the man stands his ground and wonders how they miss the signs that Jesus is from God, they throw him out of the Temple. It is at this point that Jesus seeks him out and finds him, and reveals that he is the "Son of Man", Yahweh come to his people. I couldn't help but think of parable Jesus told of the shepherd who leaves the 99 to seek out the lost and alone sheep.

When we look at this story, we often concentrate on the healing of the man's blindness, the miracle. But in the Gospel of John, the things that Jesus does are called signs; actions that point to something beyond the action; to a greater truth that Jesus often talks about and explains after the sign has been accomplished.

Even before he sees Jesus, the man born blind *hears* him. After he makes the mud, Jesus speaks to the man born blind and tells him to go and wash in the pool of Siloam. The man *hears* him, responds to Jesus' voice, and goes and washes and sees.

The man healed by Jesus comes gradually through this story to know Jesus, and Jesus knows him and he becomes a part of the fold, a disciple. He goes from hearing and seeing a man called Jesus, to calling Jesus a prophet, to recognizing that he must be from God, to calling him Lord and worshipping him. The words of Jesus that follow this story in 10:1-21, are all about Jesus' sheep; about how he knows them and they *hear his voice* and know him, and follow him. The former blind man has become one of Jesus' own, his flock, one who hears his voice and follows him. This seeing, hearing, knowing and following denoted relationship with Jesus, the Father and the Spirit. Jesus is the Good Shepherd, the one who knows us, calls us, cares for us and we know his voice and follow him.

In these trying days and the ones ahead, we can take refuge in knowing that our Shepherd know us, calls us, cares for us and that we know his voice and follow him. While these are unsettling times, I am seeing firsthand how this part of Jesus' flock at Shepherd of the Prairie is caring for one another, is being Jesus to each other. Members are calling, emailing, sending cards and texting with encouragement; checking in on one another, running errands, keeping in touch. Our leadership is providing worship, social media messages, praying every morning at 7 and email messages from Pastor Mark and staff members.

I pray that you will always know how much you are beloved by our God and by your SOTP family. I hope you find ways to keep in touch with family, friends, neighbors, and of course your SOTP family. FINDING CURRENT INFO ON SOTP WEBSITE

Recently a few of our members have complained about not finding new content on our website www.sotp.org. For instance, Pastor Bill's new Adult Education Video or the latest Sunday Worship bulletin.

Sometimes when a website is updated, the changes are not seen right away because the browser is still using an older version of the page which the browser can load faster.

If you go to our website and you don't see the new content that you're looking for, the solution is to do a HARD REFRESH on your browser. A hard refresh clears the browser's cache for a specific page, forcing it to load the most recent version that includes changes to the page.

Now, how do you do a hard refresh on your browser (Google Chrome, Firefox and Internet Explorer/Microsoft Edge)? Simple—

> make sure you are viewing the website and



(2) hold down Ctrl and then press F5 on your keyboard.

The browser now will be displaying the page with all the latest changes.

BUSINESS OPERATIONS AND COMMUNICATION


We reviewed and streamlined several processes to ensure continuation, of all Accounting and business operations, including electronic approval and payment, of invoices and check requests, payroll processing and continued accurate financial recordkeeping and reporting for the Finance team and Council.

To facilitate communications, Pastor Mark now conducts two weekly staff meetings, using Zoom, in which all staff members can participate. SOTP is carrying on the same and additional activities while staff are working off-site and we're doing so in a safe, healthy manner.

AUDIO/VISUAL

Mike Yndestad, our A/V Coordinator and his A/V Ministry Team, have been expanding SOTP's live streaming capabilities to enhance the on-line worship service experience for members. Mike explained, "In this new environment, we have a greater need for virtual communications.





The A/V ministry is focused on helping SOTP communicate as effectively as possible with the present circumstances." Collaborating, with Pastor Mark, Dennis Lilla, Jane McMullen and other staff members, Mike has produced videos that can be posted to

SOTP's website and Facebook page. Using video conferencing services, such as Zoom, Mike's excellent production and editing skills, have enhanced presentations, with additional graphics and music, all of which helped to achieve very polished, professional presentations.

Adding, to SOTP's use of video conferencing capabilities, Mike, Dennis and Daryl are, in the process, of defining ways, of establishing an electronic library, of ongoing Boxcast, Vimeo and Facebook videos. Some of the videos, for example, Pastor Bill Waxenberg's recording, of a Bible Study teaching video, will remain available on-line for future use. Designated or seasonal worship services will also be archived and kept in the library.

CHILDREN AND FAMILY MINISTRY

Tessa DeLong, in Children & Family Ministry, is working creatively to minister, to families and young children, in our congregation. Recently, Tessa and the Sunday School team changed the name, of Sunday School, to "Sunday's Cool." They are providing weekly lessons along,

with encouraging, greeting videos, from teachers, so children and their families can still see their teacher's faces. These materials are being sent out, as well as, offered, on SOTP's website, for easy access, by congregation and



community members. Tessa explained, "We are also looking, into creative ways, to interact, with our families, by providing challenges that families can participate in together. One of the challenges was writing a letter to those who cannot interact with people face-to-face at this time.



Another challenge we have provided is a make a meal challenge where we encourage families to learn a new skill and make a meal together. Families are then encouraged to send in a picture of them participating in their challenges. We will continue to do this and encourage our families to interact in fun ways as they stay at home!"

Tessa and her Sunday School and Children and Family Ministry teams have continued to meet virtually to identify additional ways to connect with SOTP families and children. Activities involve being, in constant communication, joining in on virtual birthday parties and more. Tessa explained, "It has and continues to be, a fun time, of feeling closer, than ever even though we are not together. We are still continuing to love and care for each other like Jesus, during this time, and we are continuing to find more creative ways to interact."

CONNECTIONS MINISTRY

Donna Kelly and the Connections Ministry Team have been busy concentrating on keeping in touch, with members, of SOTP, to help keep our feeling of community and bonding, in a common goal, continuing. Donna explained, "It has been a challenge to find ways to keep in touch and to remain in Communication, Collaboration, Caring and Community. We have had to think outside the box. While it is very hard to not see all of you in person, this situation has pushed me to find new ways to share the love of God with you. One of those ways is to learn how to set up groups in Messenger, Group Facetime and to continue to use ZOOM." Donna's Errand and other Team members have been making wellness check phone calls to check how members

are feeling and/or if they need assistance, with errands, as are allowed under Shelter in Place guidelines.

Additionally, Donna also explained how "Barnabas Caregiving Ministry has been busy contacting all of our shut ins by phone. Some who are in care facilities do not have access to a phone, so all of our shut ins are receiving cards from Barnabas Ministry. We are also contacting those who have experienced a death in their families. Our Caring Caller and Caring Card



Teams continue to express care to those who are ill or have experienced a death of a loved one. Our Life Groups are continuing to stay in contact with each other during this time via phone calls and emails and/or texts."

As you can see, Donna and the Connections Ministry Team have been extremely busy. Treasurer's Report as of February 29, 2020

Operating Income and Expenses for the month are within the 2020 Budget. Total expenses were \$4,427 under the budgeted amount leaving a positive balance of \$15,885.

<u>General Fund Report</u> The General Fund Balance is \$210,538. Income for the month was \$51,699 and Expenses for the month were \$60,328. For the month our expenses were \$2,697 under the budget.

<u>Mortgage Service Fund Report</u> The Mortgage Service Fund Balance is \$101,487. Income for the month was \$26,138. The monthly mortgage payment is \$19,536.
