# A Note From Pastor Mark

Dear Members & Friends,

In thinking about life and all that is going on in your life that is different these days, perhaps vou've had some doubts as to what God is up to in your life? Does God really care about me and my daily life?

Pastors Corner Before you can believe anything, you must seek to find out about it. And to find out about God, the best place to go is to the Bible. Here much is written about what God does, what God says, and what God asks in return for breathing life into us. The more one reads and cross-references Scripture, the more one sees truth and consistency in God's words, deeds, and plans.

Some Scripture, perhaps, will be difficult to comprehend. Many written Bible resources as well as computer resources can offer suggestions at meaning.

A small Bible Study group gives us the opportunity to pick each others' brains for getting perspective on application and meaning. During these days of social distancing I encourage you to participate in one of our online Life Groups which continue meeting. Or maybe God is calling you to invite 3, 4 or 5 or 6 friends to join you in creating a new group.

God, even now, is calling us to be together in worship. There is nothing like truly being with one another in worship but please continue to join us via our live stream on Sunday mornings. In worship we are exposed to God in music, in Bible reading, in prayer, and in God's word proclaimed. As you listen to God's voice in the Bible, you may be able to see God more clearly in your own life.

A look at nature may show you happenings that only God could create and cause. There are occasions that, even in nature, show a rebellion to God's way. But, I am always so amazed, how in nature God can bring a sense of peace and calm to our being.

A look at events in your life, that some people call coincidences, may begin to show you where God is interacting. They become God incidences where in spite of our trying to lock God out, God makes a way and breaks into our life.

Praving to God for enlightenment and understanding God's truths will deepen your search.

As your understanding grows, so will your belief and knowledge of God grow.

This growth leads to trust, faith, and insight into God's workings in your daily life.

This is what walking in God's path and doing things God's way means to me.

So as we continue to move through these days I encourage to come up with your own personal plan for reading the Bible? How can you apply the words and truths in the Bible to your own life?


Consider finding someone in your life who holds you accountable for integrity?

You know, I think Thomas the disciple gets a bad rap. On the first Easter evening, Jesus comes to be with his disciples and Thomas isn't present. After Jesus has gone, and Thomas comes back to that locked room, the other excitedly tell Thomas about Jesus' visit. He's a bit skeptical and says he needs to see



Jesus' hands and feet to believe. The next week Jesus comes again to where the disciples are hiding and invites Thomas to look, touch ... and believe.

Thomas is known as "Doubting Thomas", but in another place in John's Gospel he could be called "Courageous Thomas" (Jon 11:16) as he is the one who tells the disciples that they might as well go to Jerusalem with Jesus and die. No doubt there!

Thomas was missing when Jesus came to the disciples that first Easter evening. When Jesus appeared, he offered them his peace. They must have been scared to death when he showed up behind locked doors. But not only did Jesus offer them peace, he showed them his hand and his side; then they believed it was him. They had to see it for themselves. They had to be sure that this One standing in front of them was the same One that had been with them for three years and had died on the cross.

Jesus had to convince them of who he was. They certainly hadn't believed Mary when she said she had seen Jesus. And even she didn't believe until Jesus appeared to her directly and called her by name. Thomas only asked to see what the others had already seen; Jesus' hands and side.

And for us, matters of faith can be just as difficult to believe. When trouble hits, our loved one dies, our job is lost, a natural disaster strikes or a virus shuts down the world, we too can be afraid and lock the doors of our hearts. We too can wonder if this story of Jesus is real, or is it just something someone made up? After all, in our world if something seems too good to be true, it usually is. We can ask where God is; if he loves us so much why do all of these terrible things happen? Where is God in all of this?

When these thoughts go rocking through my brain, I try to hear Jesus' words, "Peace be with you". I ask the Spirit to calm me, to remind me of *(Continued on page 5)*

#### FROM YOUR STEWARDSHIP TEAM

To our fellow members and friends of SOTP:

We have experienced unusual times with this COVID 19 pandemic affecting all of us. No one is insulated from the norms that once shaped our lives. I'm reminded of Pastor Mark's song that he sang in a video message....TRUST & OBEY. A few of those phrases ring loud and true to us today: (1)Trust and obey, for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey. (2)Not a doubt or a fear, not a sigh or a tear, can abide while we trust and obey. (3) While we do His good will, He abides with us still, and with all who will trust and obey.

One thing is TRUE, that we can trust on today and every day..... God stands with each of us, 24/7, in our times of struggle, and in our times of need, in our joys and in our sorrows. This pandemic has brought loss of work to some, fears of becoming ill, death to some, isolation from our neighbors and friends, church services streamed on-line instead of physical worship in our sanctuaries. But in small ways, we extend the hand of hope to those less fortunate...the hungry....the homeless, the imprisoned, through our church donations. By this means we fulfill Jesus' Great Commandment...LOVING OTHERS AS I HAVE LOVED YOU.

Our own church is not immune to the financial problems brought by this pandemic. We have our pastor and staff to support, a monthly mortgage service that supports our new sanctuary, utility costs, our donations that support our local community needs and our benevolence to the ELCA Synod ministry and mission programs that extend our outreach.

We know that everyone may not be able to give as they have budgeted because of furloughed or loss of employment. We do understand. But for those who are in a more stable financial condition, we do implore you to continue mailing your checks in your offering envelopes to our church office or go to SOTP.org to our donate online site, or directly type into your browser https://bit.ly/ SOTPgiving. You can also use the GivePlus+ smartphone app that will take credit card, debit card, or bank funded donations (instructions for these on the SOTP.org website). We encourage you to check the box when giving online to include payment of our processing fee to Vanco for these transactions which maximizes the total value of your donation to the church. You will receive an email confirmation of your donations which will also be reflected in your guarterly donation statements. Also consider our Simply Giving program that sets up direct electronic payments from your bank account to SOTP's bank account on a reoccurring basis that can be changed at any time.

We also ask for those who are more financially blessed to consider donating their \$1200 or \$2400 government CARE ACT checks they may receive. And if you can advance pay against your 2020 Estimate of Giving pledges, it would be helpful in meeting our budgetary needs going forward.

We pray that you remain healthy, safe from all dangers and harm, and continue to not only financially support your church, but extend Christ's hand of love to your neighbor. Your action in response to our request, combined with others, WILL HELP MAKE A DIFFERENCE.

## FINDING CURRENT INFO ON SOTP WEBSITE


Recently a few of our members have complained about not finding new content on our website www.sotp.org. For instance, Pastor Bill's new Adult Education Video or the latest Sunday Worship bulletin.

Sometimes when a website is updated, the changes are not seen right away because the browser is still using an older version of the page which the browser can load faster.

If you go to our website and you don't see the new content that you're looking for, the solution is to do a HARD REFRESH on your browser. A hard refresh clears the browser's cache for a specific page, forcing it to load the most recent version that includes changes to the page.

Now, how do you do a hard refresh on your browser (Google Chrome, Firefox and Internet Explorer/Microsoft Edge)? Simple—

- (1) make sure you are viewing the website and
- (2) hold down Ctrl and then press F5 on your keyboard.



The browser now will be displaying the page with all the latest changes.

We look forward to "seeing" you on-line as we go through these times of social distancing.

#### **CONNECTIONS MINISTRY**

First of all, I want to thank all of those who have stepped up to help with our ministry here at SOTP during this difficult time. So many of you are sharing Jesus' love with your family, friends, neighbors and even strangers. I believe we will come out of this time stronger than ever, more connected with our God, our families, our friends and neighbors.

During our Shelter in Place time your Connections Ministry has been busy concentrating on keeping in touch with members of SOTP to help keep our feeling of community and bonding in a common goal continuing. It has been a challenge to find ways to keep in touch and to remain in Communication, Collaboration, Caring and Community. We have had to think outside the box. While it is very hard to not see all of you in person, this situation has pushed me to find new ways to share the love of God with you. One of those ways is to learn how to set up groups in Messenger, Group Facetime and to continue to use ZOOM.

In an effort to keep in touch with each of you in some way, we have set up a team of members who have volunteered to make phone calls to other members. We currently have 20 people who have volunteered to make phone calls. Calls are made to make sure you are doing well, feeling healthy and to see if you need anything. Callers are making calls to their people at least once a week. Hopefully, more people will volunteer to make calls and we can contact even more of our members. I stay in touch with this team at least once a week to encourage them.

**OUR ERRANDS TEAM**, volunteers who will run errands and deliver needed items to those who can't or shouldn't go out, stands ready to serve. So, if you need someone to pick up groceries or prescriptions or anything else, please let us know.

**OUR BARNABAS CAREGIVING MINISTRY** continues to be busy contacting all of our shut ins by phone. Some who are in care facilities do not have access to a phone, so all of our shut ins are receiving cards two or three times a month from Barnabas Ministry. Our Caring Caller and Caring Card Teams continue to express care to those who are ill or have experienced a death of a loved one.

**Our LIFE GROUPS** are continuing to stay in contact with each other during this time via phone calls and emails and/or texts. We now have 4 groups meeting on line and two new ones are forming. This is a great time to start and on-line group that can continue to meet in person once we are able to do so. If you would like to start a group, please contact me and I will help you with the process.

We also passed on information from **GRAFTON FOOD PANTRY** about how to support them with donations during this time and how people can pick up groceries when in need.

We work to plan our ministries, to see how we can help each other, to pray together, to plan worship, to share ideas, concerns and inspire each other. We are also meeting one on one to talk, encourage, lift up and pray together.



During this Coronavirus period, good stewardship continues to be practiced, what a generous congregation. Operating Income and Expenses for the month are within the 2020 Budget. Total expenses were \$4,712 under the budgeted amount leaving a positive balance of \$10,545.

<u>**General Fund Report**</u> The General Fund Balance is \$215,503. Income for the month was \$68,973 and Expenses for the month were \$59,208. For the month our expenses were \$4,712 under the budget.

**Mortgage Service Fund Report** The Mortgage Service Fund Balance is \$100,857. Income for the month was \$17,105. The monthly mortgage payment is \$19,536.
