A Note From Pastor Mark

Pastor's
Corner

Members and Friends,

"The harvest is great, but workers are few."

Luke 10:11-22

The text is familiar to us. We've read about Jesus' evangelism method of sending out seventy disciples, two by two, ahead of himself. We've read his directions to them—"Go, the harvest is great, but the workers are few."

He further told them that it would be a dangerous assignment; that they should put their entire focus on it; that they should deliver their message of good news but not remain to try to convince those whose hearts were not open to receive the message; they should not be waylaid by desire for the material things of the world but accept only what is due them.

Have we read this text and considered it as only something that happened then?

Have we marveled at Jesus' method for spreading the message of good news in preparation for his personally coming to transform peoples' lives? Yet, has the text been seen as an event rather than as a command for us today?

In the early days of Shepherd of the Prairie many of us would go out on a Sunday afternoon and canvass neighborhoods in Huntley, surveying the residents as to whether they had a church home and inviting them to ours.

Is this what Jesus meant in this text? Why or why not? Are the fields around us "white unto harvest"?

Think of your neighborhood. Perhaps because many of us have a circle of friends who share our faith, we forget about the person who moved in across the street, or next door.

What if we should take to heart that Luke brought us Jesus' directions to the seventy in such detail because they were to be directions for believers throughout history? What if it were the focus of our lives to share the good news we have in Jesus?

Remember, the seventy went ahead of Jesus. They didn't bring an invitation to an organization or a program. They brought Jesus. Boy, is this brave new world in which we live today different than it was 2,000 years ago and yet it is still "ripe unto the harvest."

We find ourselves today with whole new set of tools given us to share Jesus with another. We can point people to Jesus through SOTP.





Ministry Musings

My friend Chris sent me an email this past week that touched me very deeply. I'm not usually much on poetry, or "pass it on" and "touchy" emails or Facebook posts. But something drew me to open up the attachment she included. Maybe it was that it was titled, "Amazing Grace". I have always loved that song and I even sang it as a lullaby to my grandchildren when they were babies.



For whatever reason, I opened it. And what I found knocked my socks off! I was blessed with not just a beautiful rendition of the song, but my eyes were opened to see the Church and the Kingdom of God in a renewed and overwhelming way! Just a week ago Mike filmed me in a Ministry Moment where I talked about the Church being more than just the building or SOTP, but that the church is the church only because of God's people.

We (at least it's true for me) here in the United States, tend to see us as the Church. We often think of God and Jesus looking like us, talking like us, and being on our side. We often think no further than our own borders when it comes to the church. Oh, we know there are missionaries going to other lands and we support them; we visit the beautiful cathedrals in Europe and admire their grandeur; we enjoy seeing missionaries who come to visit and share the culture of the countries they are in. We may even support children in Africa or other countries that are in need, and we know that other countries have Christian churches. But if we are honest, you and I often think of the United States as being the leader in Christianity. For myself, even though I know that Christ is loved in other places, I really only think of Christianity here in the United States.

But watching this video of 50 different countries singing Amazing Grace in their own languages, and then all together in chorus was not only a moment of beauty, but a moment of humbling awareness. I remembered that the United States is not only the Church; God does not only look just like me; God does not only speak and listen in English. God is in every space in every country in the world; God is black and brown and white and all shades in between; God speaks Russian, and Danish, and Mandarin, and Swahili, and Farsi and Spanish and every other language under the sun just as fluently as God speaks English.

I realized anew that each person singing in that video was my brother and sister in Christ. It's been a long time since that awareness was so intense for me. I remembered a time, many years ago, when my husband and I were at a board meeting that included representatives from many other countries. We spoke different languages, but did

have English in common. When our meeting was over, we prayed the Lord's Prayer together in our own languages. I remember being awestruck by the feeling of unity and family in that circle, all speaking in different languages to our God together. It was like having a glimpse into heaven; at that moment we were one in our Lord and God's realm and ours had intersected. But, over time I had lost that awareness. This video has brought that understanding to me again and I rejoiced with my brothers and sisters as we praised our God together.

This year, after much thought, Barb Hoppensteadt has decided to have “only gift cards” for the The Giving Tree this Christmas. Because of the virus and not knowing what will happen during the holiday season, she felt this was the safest way. Harriett Ford, Grafton Food Pantry, already called in June to see if SOTP was going to have the Giving Tree. Barb told Harriet her idea of gift cards and she is very in favor of the gift card idea. Barb then called Lynn Broederdorf, Turning Point -Woodstock, and she also was in favor of giving gift cards.

As of now, this is the plan for The Giving Tree 2020:

For the most part, it will be handled just like the ornaments. Barb will get the list of families from both agencies and instead of making out an ornament, she will make out an envelope marking it:

- with either “G” for Grafton, “TP” for Turning Point
- the family number
- male, female or child/infant
- age
- which gift card they would like to have



This will be done for each family. The envelopes will be placed on the table outside the church offices, there will be a box for dropping off the envelope. The gift card is to be placed inside the envelope and sealed. **Noting that you must use the envelope that you picked.** A return date will be posted.

CONNECTIONS MINISTRY

Again, I want to thank all of those who are continuing to help with our ministry here at SOTP during this difficult time.

As I have said before, so many of you are sharing Jesus' love with your family, friends, neighbors and even strangers. We have many new people who are worshipping with us on Sundays via our live stream and I have had inquiries about joining Life Groups, the Grief Journey Group and joining SOTP.

The Connections Ministry continues to concentrate on keeping in touch with members of SOTP. It has been a challenge to find ways to keep in touch. Our Callers are continuing to check in to make sure we are doing well, feeling healthy and to see if you need anything. We also have a team of people ready to run errands, so, if you need someone to pick up groceries or prescriptions or anything else, please let us know. The button Brigade has made and delivered over 7000 mask extenders to health agencies all over Northern IL.



The Barnabas Caregiving Ministry keeps busy contacting all of our shut ins by phone and all of our shut ins are receiving cards two or three times a month from Barnabas Ministry. Our Caring Caller and Caring Card Teams continue to express care to those who are ill or have experienced a death of a loved one.

Our Life Groups are continuing to stay in contact with each other during this time via ZOOM, phone calls and emails and/or texts and some are now meeting in person. If you would like to join a group or start one, please contact me and I will help you with the process.

Our prayer ministry is active in caring for one another. One of the advantages of our new platform for prayer requests is that once we receive a prayer request from a member, we can reply back to that person directly to express our care and concern, share a word of hope and to pray directly with them. Please keep your prayer requests coming so we can all share in prayer with you. If you have a prayer request, send it as an email to: sotp-prayer-chain@gaggle.email and it will be disbursed directly to the prayer chain.

The ministries of SOTP go on with our Ministry Teams meeting mouthy and more often in some cases. The leaders meet via ZOOM on Ministry night and the teams meet individually after that. Many

OFFERING ENVELOPE INFORMATION

Thank you for being diligent using offering envelopes. Here are some things the counting committee would like you to know.

- 1) Please don't tape the envelope shut.
- 2) If you get behind and want to catch up, only use one envelope.
- 3) Referring to #2, you only need to write one check.
- 4) If you are applying funds to more than the General Fund, note it on the envelope and/or check. If left blank, all will go to General Fund.
- 5) If you put a loose check in offering instead of using your envelope, it takes the counter at least 5 times longer to process it to your envelope number.
- 6) The bank will not accept 3rd party checks.

PRAYER CHAIN


HOW TO SEND A PRAYER REQUEST TO THE PRAYER CHAIN

We have contracted with a service that automatically forwards your prayer request to the members of our prayer chain. We did this so that requests would go out immediately and there is no need to wait for someone to see your request before it goes out.

You need no special equipment or program to do this. It is just like sending any other email.

All you need to do is:

- ⇒ address the email to **sotp-prayer-chain@gaggle.email** (you can even create a contact in your email address book for Prayer Chain with this email address to make it easier)
 - ⇒ in the subject write prayer request
 - ⇒ in the body write your prayer request
 - ⇒ add your name at the bottom
 - ⇒ hit send like you would with any other email you would send
 - ⇒ just as when you send any other email, you won't get a copy of it

Children do not need to be potty trained.



Assets include \$95,000 from the SBA Paycheck Protection Program received on April 24, 2020. These funds are expected to be forgiven at end of the program. This does not affect the year to date Operating Fund.

General Fund Report The General Fund Balance is \$346,837. Income for the month was \$54,570 and Expenses for the month were \$58,666.

Mortgage Service Fund Report The Mortgage Service Fund Balance is \$106,963. Income for the month was \$19,321. The monthly mortgage payment is \$19,536.
