A Note From Pastor Mark

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

It is with great joy that we welcome you back to public worship at Shepherd of the Prairie on Sunday, September 6. For the months of September and October we will continue our every other week Saturday parking lot worship. Those dates being Saturday, September 12 and 26 and October 10 and 24.

Pastor's Corner This has been a long time coming and we are so thankful that we can now reenter the building and around the altar of God to receive the gifts of God's grace. I also want to publicly thank all those who have helped to create an online presence for our church related to worship. God has richly blessed us with wonderfully gifted people and want to assure you that we will continue to enhance what we do with our online ministry going forward.

With these thoughts in mind I want to share with you some things to be mindful of should you choose to resume worshiping with us publicly at this time.

Of course, if you or anyone in your household are exhibiting any symptoms of COVID-19 (shortness of breath, fever, cough, new loss of taste or smell) you must not attend. Also, people with compromised health issues/preexisting conditions which may put you at higher risk may choose to stay home. We will continue to live-stream the Sunday morning worship services.

We have been carefully preparing new procedures with the guidance of the ELCA, the Northern IL Synod, and the state to ensure the safety of all of our parishioners. With that being said, there is always some risk involved when attending public functions. You will notice some changes as you return to SOTP, and we ask you respectfully follow those changes while here. Below are the new procedures and protocols you will see.

Please read them completely and carefully. (You will also find a copy of these procedures on our church website.)

During our initial opening we will be able to accommodate 70 people per service. Initially, we will begin small to be sure we are caring faithfully and well for all who are with us. This will also give us some room in case we have first time worshipers or guests.

Entry, Arrival and Seating for Worship

- Worshippers attending the 9:00 am service enter through the East doors of the new building. Worshippers at 10:45 am service enter through the South side doors of the new building. All other doors will remain locked.
- Please arrive no earlier than 20 minutes prior to the start of worship, and put on your face mask as you exit your vehicle. You will keep your mask on the entire time until you return to your vehicle, with the exception of receiving Holy Communion.
- You will be welcomed by a greeter.
- Please maintain six-foot social distancing at all times with people not from your own household, and use the provided hand sanitizer before entering the sanctuary.
- When it is time to enter the sanctuary, an usher will show you to your seat. We will begin seating from the front of the church moving to the back. (it is a very unLutheran thing but know you probably will not be seated in your "normal" pew. Thank you for your understanding.
- Please do not congregate in the Sanctuary prior to worship. We encourage you to use the time for personal prayer and meditation.
- Every other pew will be closed, and the available pews will have markers every six feet to assist you. Household members, of course, do not have to observe that distancing with one another in the pew.

Temporary Changes for Weekend Worship

- The "sign of peace" will be limited to non-contact gestures.
- We will not pass collection baskets. They will be located at the doors as you exit the building.
- Singing will be limited in order to minimize the spread of germs. As song leaders sing you are invited to mouth the words quietly or speak the words in your heart.
- Initially we will receive Holy Communion using only one element. The usher will dismiss you from the pew for communion. Please maintain proper social distancing in the Communion line with people outside of your household.
- For now we can only give Communion by you extending your hand open into which the wafer of bread will be placed. We ask you to consume the wafer after you return to the pew.

- Also note that we ask you not wear any gloves when you receive Communion.
- At the end of service please wait for an usher to dismiss you.
- Please do not congregate in the sanctuary or welcome center following worship. Our cleaning team needs to be able to as quickly as possible be sure all areas of use are sanitized. If you do wish to speak to others please do so outside on the parking lot and continue social distancing.
- All hymnals, Bibles and attendance pads have been temporarily removed due to the virus remaining on surfaces for a period of time after being touched.
- Pastor Mark will do his best to be out on the parking lot before and after worship.
- Please exit from the same door you entered.

Sanitation and Safety Precautions

- Only the restrooms in the new building will be opened. Children under the age of 10 must be accompanied by a parent to make sure they properly wash their hands.
- Please do not bring any sanitizing supplies or wipes with you that contain bleach, as they will damage the wood of the pews and other items.
- Parents, please note We will not be able to open the nursery. All children should remain with their families while in the building. We will be blessed by their voices in the worship.s

We know these changes will take some time to get used to, and will require adjustments and flexibility from all of us. And we understand that some people may prefer to continue worshipping at home due to the new procedures and protocols, and that is okay too. I hope you know that we are being very conscious of your safety in the midst of this pandemic. Our hope is that many of these changes will no longer be necessary when we move into the State's fifth and final phase for reopening.

In the meantime, we deeply appreciate your patience and cooperation as we all try to do our part to keep everyone safe and healthy in worship at SOTP. We can't wait to see you and celebrate with you in person!

Please be assured of our continued prayers for you and your loved ones. Let us all continue to redouble our efforts in prayer for this pandemic coming to a speedy end and that we all continue to remain safe!

Change. For some change is a "dirty" word. "We've never done it that way", "if it isn't broken, don't fix it", "we've always done this way", "don't rock the boat", are clichés we often hear. The idea of stepping out and venturing into new ideas and territory can be challenging. But with all that's going on in our world, change is inevitable.

Covid-19 has brought a whole new way of life to our world and forced us to make changes. Many continue to work from home, shoppers in stores need to stand in line to enter and wear masks and stores ask us to use a credit or debit card instead of cash. If we go to a restaurant, we need to wear masks until we are at our tables, menus are limited, even at the drive through and some places no longer accept cash. Schools are starting with either some form of hybrid learning (some in person and some on line) or all eLearning. At church, we worship in the parking lot or on line, many of our ministries are revised in how we do them, and even when we do come back to public worship it will look very different.

We also are trying to find our way through a new awareness of racial and social injustice. We look for ways to treat each other with honesty and acceptance for who we each are. If we are honest, we realize we all have biases; racial bias, ethnic bias, gender bias, economic bias, social bias, educational bias, religious bias, political bias... It's basically impossible to be human and not have some type of bias. We may need to change how we see those around us, be willing to acknowledge our biases and figure out how to live together in harmony.

We have a presidential election coming up soon and that too will bring change no matter who "wins".

An ancient Greek philosopher, Heraclitus (I looked it up), said, "Change is the only constant in life." And right now, our lives bear that out.

Many dream of "the good old days" and "the way things used to be". "If it was good enough for us then, it ought to be good enough for us now." Change is very difficult for many and we often remember the pleasant parts of the past and think of them fondly. We long for the day we can be back to "normal" and back together.

For others, change is a not only a good thing, it's the best thing. For them the old ways don't matter anymore, and the only thing that is worthwhile is what's new. They look back at "what used to be" and see only the bad that existed during that time.

Wherever you find yourself with the idea of change, back to normal will most likely look different than it did before this pandemic. Some changes will be difficult and some changes will be good. But whatever changes come our way in this world, we can take hold of what we are told in James 1: 17, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming from the Father who does not change like shifting shadows."
