Corner

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

God says the righteous shall live by faith (Romans 1:9). For Martin Luther, this was an earth-shattering moment when he discovered what that little bit of God's Word meant for his daily life.

What does that mean for us? I took a trip to the dictionary to find the definition of "live." There were many examples but mainly it means to have life, be capable of vital functions, to remain alive, to continue in existence, operation, memory. To dwell or reside to regulate one's life, to pass life in a specified manner.

As a believer, all the above are to be lived with an eye toward God, trusting in God to supply all we need.

Jesus encourages us to look beyond the visible. To have faith is to trust in the supernatural power and resources of our God who loves and cares for us. No matter what is happening in our life we need to look beyond the circumstances, the drawbacks, the hindrances, and trust and believe God knows and cares about us.

Without faith we would become overwhelmed by what is occurring in the world today: illness, crime, issues of race, terrorism, evil in every shape and form. We could be filled with fear over the possibilities of what might happen to our family and us.

But as believers, we know our future and the future of the world and its inhabitants is not up to chance, but is in the control and supervision of God. And yes, it does take faith to hold fast.

There are many wonderful things happening today to counteract the evil. Thousands of people are coming to a saving faith in Christ; people in bondage to drugs and alcohol are being set free to live healthy lives. Bible study and Christ-based programs in churches are helping people become whole. Shepherd of the Prairie is increasing its foot print in delivering online services during this pandemic. Thousands are being fed through our local Grafton food pantry in part due to the efforts of so many who are giving generously to support this ministry.

We are also reminded in Luke that we have duties and responsibilities to God. We have a duty to indeed "take up a cross and follow." As believers we are God's servants and as such need to do whatever is set before us without grumbling or expecting praise and recognition.

"Corrie!" she said excitedly. "he's given us the answer! Before we asked, as He always does! In the Bible this morning. Where was it? Read that part again!"

"Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus—"

"That's it Corrie! That's His answer. 'Give thanks in all circumstances!' That's what we do. We can start right now to that God for every single thing about this new barracks."

"Such as?" I said.

"Such as being assigned here together."

I bit my lip. "Oh yes Lord Jesus!"

"Such as what you are holding in your hands."

I looked down at the Bible. "Yes! Thank you, dear Lord, that there was no inspection when we entered here! Thank you for all the women here in this room, who will meet You in these pages."

"Yes," said Betsie. "Thank you for the very crowding here. Since we're packed so close, that many more will hear!" She looked at me expectantly. "Corrie!" she prodded.

"Oh, all right. Thank you for the jammed, crammed, stuffed, packed, suffocating crowds."

"Thank you." Betsie went on serenely, "for the fleas and for—"

The fleas, this is too much. "Betsie, there's no way even God can make me grateful for a flea."

"Give thanks in all circumstances," she quoted. "It doesn't say, 'in pleasant circumstances.' Fleas are part of this place where God has put us." — The Hiding Place, pages 209-210

The fleas in Corrie and Betsie's barracks were an annoyance, but the fleas served a purpose; to protect the women in the barracks. The guards knew about the fleas, and stayed away. Because of the fleas the women were protected from abuse and harassment. Corrie and Betsie were free to hold Bible studies without worry about the guards interfering and many of those women came to know Jesus.

We may not have actual fleas around, but we all have "fleas" in our lives that pester us. That pesky neighbor, or family member that annoys every time we are near. The pain that persists, or the habit we just can't seem to break. Right now, Covid is a huge "flea" disrupting our lives! But Paul reminds us in Romans 8:28, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to God's purpose".

God doesn't promise that all things will be good, or that all things will turn out the way we want; but that God will work for good in all things. That's something we can hold onto in our lives always and give thanks to our God for God's love, grace and mercy.

Assets include \$95,000 from the SBA Paycheck Protection Program received on April 24, 2020. These funds are expected to be forgiven at the end of the program. This does not affect the year to date Operating Fund.

General Fund Report The General Fund Balance is \$207,638. Income for the month was \$53,626 and Expenses for the month were \$77,476.

Mortgage Service Fund Report The Mortgage Service Fund Balance is \$122,019. Income for the month was \$17,110. The monthly mortgage payment is \$19,536.
