A Note From Pastor Mark

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

We are coming up on one year since our wandering journey began separated from one another due to COVID-19. I remember so well making the call to stop public and worship and then scrambling to be sure everything was in place to begin fully live stream worship.

Pastors Corners Now Spring is upon us once again and we are finally back to public worship along with live stream worship.

I've begun thinking about warmer days ahead and the wonder of the One who awakens from sleep the beauty of creation. Our faith



calls us to delight in the one who will wake up the sleeping seeds and bulbs, the one who will cause the life blood of the dormant trees to birth new buds, blossoms, and leaves.

God is the one who will cause the earth and moon to align their positions, the wind to change the flow of cool and warm breezes, the seasonal

I am reading a wonderful book by Brian McLaren entitled, "faith after doubt". The book reminds us that doubt can serve a great purpose if it pushes us to think and explore Who God is and where God fits and works in our lives. I have found that to be true in my life. The dry desert times and the times of



doubt urge me on to search and explore the depths of God and God's love for me.

We all go through times of spiritual drought, at least I do. Times when my faith walk seems monotonous and slow; when God's and my relationship seems to be dry and tiresome; when I wonder if I can ever do enough, be enough, try enough; when the words of scripture seem to just lie on the page and my prayers seem old, dry, rote; when I feel far from God and even wonder if God really exists at all!

But on Ash Wednesday, Pastor Mark reminded us that we can't do enough, be enough, try enough. We don't have the resources to pay the bill that's due. I can never make the payment; I can never measure up. But he also told us the good news is that in Jesus, the bill is marked "PAID IN FULL". Then over the last several Wednesdays he has reminded over and over how much we are loved by God. "God so loved the world that God gave..." There is no limit to God's MAJESTIC love. God's love is boundless, unconditional, allencompassing, steadfast, never wavering, forever ours! And more good news, it is for everyone; the every Sunday church-going Christian and their neighbor who is cranky, mean and grouchy and who hasn't been in a church for years! For the poor and the rich; the giver and the receiver; the jailer and the prisoner; those who live on the streets and those who live in mansions, the haves and the havenots. NONE of us measures up, but thanks be to God NONE of us has to, because God took care of that with God's love in Jesus.

These were words I needed to be reminded of, and still do over and over. When those doubts and wonderings come, I remind myself of all of the times God has made Godself known in my life; all the times God has reminded me of God's love. And as I recall all of those moments and remember the words, "God so loved that God gave..." I once again stand in the shower of God's love and I know Jesus' presence and reality with every fiber of my being! Thanks be to God!

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Last month I submitted an article about a homeowner who procured a house through Habitat. The article emphasized how the act of ownership and the sense of belonging to a community had a significant effect on her and her family. Next month will have a different personal account and I'll also, in the future, touch on how financing and loans are arranged, how applicants are selected, and what kind of labor the future homeowner must give to fulfill Habitat's requirements.



Today I'd like to provide some details about Habitat for Humanity. Most people are aware it involves volunteers physically working on constructing a building, but beyond that, there seems to be a lot of gaps in the details.

For instance, much of the volunteer work is doing rehab of older buildings rather than brand new construction because it is much cheaper than buying property and all new materials. An existing home already has electric, water, and gas hookups, finished landscaping, and usable fixtures that do not always need replacement.

Some people think that Habitat provides free or sub-standard homes or at least, very cheap homes. This is not the case. Habitat uses quality, locally available materials, meets all building codes and workmanship, and is supervised by experienced professional and volunteers. When designed, plans architecturally conform to the surrounding neighborhoods.

The homes are modestly sized – large enough for a family's needs but small enough to keep down construction and maintenance costs.



ELCA LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE

One of the organizations SOTP will be supporting during our Easter Offering is ELCA Lutheran Disaster Response. It brings God's



hope, healing and renewal to people whose lives have been disrupted by disasters in the United States and around the world. When the dust settles and the headlines change, they stay to provide ongoing assistance to those in need working with local congregations and agencies and global partners. In 2019 (the last year for which we have information) 68% of expenses were spent in the U.S. and 26% were spent internationally. In the last year they have responded to the following disasters:

- Starting in Jan., 2020, responded to the Covid-19 pandemic here in the United States and around the world.
- Dec. 25, 2020, Nashville bombing.
- Nov. 2, 2020, Hurricane Eta, a powerful Category 4 storm, which hit Nicaragua, Honduras and Guatemala.
- Nov. 1, 2020, Super Typhoon Goni (the strongest tropical cyclone in the world in 2020) hit in the Philippines.
- Aug. 4, 2020, two explosions from a warehouse storing large quantities of ammonium nitrate that rocked the central district and port of Beirut, Lebanon.
- Starting in July 2020, numerous wildfires that burned over 8.2 million acres across California, Oregon, Washington, Colorado and other western states.
- In August, 2020,a type of severe windstorm called a derecho tore across the Midwest (particularly Iowa, South Dakota, Illinois and Michigan), traveling over 750 miles in 14 hours, spawning multiple tornadoes and leaving severe damage in its wake.
- Numerous flood in the U.S.
- A powerful and destructive tornado that ripped through central Tennessee in March 2020

- Civil war and famine in South Sudan that has caused nearly 5 million people to be food insecure.
- The Middle East and Syria refugee crisis (Syria, Iraq, Egypt, and Serbia). They are working with our trusted partners and companion churches, who are helping provide safety, support and basic amenities.
