Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

Easter blessings to you and your family. I'm hoping you are able to join us to celebrate Holy Week and Easter weekend with us at SOTP either in person or online. A reminder that we are asking you make a reservation if you wish to join us in person for worship in Easter weekend.

Pastors Corner In a few weeks we will be reading an interesting story from the 24th chapter of Luke's gospel. It is one of several accounts recorded in the Gospels of Jesus appearing following the crucifixion. While the story of Easter is the defining event in the Christian Gospel, it is also controversial. In fact, the controversy is found in the gospel story itself.

What was the first reaction of the disciples to seeing Jesus as recorded in Luke 24? You will discover that they are startled and terrified.

There is no joy. Just terror!

And what do they suppose when they see Jesus? They suppose that they are seeing a ghost. Seeing ghosts was familiar to the disciples. This certainly fits the disciples. As far as they knew, the body of Jesus was missing from the tomb.

Jesus had died a terrible death. Most certainly they were haunted by the horror of the crucifixion and now they are confused and troubled about what may have happened to the body of Jesus. To the disciples, the empty tomb meant that someone had taken the body of Jesus.

In this story Jesus came and brought them a word of peace (Luke 24:36). Then he showed them his body with the marks of the crucifixion clearly present. Jesus came to them with his body. The resurrection was not about seeing ghosts of dead relatives or religious teachers. The disciples experienced "the resurrection of the body" of Jesus.

That is why in the Apostles' Creed we confess, "I believe in.... the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting."

In 1 Corinthians chapter 12, St. Paul takes the meaning of the resurrection of the body a step further when he says to the Christians in Corinth, "You are the body of Christ and individually members of it" (1 Corinthians 12:27).

This connects us to Christ's resurrected body. We now are one with Christ, the resurrected Lord, right now, as we live on earth. The Church is the body of Christ and we are members of it. Thanks be to God for His resurrected Spirit and the life we have in Jesus name! What a privilege is ours in carrying God's message of love in our lives.

I'll look forward to being with you in worship.

Ministry Musings

I recently read a book by Brian McLaren entitled, "Faith After Doubt". It's a book about faith, the church and ministry. There was a lot to learn in the book, but the thing that still walks with me every day is the statement that what really matters is "faith expressing itself in love". Not faith expressing itself in rigid,



"correct" beliefs and practices. Not faith expressing itself in "filling the pews". Not faith expressing itself in upholding "traditions or methodologies". Not faith expressing itself programs, capital campaigns, or evangelism strategies. Not faith expressing itself in "us" (those who are right) vs "them" (those who are wrong). Not faith expressing itself in maintaining the "status quo". Many of these expressions of faith are not wrong, and some are an important part of who we are. But "faith expressing itself in love" really captured my attention and my soul.

I spent a lot of time thinking and praying about what that phrase, "faith expressing itself in love" means. Just reading that phrase, I was reminded about what Pastor Mark often says, "it's about wanting better for another than you do for yourself". That's what I think "faith expressing itself in love means". Jesus described it at one point as denying yourself, taking up your cross, and following him. (Luke 9:23) Paul said, "...if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing". (1 Cor 13:2) I believe what really matters is "faith expressing itself in love"; everything else can be how we do that.

We can express our faith in love as we worship, study, learn, give financially, live in tradition, or in many other ways. We express our faith in love as we stop what we are doing to listen to a fellow believer who called because they need to be loved. Or when we stop playing on our phones to listen to a child tell us what's on their heart. It's hearing someone with a different opinion speak and really listening rather than formulating our rebuttal while they are talking. It's giving room in our hearts and minds for another's idea rather than hanging onto our own as "better". It's not thinking of other belief systems or political views as "us" versus "them". It's seeing people of different colors, backgrounds, ethnicities, economic status, as peers rather than inferiors. It's seeing every person we come into contact with as a person created and beloved by God. They are you know, each and every one beloved by God.
