A Note From Pastor Mark

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ, In the time of King David, there was the Ark of the Covenant.

It was said to contain God's word and God's law on tablets of stone, as received by Moses. In I Chronicles 16, the Ark of the Covenant is brought to Jerusalem with great fanfare and celebration. This is a sacred emblem of Israel's faith, and worthy of respect and reverence. David wants to emphasize the sacred history it represents, and creates a great celebration and fanfare.

There's special music. King David himself writes a psalm, which is the text for this devotion and study.

8 O give thanks to the Lord, call on his name,

make known his deeds among the peoples.

9 Sing to him, sing praises to him, tell of all his wonderful works.10 Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice.

11 Seek the Lord and his strength, seek his presence continually.

1 Chronicles 16:8-11

The Levites take responsibility for protecting the ark. They also lead the worship, making certain that it continues daily, even as people go back to their homes and their daily lives. During the time of the judges, the story of Moses and the faith and courage that led the people from

Egypt is put on the back burner. It's story had not been central in these



people's lives, and for some it may have been forgotten. Now is the time to bring back the story of the ark of the covenant. Eventually it would be housed in the temple, in the Holy of Holies, but not yet. It takes another generation, led by Solomon, to accomplish this.

You have no doubt experienced times of celebration during your life. Maybe they involved an anniversary of a church, or some important community celebration. Was there a procession or parade? Was there special music or poetry? And were any significant stories about important historic events retold? Why are these occasions important? Do they lift up something that is worth remembering? So it is with the Christian faith.

In worship, we lift up what is important. And we don't wait for special historic occasions; we do this routinely in worship each Sabbath. We lift up our praise of God and our thanks for the Gospel, which comes to us through Jesus, conveying to us a loving God.

Jesus says in John 15, "I am the vine and you are the branches." We are



living branches, rooted in the living Lord. The central message tells us about our connection to a loving God.

We are fed by that love, which grows in us. If we are cut off from that love, we wilt and die.


with

us at our







Johnsrud and Bales reimagine and rearrange Fred Rogers' music as beautiful, sophisticated vehicles for jazz improvisation and innovation. In this collection, Mister Rogers' songs not only relate to adults; they seem to be have been written for adults in the first place. Johnsrud is a fresh and appealing jazz singer with a quietly expressive voice and a deep understanding of lyric interpretation. She regularly tours the U.S. with her own group and is an experienced music educator in both vocal and piano private instruction


and a faculty member at the Shell Lake Arts Center in Shell Lake, WI.

Kurtis Arndt's Letter to Congregation

Dear Shepherd of the Prairie,

Thank You. As many of you know, my 9 month internship comes to a close at the end of July 2021. This internship was an experience that I will never forget and forever cherish. I can never say thank you enough to you, my home Church, for providing me so much support, prayers, and encouragement during my time here. The year of 2020 is a year that none of us will ever forget. For me personally, Shepherd of the Prairie gave me a purpose when I felt very lost as a recent college graduate during a pandemic.

When the world went on lockdown, I was at home on Spring Break of my Senior Year at Valparaiso University when we were told to not return due to COVID-19. I was home. I didn't have the opportunity to say goodbye to my friends, the faculty, or the campus itself. I finished my degree online from my dining room table. I saw my name on a slideshow as a 'Commencement Ceremony'. Then I received my diploma just as I imagined I would, being thrown like a frisbee across the lawn from a UPS driver onto the porch. Definitely not how I expected my final year of college to go...

To say that I felt lost would be an understatement. That's when God moved in ways that I can never say thank you enough for. Youth Leadership Team Leader Bob McDuffee, Pastor Mark, and former Council President Bud Hansen, approached me in the fall of 2020 and 14

asked if I would be interested in taking on some of our Youth and **Family Ministries** and offered me hope, guidance,



and purpose in the form of an Internship. To return home to the Church that raised me since I was 6 vears old was a blessing.

Over the last 9 months, I got the great honor to see hope flood my life in the eyes and spirits of students grades 6th through graduating seniors as they took on the pandemic, worshiped their hearts out, and asked the big questions of faith, bible, and our purpose on this planet.

This internship was full of victories. I saw a High School Program grow from my first week of 2 students, to a group now of 23 students. We went on a Mission Trip, an 8 day long service trip to Northwest Indiana called "Simplicity", where 13 students gave hundreds of hours of service in the name of Jesus. We even had many successful fundraisers! This internship also gave me the opportunity to find myself when I was completely lost and build lifelong relationships and friendships with so many wonderful students, families, congregation members, and staff. All during a pandemic!




