A Note From Pastor Mark

Dear Friends:

I have so enjoyed my time with our 4th and 5th grade students in Adventure Club. One of our Wednesday nights centered around prayer and how to pray. We talked about how hard life can be sometimes and that when those times come it can be difficult to know how to pray.

Is that true in your life?

When challenges confront us in daily life, we may give in to feelings of fear, anxiety, or defeat.

It's at that point that we need to call a friend, a friend who knows God is our refuge.

When challenges confront us, it can inhibit our ability to pray. Sometimes the words just don't come to us. It's at that point we need help. I find the Psalms to be so helpful in giving words to prayer. I encourage you to use the Psalm this month in your prayer life.

Psalm 31 for instance prays so very well. The Psalm is a reminder that we can trust God with all things: God is our deliverer. (v.1) God is our rescuer, rock, and fortress. (v.2) God is our leader and guide. (v.3) God is our redeemer. (v.5) God knows us. (v.7) God is filled with light and unfailing love for each of us. (v.16) God has stored up goodness for those who seek God. (v.19) God shelters us by God's presence. (v.20) God hears our cry for mercy. (v.22) God preserves God's faithful followers and gives us hope. (v.23 and 24)

Therefore, when anguish arrives in our lives, we must continue to pray and be open to God's



word just as we do in good times. If that is difficult we must lean on a friend who can turn our trust and hope to our merciful God.


Years ago, when my mother was slowly succumbing to her battle with breast cancer. I remember the strength God gave when I turned to God in prayer, scripture, and to others who would listen. I remember in particular a letter I received from Bishop Gary Wollersheim that was so meaningful to me. The letter included a prayer of blessing for my mother that I read to her the night before she died. There was such a peace that fell upon us around her bedside as I read that prayer.

As the Scripture remind us, at "just the right time, God gives us what we need." What we need are reminders of God's grace. Grace that comes in our lives of prayer, the Bible and God's Word lived out in the lives of God's people.

Think of difficult periods in your life. Who stood by you? Did a church member, a friend, pastor, or particular scripture provide you with comfort? Earnestly pray for an experience of God's grace and peace.

I'll look forward to being with you in worship!

Ministry Musings With Donna

Galatians 3:26-28

– "So in Christ

Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who

were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor fee, nor is there male or female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

The church in Galatia was torn with strife over the issue of what did Gentiles have to do to become a 'Christian'. In the middle of the first century, this was perhaps the most important moral question facing the church. The dilemma was did the Gentiles who came to faith in Jesus have to be circumcised and follow the Mosaic law in order to be a Christian/or part of Abraham's covenant family; or could they became part of the family through faith in Jesus as Lord. If adherence to the law was required of Gentile Christians, then that would undermine the foundation of the gospel which says that our relationship with God is based on what God does, not what we do. God always comes to

us, seeking us, initiating relationship, fellowship with God.

Paul, in his writings, urges the Galatians to rethink their theology. He tells them that the appropriate purpose of the law was to train Israel in its preparation for the coming of the Messiah (the Christ). With the coming of the crucified and risen Lord Jesus, that purpose was no longer needed. Faith made the law's training unnecessary because Jesus, as the fully true human/Israelite, completed the law. The covenant was fulfilled in Christ.

Since none of us can stand before God on our own, we now stand in Christ and that fact serves to break down the barriers between us. This means we need to see each other as clothed in Christ so that even the very basic human distinctions of race, class and gender fall apart. Being clothed in Christ doesn't

make the differences disappear; those differences simply lack the ability to have any bearing on faith or service or fellowship. We can celebrate our differences and live them out with love and joy! Our status is now as a child of God, brothers and sisters together.

Paul describes the differences that no longer matter as Jew or Gentile, slave or free, male or female. I wonder if Paul were to write today what differences would he use? Would he say, "So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed vourselves with Christ. There is neither people of color or people not of color, rich or homeless, citizen or illegal alien, immigrant or native, gay or straight, democrat or republican, liberal or conservative, for you are all one in Christ Jesus". May that be so, especially in our lives of faith!






