A Note From Pastor Mark

Dear Friends:

The Gospel reading for the first weekend in July is from Luke chapter 10. It is familiar to us.

We've read about Jesus' evangelism method of sending out seventy disciples, two by two, ahead of himself. We've read his directions to them—"Go, the harvest is great, but the laborers are few."

Jesus further told them that it would be a dangerous assignment; that they should put their entire focus on it; that they should deliver their message of good news but not remain to try to convince those whose hearts were not open to receive the message; they should not be waylaid by desire for the material things of the world but accept only what is due them.

Have we read this text and considered it as only something that happened then? Have we marveled at Jesus' method for spreading the message of good news in preparation for his personally coming to transform peoples' lives?

I wonder if you are like me and sometimes think of this text as an event rather than as a command for me today?

I remember when I first came to Shepherd of the Prairie spending quite a bit of time surveying the area and making cold calls on the new neighborhoods of Huntley. Many from SOTP joined me on these walks through the neighborhoods asking people if they have a church home? Take a moment and read the story from Luke 10:1-11, 16-20.



Remember, the seventy went ahead of Jesus. They didn't bring an invitation to an organization or a program.

They brought Jesus.

Is that what we should bring?

We are being called to bring Jesus to our neighborhoods and into our everyday lives.

I am so thankful to the congregation vision to add need help in this endeavor. As voting members of the congregation, I hope you will set aside Sunday, July 10 to join us in boldly taking a step forward in faith as we seek to call Ryan Mackey as Pastor to work alongside all of us here at Shepherd of the Prairie Lutheran Church!

I do believe the fields are "white unto harvest." It is Jesus alone who transforms people's hearts. We who have heard and believe must follow his command today. Our belief is both a privilege and a responsibility. We have the privilege of bringing Jesus wherever we find ourselves planted. What a blessing it is of mine to be part of this mission field with you to bring Jesus, and the harvest to which we each are called.

Ministry Musings With Donna

I'm a great fan of TikTok. There are funny things I find there, interesting things and things I just scroll

through. There are also a lot of pastors and Christian educators I follow on TikTok as well.

One I really enjoy and follow is a Lutheran pastor by the name of Chad Bird. He regularly talks about Hebrew words from the Old Testament and Greek words from the New; explaining their original meanings and context. This month I would like to share a story with you that Pastor Chad shared which concerns prayer and how it isn't always pretty words. Below is a transcription of his TikTok.

"There's a story about a woman whose husband was hospitalized, he was dying from cancer and she just never left his side. She was there praying with him and reading the scriptures to him. But one day she just had to get out and so she left the room, she walked out of the hospital and as she did, she passed by a group of nuns who could see that she was extremely distraught. They watched her walk across to a statue of the Virgin Mary and all of a sudden, she began picking up handfuls of dirt and rocks and throwing them at the statue. One of the younger nuns was about to rush over and stop the woman when an older nun put her hand on the shoulder and said no, no leave her alone, she's

praying. Now you don't have to be a Roman Catholic or pray to the virgin Mary to appreciate the impact of that story. The message is simply this, that very often when we pray to God it feels more like we are hurling dirt and rocks toward heaven then we're praying some eloquent pious prayer. Prayer often feels that way and the psalms are full of prayers that have this intensity, this rawness that are like throwing verbal rocks and dirt toward heaven. asking God, where are you? How long am I going to keep suffering? Why are these terrible things happening to me? My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? (Psalm 22:1). Very often when we're in these periods of intense suffering and loneliness in pain and desperation our prayers are these, these painful lamentations to God. And that's okay. Because the Psalms, God's own gift of prayers to us are full of prayers like that. Never hesitate to say, where are you God? Why is this happening to me? How long will it go on? That is the way Biblical prayer works. These prayers arise not from unfaithfulness and unbelief but rather faith; trust that the God to whom we cry our will hear and will answer because ultimately he's the God of grace and mercy for us." 



Treasurer's Report

Treasurer's Report as of May 31, 2022

<u>General Fund Report</u>: The Unrestricted General Fund Balance is \$349,670. Total income for the month was \$70,059 and total expenses for the month was \$63,334. Approximately 5.1 months of General Fund reserves.

Mortgage Service Fund Report: The Mortgage Service Fund Balance is \$74,620. Income for the month was \$16,538. The new MIF five-year monthly mortgage payment is \$18,807. Approximately 4 months of Mortgage Service Fund reserves.
