A Note From Pastor Mark

Welcome to your summer...I'm sure many of you have some wonderful plans with family and friends. Summer is a great time to reconnect with loved who are most close to us. I hope you take time to do just that...connect with those you love.

With that thought in mind how might you connect or reconnect to Jesus? I encourage you to continue to make worship a priority during the summer months. I reminder that we are continuing Kid's Connect through the summer months. Thanks to everyone who has stepped up to serve! If you are away I encourage to you to worship while you are vacationing. Let us know where you are and even send us a picture. We would love to know where God is sending you to make Christ known while on vacation.

When Peter, James, and John witnessed the transfiguration and wanted to preserve Moses (the law), Elijah (the prophets) and Jesus, God said, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him."

Only Jesus remained. The law and the prophets were fulfilled in him. This is the same truth the Holy Spirit wants us to understand.

I recently read a little book entitled, The Christ of the Indian Road, written in 1925 by E. Stanely Jones, a missionary to India, I found an amazing insight into how to bring Christianity to India. Yet, many missionaries for years afterward failed to recognize his

prayerful and Spirit-led plea that they must bring the person of Jesus alone



rather than the example of so called Christian nations in order to reach nonbelievers' hearts.

Do we bring Jesus to our community? Do our friends and colleagues see Jesus in us? Are we open to the Holy Spirit's revelation of all that Jesus is for our world today?

I will often gain insight into a Biblical text by using William Barclay's Daily Bible Study Series. I found special motivation from Barclay's last sentences on these verses from John. "The nearer we live to Jesus, the better we will know him. The more we become like him, the more he will be able to tell us. To enjoy his revelation, we must accept his mastery" (Gospel of John Volume 2, William Barclay, Westminster John Knox Press, pg. 196).

How exciting for us as believers to know that the Holy Spirit is waiting to reveal God's message through Christ to us! What haven't we grasped that we can grasp today? What have we gotten wrong in our relationship with Jesus? What new revelation is waiting for us as we grow closer to Jesus? How can we bring Jesus to those who live among us?

"The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not

know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." – Jesus (John 3:8, NRSV)

Our last Gospel reading for the month of May came on the Sunday we know as The Holy Trinity, and it was a familiar one, including verses we were encountering for the third time this year. The first encounter was in our Lenten Dinner Church series, the second was on the 4th Sunday in Lent, and the last on Holy Trinity. The passage came from the third chapter of John's Gospel when we see Nicodemus come to Jesus in the dark of night and with great curiosity to know more about this mysterious figure who seems to be of God.

When Nicodemus asks how anyone can understand and believe Jesus'

teachings, Jesus answers, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." Jesus also says, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit." John is using a clever play on words. The Greek word, $\pi v \epsilon \upsilon \mu \alpha$ (pneuma), that gives us "Spirit" is also the word for "wind." In this passage, John lays the foundation for what will come to be known as "pneuma-life." In simpler words, when we are reborn into this life in Christ, we are born into a "pneumalife" or "Spirit-life."

Jesus uses the image of wind to help us understand the movement of the Holy Spirit. We can certainly feel it move past us, sometimes gently and sometimes harshly. We can get a general idea of where it's coming from and where it's going, but where does it actually begin and end? That is an impossible question to answer.

This is a valuable image for the Holy

Spirit in our lives. How do you experience the Holy Spirit? Do you get a feeling? Do you see patterns? Do you hear certain things and know that they are of the Holy Spirit? We can get a sense of the Spirit but can't know where it comes from or where it is going to go next.

It is important to reflect on the movement of the Holy Spirit yearround, but I encourage to truly reflect this summer. You may have family trips planned. You may be facing a grueling travel schedule for sports. You may be taking time off to simply rest, or your summer may simply be business as usual. No matter what awaits you this summer, I encourage you to keep your heart and mind open to however the Holy Spirit may surprise you, comfort you, challenge you, or nourish you. When you can, take some quiet time to yourself. When you are on the road, try to take in the sights around you. Whether you are experiencing something new or going through the daily routine, try to spot something you've never noticed before. These are the ways we can look for God at work through the Holy Spirit.

You just never know where God will show up, and you never know what the Holy Spirit may have in store!

May the Holy Spirit surprise you, and may you feel the joy only God can bring through Jesus Christ,

When Jesus is questioned about eating with "sinners and tax collectors" he replies that it is the sick who need physician and he came to call the sick. The commentary then went on to talk about how Jesus came to call the tax collector, the self-aware sinner, and the scribe, the selfpresumed saint, and how on any given Sunday it is difficult if not impossible to tell who the in the worship space is "sick" and who is "healthy". The author also wondered if we come to the table aware of our own sickness and need.

When we break bread and drink the cup, Jesus is dining at our house; and so are the "sinners and tax collectors" and the "the crowds, the disciples, the scribes and the Pharisees." Included are the leader who is certain he/she is absolutely right about continuing to do things the way it has always been done, or was done at their old church. the one who struggles to stay on their meds to quiet the voices in their head, the one who "fell off the wagon" again and fights to get back on it, the parent with the noisy little ones, the bored middle schooler who would rather be anywhere else, the older person who sees their health deteriorating and the rest of us. each with our own sicknesses, are dining with Jesus today ready to receive the healing he has to offer. The crust of bread and the drop of wine are meant for all of us. But not just for our own sakes, but for the sake of others.

Physician." While on earth he healed many people of various diseases and conditions. If Jesus is the great physician, then we are called to be "physician assistants." Wikipedia defines Physician Assistants as "a healthcare professional who practices medicine as a part of a healthcare team with collaborating physicians and other providers. PAs are concerned with preventing and treating human illness and injury by providing a plethora of health care services under a supervising physician." To me that sounds a lot like our call from Jesus, to care for his creation!

We don't need to be medical professionals to care for others. All we need is a listening ear and heart. We may not be able to prescribe medication or run medical tests; but we can hold a hand, listen to another, serve a meal, send a card, make a quilt, sing a song, teach a child, pray with and for someone, share the gospel, play a game and unlimited other ways to show that Jesus and we care! Isn't that what being a disciple really is, following our leader and caring for his people and his world?

Come and be a physician assistant to the Great Physician, be part of his healthcare team to bring his love and healing to the world.


