

A Note From Pastor Mark

As the writing of this article my morning devotion took me to Luke 10:38-42. The story of Mary and Martha. Mary, taking time to sit down to listen to Jesus, Martha busy around the house getting everything ready.

"Martha, Martha, Martha. Sit down and relax for crying out loud! Leave whatever you're doing and come join us. Take care of it later."

We all have been tempted to say something like that to someone who can't seem to sit still and flits from room to room, upstairs, downstairs, keeping busy with mundane things that other people are content to handle once they have attended to a more pressing need first.

But a Martha-type person has to keep at it.

The house could catch fire, but a Martha will make sure it is clean before the fire department arrives. Let me say as well, where would we be without the "Martha" in our lives. They are blessings beyond measure. I would also say, that each of us have a little "Marth" in us.

In the story told in Luke, Mary simply took time to listen to what Jesus had to say.

Martha wasn't astute enough to realize the reality of what was going on. She wanted Christ to visit on her terms and no doubt was looking for compliments about her cooking and neat house, but if Christ had something to say to her, well, he

would just have to wait until she was good and ready to sit down and



listen. She perhaps didn't want word to get out that she didn't know how to entertain.

But in a way, are we all not like Martha? Haven't we all, at one time, gone our own way when other things were of a more important nature? Haven't we sometimes said "no" or "later" to a spouse, friend, co-worker or to a request from the church? Haven't we passed up an opportunity to serve in order to attend to our own personal needs?

What tends to draw our interest away from those things to which we know we should have attended?

Well, regrets always follow, don't they?

What do you think Martha did after Jesus rebuked her? Do you suppose she went and pouted or did she sit down and listen?

We need to discern what is not only food for our soul but also on how we "feed" our neighbors and those with whom we come in contact.

What are the people who listen to us hearing? Are we Christ to them or should they listen to another?

Does it make any difference to us?

The 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering "Created to Be"

I am writing this from a hotel in

Sikeston, MO, halfway home from an incredible trip to New Orleans, LA with three awesome youth and an amazing chaperone. Andrew Padget, Elise Padget, Ashlyn Rankin, Laureen Penev and I got to experience some of the best New Orleans has to offer and shared in an incredible community of youth and adults from all 65 synods of the ELCA.

Every three years, the ELCA hosts thousands of youth in a major U.S. city for five days of worship, service, learning, and community. Each day is spent either fulfilling a service project somewhere in the community, worshipping with others from our synod, or engaging in interactive learning about the work of the ELCA through its organizations such as

Lutheran Disaster Response. Each night includes a mass gathering in an indoor stadium with music, speakers, and more.

This year, our theme was "Created to Be." Each mass gathering featured a different word to complete that phrase. Night one was Created to be Brave. We heard from speakers who explored ways that we are called step out in faith, even when things seem challenging or impossible. The next night was all about how we are Created to Be Authentic. We heard from speakers who talked about how they didn't always fit in with those around them. They felt they had to contort themselves and conform into the image others thought they should, but by the grace of God, each figured out God loved them exactly the way they are; who God created them to be. Night three we heard how we are Created to Be Free. Each of us is free to love others without

fear. Because Christ died for us, we need not fear death or judgment. As such, we respond by freely loving God and loving others, for the sake of the Gospel. The fourth theme was Created to Be Disruptive. Speakers told stories of what they did when they realized a system, rule, practice, or situation was broken, unjust, or wrong. They stood up against what was wrong and disrupted the system. We are called, not to sit back and let the unjust things persist, but to be disrupters that rectify the broken things. And our last theme was Created to Be Disciples. It is not enough to take all of this in and sit back on our laurels. Jesus sends us out to spread the word and bring more people into the fold, to be our brave, authentic, free, disruptive selves for the sake of the world that needs hear the Gospel and be lifted up.

We ate our way through the city, enjoying, among other things, chicken cracklins, fried gator, jambalaya, gumbo, oysters, and escargot. We helped clean up a struggling neighborhood. We danced and sang. We applauded. We prayed and communed. We walked...and walked... and walked... and walked...

I asked the youth to sum up their reflections on the trip so I could share their thoughts with you here. They said the best things about the week

were experiencing the rich culture of the city and enjoying the food. They loved the way we were able to build community, making connections with youth from other states and realizing we are all connected through the Holy Spirit and our shared faith. A couple of cool moments they wanted me to share with you were the times we prayed The Lord's Prayer in our preferred translation or language. We prayed it together and it was a beautiful, jumbled collection of sounds and words, yet we were all unified in the meaning of the words and their connection to Jesus.

I couldn't have asked for a better group of kids or a better partner in chaperoning this powerful event. It was a spiritual encounter for each of us. I know it refreshed me and fed my soul, and I'm certain it moved the others in our group as well.

I encourage you to reach out to each of our youth, Laureen, or me to find out more about this meaningful and important event in the life of our church. The next one will be in 2027 in Minneapolis, MN. If you have a youth who will be high school age at that time, start planting the seed! We would love to double or triple our group for 2027!

When you contemplate the future are you hopeful?

As Christians, our hope is grounded in our faith in the saving grace of Jesus Christ. But when we encounter all the news the various media present to us, it becomes difficult to view our world's future with a hopeful attitude. Too often we encounter misinformation (unintentional) or disinformation (intentional).

Everything's bad and getting worse. Really? This world was created and continues to be loved by God (John 3:16). What if our view of the future is distorted? What if what we presume to be generally accepted facts aren't facts at all?

First, we will test our basic knowledge of our world and its projected future for accuracy. Then using the book Factfulness by Hans Rosling, we will identify 10 instincts for the dramatic that we all have and that unknowingly can lead us astray as we view our world and its future. Coupling our Christian faith with these 10 fact-finding tools will help us to counter the fear of the future that has taken over much of our discourse.

Join us at 10:20am on Sunday mornings beginning on September 8th to learn the factfulness way of life. No preparation is necessary. Resources will be provided.


