December NoteFrom Pastor Mark

The parable in Luke 11:5-13 text immediately follows the account of what we call "The Lord's Prayer." It is a parable about persistence in prayer and only Luke tells this story.

Its message is that if you are going to pray to God, be bold. Audacious. Persistent.

In this parable, someone's in need. He knocks on his neighbor's door late at night. Of course, the neighbors don't hear him! They're sleeping.

Have you ever experienced someone knocking on your door or making a lot of noise late at night? How did you react? Would you get up late at night to answer the door? Is there a difference between a late-night emergency and noise with no apparent purpose?

In this parable, the knocking has a purpose. A need is being expressed. Yet the neighbor is irritated.

He gives excuses; he doesn't want to be bothered. But eventually, he does respond. He comes to the door and gives his neighbor what he needs.

Jesus teaches that we can be audacious and bold in our prayer. Asking boldly for what you need is like knocking on your neighbor's door late at night in search of bread to feed someone who's hungry.

This parable also implies that the asleep neighbor is motivated to help you rather than harm you.

God wants to help us, to respond to the needs expressed in our prayers.

God isn't going to give us poisonous snakes or scorpions instead of bread.

God desires to hear our prayers and to help us.

So, when we pray, we should not doubt God's



good will and purpose, even when it's the dead of night and our cries for help seem disregarded.

The King James translation reads: "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and you shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. For everyone that asks receives, and he that seeks finds; and to him that knocks it shall be opened."

"Ask, Seek, Knock." That's what it's all about. Keep praying. Be bold.

Approach God as a loving parent. Though I must admit, being older as I am, I wonder if God doesn't take out his hearing aids at night, sometimes.

I say that with the hope that God has a sense of humor. God must, God created us, right?

So, let's keep pounding on the door and I'll look forward to being with you in worship!

When she replied she wore an 8.5 the Stephen Minister bent down, untied one shoe and gave it to the woman to try on. The woman did so and said it felt wonderful. The minister then took off the other shoe and gave it to her as well. The woman remarked that she couldn't take this minister's shoes but was assured by the minister that she had another pair at home. The street woman took the shoes, thanked her and said, "God bless you".

As the street woman left, the room was filled with stunned silence. Another Stephen Minister asked the one who had given up her shoes how she was going to get home as it was cold and wet outside. She replied that she had on thick socks and that she did have a pair of shoes to wear. She then put on the tattered

shoes the woman had left behind and proceeded to walk outside. The shoes were badly worn and caused her to limp as she walked. The other minister warned her to be careful and to not fall and get hurt. As she hobbled out, she remarked, "Now I really know what it's like to walk in someone else's shoes".

What else is there to say? May God help us to be as generous and caring as this woman was to share God's love and grace with our neighbors.

The Choir has served as one of the primary "faces" of the University for nearly 60 years. The Choir has performed in Eastern and Western Europe, the Caribbean, and part of Asia. The Choir performs nationally three times per year and overseas biannually with Reverend Dr. Brown. This past May, the Choir and Rev. Dr. Brown ministered in Jamaica, his home country.

The Rev. Brown, who was ordained by the Evangelical Church Alliance International, is a concert pianist and recording artist who regularly partners with some of Christianity's well-known ministries,

including the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association. Additionally, he has served as an artist-in-residence for CTS-TV in Seoul, South Korea; played for thousands at Carnegie Hall; been inducted into the Fox Valley Arts Hall of Fame; and holds a black belt in martial arts.

New Adult Ed SeriesThe Human Vessels of Faith



As professing Christians, we share a common faith. Yet each of us carries it in a unique way —in the vessel of our personality, shaped by our genetic inheritance, our physical and psychological development and our life experiences. Our goal will be to better understand the uniqueness of each of our vessels.


We will explore six different models that hopefully will give us greater insight into our individual uniqueness. The first model is that of Walter Wink who suggests that across the vast expanse of known history, five different world views have provided vessels for faith. Second, we will explore the spiritual implications of Erik Ericson's nine stages of human development. Third up will be James Fowler's seven stages of faith development. The fourth session will look at a model of four temperaments/ four spiritualities derived from the Myers-Briggs personality theory. In the fifth session we will explore a four spiritualtypes-model developed by Corinne Ware

which she illustrates in the Spirituality Wheel. In our final session we will visit one more stages-of-faith development model by John Westerhoff and then try to put together what best describes the unique vessel that God has given each of us in which to carry our faith.





The Welcome Center Ministry needs your help! We need people to serve behind the Welcome Center desk


for about 20 minutes after worship services, maybe once a month.
