Ash Wednesday Worship • March 5, 12 Noon and 7:00 pm

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the Lenten Season. The word "Lent" originally meant "spring." It is a time to reflect on our baptism and a time of rebirth and renewal. The season of Lent lasts forty days, excluding Sundays. The altar colors are purple to reflect the solemnity and somberness of the season. In church history, candidates for baptism would fast during these forty days leading to their baptism at Easter.

In a Jewish and Christian context, ashes suggest judgment and God's

condemnation of sin, our total dependence upon God for life, and repentance. We are reminded of the words of the burial service:" earth to earth and dust to dust." Ashes are also a symbol of cleansing and renewal.


Just as baptismal water suggests death and life...so

Ministry Musing By Donna Kelly

March 2025

As we begin our Lenten Journey this month, one

of the Ash Wednesday readings that isn't often used is Isaiah 58:1-12. Prior to this reading, the book of Isaiah tells the story of the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple by the Babylonian Empire. Many of the people of Israel were deported to Babylonia. After 70 years, Assyria came into power and King Cyrus allowed the Israelites to return back to their homeland.

But it was a new generation that returned home, and they were no longer well acquainted with YHWH, the God of Israel. They tried to return to the religious practices of the past; prayer, fasting and offerings. But their heart wasn't in it. They went through the motions, but their actions outside of the practices didn't match what God was calling them to do and be.

They fasted and said their prayers, but continued to mistreat employees, ignore the poor, the sick, the hungry, the immigrant, and even their own families. Then they wondered, why isn't God listening to us? Why isn't God helping us rebuild our lives?

The prophet speaks for God, telling the people that just lip service to God isn't what God is looking for. God is looking for them to put what he asks into practice: "break the chains of injustice, get rid of exploitation, free the oppressed, share your food with the hungry, invite the homeless in, clothe the naked, care for you families". God then promises that "then their lives will glow in the darkness, and you will be like a gurgling spring that never runs dry.

And we too find ourselves, at times, on the same pathway. We do all the "right, churchy" things but don't care for those around us in need. We ignore the poor, forget about the orphan, ignore the immigrant and the homeless... and we wonder if we are too far off the mark and God will give up on us.

But God don't give up on the Israelites, and he doesn't give up on us! God calls them and us back time and time again. God doesn't measure out grace by the teaspoonful. God never gives up on us! God's love and grace is like a thundering waterfall that is ever rolling, crashing and splashing everywhere that then becomes a streaming river that flows through us and out to nourish all of creation.

Our God is a God of endless second chances. May you know that grace and love and then pass it on.


In 2024, we were invited to Open God's Story. We encouraged each other to connect God's work and word throughout the Bible with God's work in our lives.

Every month will have a theme related to following Jesus, an area of discipleship we can grow and nurture in our lives. We will explore 7 different marks of discipleship

and invite each other to grow deeper roots in each area, through practice, study, and opening of our hearts and lives, just as the original disciples did.



We will share

prayers, social media posts, monthly bulletin inserts, and blog posts from across our synod along with additional resources that you are welcome to use. Workshops and opportunities at CRE and Synod Assembly will invite you into ways to grow as a disciple.



Adult Ed SeriesThe Human Vessels of Faith

As professing Christians, we share a common faith. Yet each of us carries it in a unique way –in the vessel of our personality, shaped by our genetic inheritance, our physical and psychological development and our life experiences. Our goal will be to better understand the uniqueness of each of our vessels.

We will explore six different models that hopefully will give us greater insight into our individual uniqueness. The first model is that of Walter Wink who suggests that across the vast expanse of known history, five different world views have provided vessels for faith. Second, we will explore the spiritual implications of Erik Ericson's nine stages of human development. Third up will be James Fowler's seven stages of faith development. The fourth session will look at a model of four temperaments/ four spiritualities derived from the Myers-Briggs personality theory. In the fifth session we will explore a four spiritualtypes-model developed by Corinne Ware



which she illustrates in the Spirituality Wheel. In our final session we will visit one more stages-of-faith development model by John Westerhoff and then try to put together what best describes the unique vessel that God has given each of us in which to carry our faith.





We hold important here that all are welcome. And our Welcome Center Ministry is part of that. And it is a ministry. Won't you consider helping out at the Welcome Center.


