A NOTE FROM PASTOR MARK

Many of us will be surprised this Christmas with eye-popping, heartwarming gifts. Maybe a new electronic gadget or game? Jewelry? An engagement ring? A puppy? A special drawing from a grandchild?

What have your wishes been in the Christmases of your life?

There are those who receive nothing, not even a card.

Have you been in that situation?

And, of course, many will forget the gift of Christ.

Have you ever experienced that?

God gives us life in this baby, this Savior. This is everything we need, yet sometimes we don't seem to think it's enough. Or maybe it's too farfetched to believe.

Instead we go our own way, sometimes turning to destructive habits like drugs, alcohol, smoking, gambling, overeating, facebook or technology addiction, or other soul-eating vices, putting a distance between ourselves and our loved ones, between ourselves and the God who dwells among us.

In the Gospel of Matthew chapters 1 and 2 the Christmas story begins with the lineage of Jesus going all the way back to Abraham. This is followed by the Spirit intervening in a dream so that Joseph is reassured to not "dismiss" Mary but to take her as his beloved. Thus a name is attached to the Messiah, "God with Us, Jesus."

In the hustle and bustle of life it is so easy to lose our connection to God with us. As with Joseph we get so caught up in life and its worries, fears, anxiety and pain that we forget that God was born into that struggle and hardship. God knows it personally.

What are you looking forward to this Christmas season? Peace, health, new friends? How does Christ – the baby in that manger, and the God who is among us here and now – figure in to your celebration?

MINISTRY MUSING WITH DONNA

"It's the most wonderful time of the year", so the song goes. Christmas is a time of celebration and joy for some people. And maybe it used to be the happiest time of year for you as well, but for whatever reason, not this year. Sometimes all Christmas seems to do is remind us. Remind us that things aren't the way they used to be, that they may never be the same again, and we can feel like we are lost.



And that's no surprise because if you think about it, the way we celebrate Christmas in our culture is all about the past and what things used to be like. In a way Christmas is all about the past; our customs, the joy of our childhood, our favorite movies, all of which is great fun, but it's no wonder that when things change, Christmas seems to make us yearn for the past. the "good old days" and we just want the Christmas spirit back, the spirit we used to have.

We may even feel lost in a sea of celebration. That makes me think of the parable of the lost sheep we heard about earlier this year. In this story Jesus teaches us that God is like the shepherd who values each sheep in the flock. God treasures every child of the family. When one goes missing, whether by choice or by experience, God goes into search mode because that is part of the very nature of God.

And yet, some of us may feel far away and lost. What's missing can seem much more acute at Christmas. While we may wish that Christmas would be the way it was in the past, what used to be doesn't come back. We are in the present, the right now.

So how can we celebrate Christmas this year?

We can celebrate the true meaning of Christmas which isn't found in traditions and special foods, in gifts and Christmas Carols. The true meaning of Christmas is a promise that God made to us, a promise God is fulfilling now; to always be with us. The promise that the people who lived in darkness would see light. The promise was never that things would be the way they used to be, but a promise that there can be new hope and new joy.

For the moment, think beyond Bethlehem, beyond the angels and the shepherds, the Magi and the star. It's a beautiful story,

an important story, a story of our faith. And if that story brings us comfort, then by all means we need to cherish it. But that story is about the past, and Christmas is about the present. The true meaning is even bigger than that story; the deepest meaning is closer to us than that.

In reality, Christmas isn't only about the baby Jesus born over 2000 years ago; not really, not directly. Christmas is about God coming to us; coming into our lives, then yes, but also here and now, coming into our hearts today.

It's about God tenderly gathering us in his arms, easing our burdens, our lostness, giving us life, forgiving us, gently enabling us to forgive ourselves and others; helping us to let go of our anger, our pain, our despair. Christ is born in us and among us today. The miracle of Christmas this year, just might be that God is opening our hearts to new hope, new light, new joy, new life.

And I invite you to trust that Christ is being born in you today, and that Christ is with you today, and every day and will bring you that hope, light, peace and life.






BOOK CLUB

NOTE FROM MISSIONARIES

The All-Africa Youth Congress gathers in Nairobi, with the theme "Africa: My home, my future." A delegation of 11 African diaspora young adults from the ELCA will attend. To show what it means to bring young people together like this. I talked with a

Church Cooperation:

ELCA is not alone among Lutheran mission agencies from the global North. Several northern European countries also have them. In this era, mission agencies who are engaged in working with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania pool some of their funds for common interest in serving with the Tanzanian church. Much of those funds go to pastors' scholarships and vehicles for dioceses. Another function is as a clearinghouse for bilateral funds so that we can know who is funding what. This transparency is like an alarm for inequitable partnerships, where a few churches would get most of the external funding.

In Tanzania, one of the biggest such meetings of the year happened Oct 2-3 in Shinyanga. It is called the Lutheran Mission Cooperation Roundtable, where the European partners, ELCA, ELCT national staff, and bishops from all 28 ELCT dioceses get together. Since 2024 I have held ELCA's spot on the LMC board, which makes policies for fund usage and oversees the secretariat that handles the daily administrative work.

For the Kenya Evangelical Lutheran Church, Joint Mission Cooperation Kenya has a similar function, though since KELC is a much smaller church, JMCK is a much smaller operation. Together with Kenyan and German partners, we had our annual meeting in Nairobi the last week of September.

<u>Pray for us!</u> Also pray for the lives and ministries of our dear companions in East Africa and beyond.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR RYAN

As you know, we've been exploring the power of words this year. Starting with the word we received on the back of a paper star sometime in the first part of the year and continuing through our Lenten journey with The Difficult Words of Jesus, we have been wrestling with our words, growing into them, listening for God's voice to teach us something or for the Holy Spirit to guide us through them.



While I've been carrying the word from my star with me (which is youth), another word has crept into my life this year and taken hold. That word is curiosity.

We are living in a culture and society that seems to be more concerned with certainty and being right rather than keeping an open mind and approaching things with a desire to learn or an openness to be changed. All around us—in our families, in the public square, in politics, and in religion/faith—we can see people who have drawn lines in the sand, planted their flag in one camp or another (you choose the metaphor). They become certain of something and close their hearts and minds to anything that might push back against the line they've drawn or the flag they've planted.

The antidote to this, I believe, is curiosity. Imagine how different our world would look if everyone approached everything with curiosity rather than certainty. Imagine if we approached all people, belief systems, cultures, history, science, and yes, Scripture, God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, and faith/religion with curiosity instead of assuming we've got it all already figured out. How different would all our interactions be? Think of how we could better connect with others, especially others who are different or believe differently from us, if we interact with them with a sense of wonder.

Imagine how Scripture could come alive in our hearts, minds, and souls if we approached every verse with a sense of curiosity rather than certainty. As a pastor, I have many conversations with people who hold a very rigid, certain view of Scripture. The fact is, Scripture is so ancient, so complex, so rich, and translated so many ways that we fool ourselves if we think we could ever be

definitively certain of the meaning of each verse. No matter how scholarly someone becomes, how well-versed in Biblical studies, there always comes a point when knowledge gives way to interpretation.

None of us was able to walk with Moses or Abraham. None of us was able to walk with Jesus and witness his ministry firsthand (not even any of the New Testament writers). We must, instead, rely on the spoken and written accounts of who did, and interpret their interpretations of what they saw. This is where the beauty of curiosity opens up. The Scriptures are living documents, speaking in new ways to new people in new times and new places. God finds ways to speak people of every time and place through the Words that have stood the test of time, and when we approach them with curiosity, we find new ways of hearing God's voice, new ways of experiencing Jesus' calling, and new ways of feeling the presence of the Hoy Spirit.

Here is my challenge for you. There is a difference between embedded theology (the faith/assumptions we carry with us simply because it was taught to us by our parents/grandparents or by Sunday School teachers—the kind of faith we've carried

since childhood and never wrestled with) and deliberative theology (the kind of faith/understanding we develop through reflection and learning, always giving deep consideration to new/unexpected/unusual/uncomfortable information). Think about any assumptions you have/are making about God, Jesus, and Scripture. What assumptions do you tend to make about faith/religion? What assumptions do you make about your neighbor or a stranger? How could you further shift your life to approach everything with curiosity? In what ways may God be trying to open your heart or mind to something new?

May you be blessed with a spirit of curiosity and wonder, and may the love of God go with you today and always, *Pastor Ryan*


