A Note From Pastor Mark

Isaiah 63:7-9

Our first reading into the New Year is from Isaiah. Isaiah reminded the Israelites who had returned from exile of all that God had done for them throughout their existence as God's chosen people.

At the beginning of 2023 we are reminded of all that God has done for us throughout the generations.

Can you trace the threads back through your ancestors, remembering the trust and belief of a grandparent in God's leading of their lives?

over after the potluck, even making sure the toilet paper in the bathrooms was always full. Once she and I were at a retreat and we were asked to identify one gift we had. When Alberta's turn came she mumbled that she didn't have any special gift. My mouth dropped open in astonishment! She didn't see her amazing gift of service and what a joyful gift of love it was to God and to the whole congregation.

Many are like Alberta, we think if we don't have a "big" gift to give, we don't have one at all. But God wants to use each and every one of us. We each have different lives we touch in different ways. Paul spoke about the different parts in the body of Christ in 1 Corinthians 12 where he says, "... and if the ear should say, 'because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body,' it would not for that reason stop being a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were and ear, where would the sense of smell be? But, in fact, God

has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be."

In the same way, if we all had only the gift of music we would raise a glorious song to God, but the building would fall apart from neglect, the children wouldn't be educated about God, the communion bread wouldn't get baked, no one would go to Northern Illinois Foodbank, the computer information wouldn't get updated and newsletter wouldn't go out. In the same way if we were all gifted to care for and maintain the building and property, there would be no music!

It takes all of us doing our part, whether we view those parts as small or large. So, I challenge you this year to discover what is your "next right thing"; where you can connect to the body of Christ here at SOTP. Explore your interests and talents and then find a way to use them for God. We need every one of us to make the whole community complete.


