Lenten Midweek Worship

This year we are inviting the congregation to experience a new style of worship called "Dinner Church." It is a style of worship that includes the entire worshiping community with a meal and meaningful worship all in one. It is the style of worship through which Jesus instituted the Lord's supper with his disciples. Think of a good dinner party with a spiritual twist — and then just add art (music, poetry, Scripture), robust conversation and prayerful moments.

Beginning Wednesday, March 1 all are invited to join us beginning at 5:45 to gather in the Fellowship Hall of the church. At 6:00 pm we will have a welcoming prayer followed by the community being invited to get their soup and enjoy a meal together.
Following our meal, we will sing together, read a Scripture passage, have a brief reflection from Pastor Mark or Pastor Ryan and close with a song and prayer.

Our Lenten Theme this year is "Entering the Passion of Jesus." The theme is taken from a book written by Amy-Jill Levine. As the author reminds us, "During Lent you have the opportunity to think about

your life alongside the life of Jesus, inviting inward transformation and then outward action.



Dinner and worship will thus be part of our whole evening experience and we will be finished by 7:00 pm.

We hope you will come and experience a new style and way to experience worship together as the body of Christ at Shepherd of the Prairie.

A Note From Pastor Ryan

It seems very fitting that, as I write this column, I am also preparing a sermon on the

sayings of Jesus commonly known as "the Beatitudes" (the sayings that begin "Blessed are the poor in spirit...; Blessed are those who mourn...; etc.)" because the primary message of this column came to me all the way back in December and has only continued to simmer and reveal itself in new ways, including this week.

The basic message is this, as Christians, yes, we are called to believe in and follow Jesus, but perhaps just as important is our call to care for our neighbor. When asked what the greatest commandment is, Jesus offered two, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as vourself." (Matthew 22:37-39, NRSV) Loving our neighbor may sound like such an obvious thing to do but it is not as easy as it sounds, and we often need a reminder of just how impactful loving our neighbor can be.

This world we live in often demands so much from us that we end up too inwardly focused and fail to see the struggles of those around us.

On December 30, Tara and I saw Dear Evan Hansen in Chicago. It is a lifechanging musical that I recommend everyone see. Its run in Chicago is done, but fortunately it was made into a movie in 2021. Evan Hansen is a high school student who finds himself in the difficult position of consoling the parents of a classmate who died by suicide. As the story develops, it touches on so many of the struggles young people face today; social media, depression, anxiety, sexuality, and the struggle many (most?) of us have in finding our place in the world. One of the songs in the musical, Disappear, explores how people can feel like the world doesn't even see them; like they could just disappear and the world would never notice. "No one deserves to be forgotten. No one deserves to fade away. No one should come and go and have no one know he was ever even here. No one deserves to disappear." Some classmates of Connor, the boy who died by suicide, determined to help others and prevent further tragedies, start a campaign to remember Connor and raise money and awareness of the struggles students like Connor face. Disappear is followed by a song called You Will be Found and includes the lyrics, "Even when the dark comes crashing through; when you need a friend to carry you; when you're broken on the ground; you will be found.

As I took all of this in, I though of all the people in our families and communities who must feel exactly as these kids do. I wondered how many people, in my life, I have passed by, not knowing how much they are struggling. I thought of all of the privilege I have in living a comfortable life, and wondered what more I could do to understand the struggles of those less fortunate than I.

Loving our neighbor takes some effort. In order to love our neighbor the way Jesus calls us to and the way Martin Luther outlines in his explanation of the Ten Commandments, requires some work. We must first be aware of our neighbors and their needs. We must also be able to at least try to see the world through their eyes. Perhaps their experience does not line up with our own, so understanding their needs, issues, joys, and fears requires us to step out of our own experience and try to see things the way they do.

In the Beatitudes, Jesus says things like, "blessed are the poor, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven," and "blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth." I don't see these as statements that say, " we should all be poor and meek because that is

how we get closer to God." I see



these as calls to action. "Blessed are the poor because true followers of Christ will be there to lift them up and care for them." "Blessed are the meek for there will be a strong Christ follower there to stand up for them and help them live a better life."

Part of the struggle we have is that we must first understand the struggles of others and to understand how we can help them rather than reject them or neglect them. We must have empathy and a desire to help. As Dear Evan Hansen proclaims, everyone deserves to be seen and heard and loved and cared for. We may not understand or agree with what they are going through, but we must take the first step toward that end and find ways to ensure that every last one of God's beloved children on earth, feel the love that is the kingdom of heaven.

Jesus walks with each of us, and as he does, he shows us the importance of walking with others. Jesus' love for us is reckless and he bids us to recklessly love others.

Ministry Musings With Donna Kelly

Recently I was reading the story of the call of Matthew in the gospel of Mark along with a

commentary on it. The commentary didn't focus primarily on Mathew's call but on the events following it where Jesus and his disciples had dinner with Matthew and his friends at Matthew's house. Evidently, the "Social Media" of that day was to walk around town and check out who was eating with whom and chat about the company they kept. The buzz was that Jesus and his friends weren't very particular about their dining partners! In today's world this would be texted, tweeted, shared and posted all over the internet within minutes.

When Jesus is questioned about eating with "sinners and tax collectors" he replies that it is the sick who need physician and he came to call the sick. The commentary then went on to talk about how Jesus came to call the tax collector, the self-aware sinner, and the scribe, the self-presumed saint, and that how on any given Sunday it is difficult if not impossible to tell who is "sick" and who is "healthy". The author also wondered if we come to the table aware of our own sickness and need.

When we break bread and drink the cup, Jesus is dining at our house; and

so are the "sinners and tax collectors" and the "the crowds, the disciples, the scribes and the Pharisees". Included are the leader who is certain he/she is absolutely right about continuing to do things the way it has always been done, or was done at their old church, the one who struggles to stay on their meds to guiet the voices in their head, the one who "fell off the wagon" again and fights to get back on it, the parent with the noisy little ones, the bored middle schooler who would rather be anywhere else, the older person who sees their health deteriorating and the rest of us, each with our own sicknesses, are dining with Jesus today ready to receive the healing he has to offer. The crust of bread and the drop of wine are meant for all of us. But not just for our own sakes, but for the sake of others.

Jesus is often called, "The Great Physician". While on earth he healed many people of various diseases and conditions. If Jesus is the great physician, then we are called to be "physician assistants". Wikipedia defines Physician Assistants as "a healthcare professional who practices medicine as a part of a healthcare team with collaborating physicians and other providers. PAs are concerned with preventing and treating human illness and injury by

providing a plethora of health care services under a supervising physician". To me that sounds a lot like our call from Jesus, to care for his creation!

We don't need to be a medical professional to care for others. All we need is a listening ear and heart. We may not be able to prescribe medication or run medical tests; but we can hold a hand, listen to another,

serve a meal, send a card, make a quilt, sing a song, teach a child, pray with and for someone, share the gospel, play a game and unlimited other ways to show that Jesus and we care! Isn't that what being a disciple really is, following our leader and caring for his people and his world?

Come and be a physician assistant to the Great Physician, be part of his healthcare team to bring his love and healing to the world.

Council Action Item Approvals:

Finance Team recommendations were presented to Council at the December 19, 2022, meeting.

- Recommended the 2021 Audit team's recommendation that Shepherd of the Prairie Lutheran Church increase our insurance coverage for Dishonesty Bond from \$25,000 to \$1M, our Sexual Misconduct coverage from \$250,000/ \$500,000 to \$1M/\$3M and our Umbrella Policy from \$1M to \$3M at an annual policy premium increase not to exceed \$1,700. The resolution passed.
- 2. Recommended that Shepherd of the Prairie Lutheran Church utilize Memorial funds to build two new Sign-Up Kiosk cabinets with a total cost not to exceed \$1,500. The resolution passed.
