Ministry Musings With Donna

Recently I was reading something written by one of my favorite theologians, N.T. Wright. He was talking about what he called the "two poles" of Christian living, worship and mission. He said, "worship without mission becomes self-indulgence (and might even imply worship of a god other than the one revealed in Jesus): mission without worship degenerates into various kinds of do-goodery, following agendas that may be deeply felt but are by no means necessarily connected with Jesus." He then went on to talk about how mission and worship are very closely linked, that one flows into the other. "Glad rich worship of the God revealed in Jesus invites outsiders to come in, welcomes them, nourishes them, and challenges them. Mission can be conceived, particularly with Matthew 25 in mind, in terms of worshipping and serving the hidden Jesus that one meets in the poor and needv."

I agree so whole-heartedly with Bishop Wright. It's much like what the author of the book of James says, "Faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead." (NIV). In the same way, worship without mission accomplishes little. Worship that makes a difference includes the presence of action. If I say I believe in Jesus and participate in worship, but don't seek to move into mission, my worship can become a matter of words. Faith and worship should

propel me into mission and action. Worship and mission, mission and worship go



together like a hand in glove. Shepherd of the Prairie offers opportunities for both meaningful worship and significant mission. As we begin this Lenten Journey, I challenge and encourage you to find ways to take part in both. Join us on Wednesday nights and weekends for meaningful worship and then go into vour life to find ways to do significant mission. That mission could be here at SOTP or in your neighborhoods, or with family and friends. Worship could be in your favorite chair or watching nature and praising God for its beauty, and mission could be holding people in prayer or taking a meal to a friend going through a rough time. For me, sometimes worship is as simple as watching a full moon rise through my living room window and experiencing the awe of God's beautiful world. And sometimes, mission is as easy as calling a friend who is agonizing over a child's or grandchild's poor decision.

So, I encourage you this Lent to find ways to worship our amazing God revealed in Jesus and to move that worship into meaningful mission.

On Feb. 6 two powerful earthquakes hit Turkey and significantly impacted neighboring Syria. The first was a magnitude 7.8 earthquake in south central Turkey, followed hours later by a magnitude 7.5 quake in the southeastern part of the country. The two quakes devastated Türkiye and Syria, collapsing thousands of buildings and damaging infrastructure. Thousands of people have been killed and thousands more have been injured, yet search-andrescue efforts are only in the early stages. A cold and snowy weather system now moving through the region complicates response efforts.

Lutheran Disaster Response is committed to supporting ACT Alliance and other partners in responding to these earthquakes. Mere hours after the earthquakes hit, ACT Alliance member organizations began distributing emergency supplies, including medicines, bedding and other relief items. A comprehensive response will






