A Note From Pastor Mark

Living without hope, I think, is like suffering the death of a loved one. Everything appears bleak. You lose your direction and your purpose, your will to go on.

Proverbs 29:18 says: "Where there is no vision, the people perish."

Encouraging those who have lost hope is not an easy task. Words don't come easily and our mental attitude when we attempt to be of help to others may be different than theirs. Also, our faith makes a huge difference in believing that whatever the problem, God is in control.

Do you remember times when you felt surrounded by darkness, worry, anger, and grief? Have you ever felt that nothing could ease the turmoil overwhelming you? Did you find comfort in a friend's support, mental or spiritual, or did you rely on yourself to try and tough it out? If so, what was the result? How did that go?

While it was still dark on the morning of the third day, the followers of Jesus Christ were in distress. They were filled with a great deal of sorrow, disappointment, and confusion. Mary Magdalene doesn't find the body of Jesus in the tomb where it is "supposed" to be. What does this mean?

Imagine the disciples' mounting fear, anxiety and grief. They're probably wondering why, only days before, the man they expected to be their king was instead arrested, treated like a

common criminal and put to death in the most degrading and cruel way.



But, suddenly, on this particular Sunday morning, despair changes to joy when they understand that Christ has risen from the grave and had appeared to a few of his followers.

Suddenly gloom changes to hope.

Suddenly they believe that all will be well, just as he had told them. Now they, too, can look forward to a new life.

I can recall Easter Sundays from my childhood when the sanctuary seemed like a flower garden. New dresses and hats, all in pastel colors, bloomed throughout the congregation. It seemed like spring had arrived, and everything felt fresh and alive.

Easter Sunday is like that. It's is a time of celebration, when we give thanks and rejoice at our new life in God's Kingdom. This is a time of renewed hope.

I hope you and your family will join us on this journey of discovery this month (Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday....) to once again be reminded that "He is risen, He is risen indeed! Alleluia!!!

used the dinner table to reveal himself and embrace people in the kingdom of

God. It is little wonder that the first versions of the church assumed the dinner table as the time and place to gather, because it was there they expected Jesus to be with them in spirit in the same manner that he had been with them in body during the vears he walked the earth."

As we prepared to enter the Lenten season, Pastor Mark and I shared with you that we were going to experiment with something that would feel new. but would actually be very old. We shared that we were going to worship in a style known as dinner church. It is a style of worship that began to gain traction.

I first became aware of the movement in 2018 when pastors and youth leaders from across the ELCA gathered in Houston. Texas for our annual Extravaganza. We took a field trip to a dinner church known as Kindred and learned how an, otherwise ordinary, ELCA congregation evolved into a weekly dinner church that served a much broader community. Since that experience, I have seen and heard of dinner churches popping up all over the country.

The type of dinner church experience we have created at SOTP has been

"...Jesus fruitful on so many levels. For one, we are experiencing church in a way that is connected to how worship was experienced in the first centuries after Jesus' death and resurrection. Actually, we are experiencing "church" the way Jesus led it. Scholars have pointed out that it is very likely Jesus taught many of his parables while dinner was being served. He even chose dinner as the setting for making a new covenant with his followers; the promise of eternal life and his return to us in bread and wine.

> Each of these worship experiences sets the scene for how the entire meal is our communion. We begin by blessing and sharing the bread. This is followed by the larger meal, and the whole worship centered meal is concluded with the blessing and sharing of the wine. We embody the Words of Institution, "after supper, he took the cup..."

More than that, the experience of dinner church at SOTP has begun to build many bridges. People from different worship services have come together around the same table, met each other (often for the first time), heard some scripture, engaged in discussions of faith and life, and gotten to know each other on a deeper level.

By the time you read this, we will have concluded out Lenten version of these worship experiences, but we intend to continue to build upon the momentum we have felt and will create similar experiences in the very near future. In the meantime, if you

Ministry Musings With Donna

Context is extremely important, no matter what we are discussing. I've experienced someone coming to me to tell me a story or ask a question and until they give me the context of their story or question, I have no idea what they are talking about. Context is important when we hear the Jesus stories as well.

Sometimes when we hear Jesus' words and don't know the context, we may understand them quite differently than those who actually heard him speak the words, and possibly very different from Jesus' intent when he spoke them.

The social order of Israel during Jesus' time was as a kinship society, where people's status or worth was determined thru honor/shame (someone gains status, self-image or meaning primarily through how others see them). Before we became urbanized and industrialized, this honor/shame society was how most people in the world lived. Many Asian cultures still live in an honor/shame tradition where it is vital not

to "lose face".

In Jesus' time, honor and shame were the moral values that people



were compelled to follow. If a situation called for retaliation, honor obligated you to retaliate. To not retaliate would have been considered immoral and would bring shame upon you and your family. So, in Matthew 5 when Jesus tells his listeners to turn the other cheek, go the extra mile, love and pray for their enemies; these were truly radical and subversive words that shook their whole honor/shame foundations!!

What Jesus was trying to teach them was that their value is not in honor or shame, but in who we are in God; nothing more, nothing less. Who we are in God is a beloved child; we need no longer depend on our culture's or "in-group's" assessment of who we are. We are children of

God, God's image bearers, salt and light to the rest of the world.

While we might say that honor/shame isn't our value system, many of us still live with it as the basis for how we see ourselves. We judge ourselves on what we see in TV commercials or social media. We decide if we are good enough, thin enough, rich enough, good looking enough; if we have accumulated not only the "right things" (the "right" house, car, clothes, education, job, friends), but if we have enough of them. Often, we set our worth on those things, and if we don't have them we feel shamed or "less-than" and tend to judge others by the same standards. People are often seen as unworthy or "less

than" due to what they own, where they live, the color of their skin, their gender identity or religious or political affiliation. We worry much about what other people think, rather than about who we and others are as beloved children of God.

In his "Sermon on the Mount", Jesus turned the society and world of those who heard him upside down by telling them that their value was in being a beloved child of God, not in all those other things.

I believe he is trying to turn our value systems upside down as well. So, where do you see your and others' value, how do you determine your and others' worth? Who are you? Who are they?


