From Pastor Mark

The families we were born into have rituals and expectations that everyone knows. What are the spoken and unspoken expectations of your family? What do you feel you must do as a member of your family?

We are adopted into the family of God through baptism. As we live into the Word of God, we learn the expectations of being a member of God's family, too. As a member of God's family, what do you hold yourself accountable for? What do you think God will hold you accountable for?

Over these summer months we are discussing what it means to be synced up to God's grace in the world. To live out our baptismal vows so that Jesus doesn't become for us a nice thought but Jesus becomes a practice in our everyday lives. Jesus has been in teaching mode as we have read from Matthew chapters 9-11.

Persistence is what grows deep faith in the lives of the God's people. Persistence in doing those things that are life giving rather than life depleting.



We struggle as members of God's family to do the right thing. So many of us feel the tug and pull of competing priorities and expectations. The many choices we make each day seem daunting at times. We know what the best choice would be but we settle for the easy one, the one most comfortable, rather than the right one.

We are told we will receive our inheritance in the Kingdom of God because we fed the hungry, provided drink to the thirsty, welcomed the stranger, clothed the naked, and visited the sick and imprisoned. And, as we were compassionate and ministered to the least of these in this world, we were ministering directly to God.

Little things do matter, and God entrusts us with these. Each of us is asked to be welcoming, forgiving and loving to the sick, the marginalized, the poor, the widows, the orphans, the homeless, the disadvantaged, the hungry, and those who are different from us.

Each of us is called to tend to the family. When we use our gifts and talents to the glory of God, we are ministering to the children of the family. "Truly, I say to you, as you did this to one of least of these my children, you did it to me."

In all that you do for the children of God, look and see Jesus Christ in their faces and remember that you, a faithful servant, are filling the needs of the family of God.

From Pastor Ryan

On June 25, two of our youth, Jill Gillming, and I embarked on a weeklong service trip in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Through a Lutheran organization known as Serve Boldly that is part of Green Lake Lutheran Ministries, we engaged in

several ministries throughout the week. These ministries ranged from serving meals to working at a clothing store for people who are unhoused or transitioning. We also experienced some fun, social events, and opportunities for worship. Our group was small, but youth programming at SOTP is still in transition and I am hopeful that, through sharing about our experience, the four of us who went on the trip can build excitement and a desire for more youth to go on trips over the coming years.

The next major trip will be next year's ELCA Youth Gathering. This will be the first Gathering in six years. Ordinarily, the Gathering is held every three years, but the COVI-19 pandemic shut down the one that would have originally taken place in 2021.

The ELCA Youth Gathering is an amazing event that usually

involves 30,000 high school youth from across the U.S. gathering



for several days of worship, service, speakers, concerts, activities, and learning. The 2024 Gathering, "Created to Be," will take place July 16-20 in New Orleans, Louisiana. Because of the cancelation of the previous Gathering, a Young Adult Gathering is being offered during that same time. The Young Adult Gathering is for ages 18-35, with programming geared toward the 18-25 age range. Registration for these events opens in September. Look for more details from me soon!

As I mentioned above, our youth programming is in transition. Starting on August 9, our high school youth group will begin meeting on Wednesdays from 6:30-8:00 pm rather than our previous Thursdays from 7:00-9:00 pm. Our numbers have been small, and I have been focusing a lot of time and attention (with the help of my amazing confirmation team) to revamp and rejuvenate or confirmation program, but starting in August, high school youth and I will spend some significant time re-visioning what our youth programming.

This month marks the one-year anniversary of my ordination. I want to take this moment to thank you all for being such a welcoming, faithful, supportive, and active faith community! I feel so blessed to be one of your pastors, and my family has definitely found a home here at SOTP. I thank you for your support and patience as I have learned more about this community and have worked to strengthen the children, youth, and family ministries of our congregation.

Recently, I was listening to a radio station that plays Contemporary Christian music. The hosts put out a question and asked listeners to call in and give their answers. The question was, "If you could sit with God and ask God any question, what would it be?"

There was quite a variety of answers, as you can imagine. Some were serious and were the big questions; "Why did my loved one have to die?" "Why is there so much pain in the world?" "Why is there so much evil in the world?" "Why do we have war?"

And then there were some funny or silly questions like, "Do you have to trim your own beard?" "Or does it just not grow?" "Do you sleep?" "Are the streets in heaven really gold?"

Then there were those who responded saying that they didn't think we should ask God any questions; that we should just trust and never wonder why. The response that I thought said it best was, "I sit with God every day and ask questions."



I thought about all of this as I was driving and about all of these questions and responses. I believe that prayer is simply talking with God as I would with a close friend or family member. When I talk with friends or family, I talk and listen. We ask questions about each other and learn a lot. Asking and answering in love are part of a healthy relationship.

I often ask God questions about things I don't understand or wonder about. And usually, I find the answer. It could be in a song I hear, a movie I watch, a book I read, something someone says, a message on Sunday, the words of a child, in Scripture or in a thought that comes to me. I find the answers often come from the most unexpected places; many of those times in 'non-sacred' places. The Spirit moves in interesting ways!

So, next time you have a question you can't answer, sit with God, and ask God your questions. Then watch for God's answer to come to you and wonder at the way in which the Spirit works.
