A Note From Pastor Mark

Welcome to the New Year! As with every new beginning many of us ponder what might we might do to better ourselves and put ourselves in a better position to receive the good God wants to place in our lives.

Might I put a good word in for making worship a priority in the New Year.

The Prophet Isaiah begins our 2024 worship year with a bold statement "Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you" (Isaiah 60:1).

Have you ever found yourself in a pitch-dark place? You can't see anything. It is difficult to sense your relationship to anything around you for you cannot see. When you cannot see it's difficult to

relate. You feel isolated and alone. At the beginning of the New Year the prophet Isaiah reminds us that it is in the midst of darkness that light shines.

It is God's doing and action which brings light to total darkness. The dark days of exile in Babylon will be left behind. Then the purpose of God's people will be fulfilled. All peoples will be drawn to them through the light of God. The prophet declares, "Nations shall come to your light" (Isaiah 60:3a).

Epiphany is the season of the church year when we celebrate the light that drew the Magi or Wiseman to the Christ Child.

In the Christian story, people from other nations would come to see the light of the newborn child who comes to save.

As we in the northern hemisphere live in a time of darkness with short winter days, we are



reminded that light is what gives us hope, too. We seek the light, both spiritually and physically. We have learned that without the light we literally become sad, even hopeless. But with light we grow strong and more hopeful.

The light of God's grace comes to us and we are reminded again that we cannot live without it.

Just as Israel was renewed by God's light, so there is renewal for us by God's light that comes to touch our

lives. We certainly experienced this during COVID when we were forcibly separated from one another. Now we are able to gather again in community. Make worship a priority in this New Year. It is one of the best places to experience the light of God which comes to us in Word and Sacrament in community with God's people.

Seek the light! It is essential for our life and salvation. Indeed, without the light from God's creation we would not exist.

So, without the light of God's salvation we likewise cannot live. We look forward to being with you in worship!

A Note From Pastor Ryan

Goodbye 2023. Hello 2024! I feel like we say it every year, but where did the past

year go? I was reflecting on this question recently and felt some gratitude for the speed with which we experienced 2023. I believe this year went by so fast because of all that we do here at SOTP. Each month brings some big event or other. So many

ministry groups engage in so many activities. Worship is always purposeful and innovative. All this adds up to a busy, but fulfilling experience that speeds by. "Time

flies when you're having fun," as they say.

As we embark on a new calendar year, I am also reflecting, as I do each new year, on what I would like to accomplish in the next twelve months. Last year, I had our high school youth engage in a thought exercise known as "Scripture Resolutions." I would like to encourage you to try this exercise for yourself.

The concept is simple; think of your favorite Bible verse. Next, re-write the verse in your own words. Then, put yourself into the verse, and try to live it out. I'll give you an example. Matthew 6:33 reads, "...seek first the kingdom of God and its righteousness, and all these things will be given to

you as well." (NRSV) After rewriting it in your own words and putting yourself into it, it may read something like, "I will always seek the things of God in all I do. And if I do this, all that need here on this earth God will give me."

Once you have your newly scripted verse, you have a new resolution to keep during the year. Very often people will enter a new year vowing to lose weight, learn something new, try something new, be a better person, or

the like. These are noble goals, but a "scripture resolution" takes the resolution to the next level by grounding it in faith. Who knows, maybe your scripture resolution will even

support or reinforce a resolution you've already made!

If you are struggling to find a verse that is your favorite, or if your favorite verse doesn't lend itself well to this type of exercise, you could always start by reading through Proverbs or Psalms. Many of the verses in those books read like instructions or prayers and lend themselves well to being converted into goals. Likewise, there are passages in the books of the prophets, such as Isaiah, that can easily become goals.

2023 came with its ups and downs. 2024 will too, but like that verse in Matthew says, if we seek God's kingdom and keep Jesus' ways at the

Ministry Musings With Donna


Most of us were raised knowing the shortest verse in the Bible, "Jesus wept". The gospel of John tells us that when Jesus stood at the grave of his friend, Lazarus, and saw the pain his loved ones were experiencing, "Jesus wept." But I'm sure Jesus wept many other times in his life here on earth.

As a baby he cried like all babies do; when he was hungry, tired, cold, scared, needed a diaper change. I'm sure as a child he cried when he fell and scraped his knee or when other kids teased him. Certainly, he cried when his earthly father Joseph died.

Luke tells us that when Jesus rode into Jerusalem on the day we call Palm Sunday, he paused at the top of the hill and wept over Jerusalem and the future he knew was coming to it. And I wonder if today he stands in the Holy

Land and weeps; as the bombs go off, and the tanks roll, and children scream, and widows and

he weeps for Gaza and Israel. I wonder if he stands in battlefields and weeps for Russians and Ukrainians.

I believe Jesus weeps for all his people. He weeps in the refugee camps and homeless shelters, the crack houses, and the street

corners. He weeps in the ghetto and on Wall Street, the inner city, and the suburbs. He weeps at the graveside as a beloved grandpa is laid to rest and a

three-year-old asks, "Where's Grandpa?" He weeps with those who mourn the death of their 34-year-old son, father, and husband. He stands and weeps with the 19-year-old who sees no other option for peace than taking his own life, and with their family. He weeps with the people of Lewiston, Maine over the loss of life and peace in a senseless shooting spree, and he weeps with the family of the shooter. And when Jesus weeps, I wonder who consoles him? Is there a way we can weep with him

and share his pain?

We just celebrated Christmas. We just rejoiced in the baby in the manger, but really, we are celebrating the incarnation of our God in Jesus, the incarnation of love. Love that knows no limits; love that embraces all. Love that we called to share into this world. Let us choose this year to welcome all, weep with those who weep and rejoice with those who rejoice, just as our Lord does.

On Saturday, January 27, 10am-2pm, we'll explore Judaism 101.

This introduction to the Jewish faith is a must! Why?

First of all, to really understand who Jesus was and is, we need to know something about the faith in which he was reared.

Secondly, after Jesus' death and resurrection, his first followers (called "Christians") were considered nothing more than another Jewish sect, like the Pharisees and Sadducees.

Third, two-thirds of our Bible is made up of the Jewish scriptures--what we call the Old Testament.

Fourth, almost all of the elements of the Christian faith have their roots in

Judaism--baptism (the Jewish rites of purification), Holy Communion (the Jewish Passover), monotheism (the belief in one God), the two greatest commandments according to Jesus (love of God from Deuteronomy 6 and love of neighbor from Leviticus 19); and our understanding what it means to be truly human--all from the Old Testament.

In addition, the rise in antisemitism today impacts us too as we speak up on behalf of our sisters and brothers from the House of David. So sign up today. We look forward to having you with us!

Coming Soon!Save Your Plastic

Coming Soon!!!

If your household is anything like mine, you probably have a bag full of plastic grocery bags. Maybe you have a good use for them or again, if you are like me, they just sit in a closet or under the sink – multiplying. Starting early 2024, SOTP will have the solution to all your unwanted plastic bag problems! The Community Outreach team will be enrolling SOTP in the NexTrex Recycling Challenge. Over the next 12 months, our goal is to reach over 1,000 lbs in approved plastic products, some of which are listed below. There will be labeled bins between the sets of doors leading into the church. As needed, the bins will be emptied, weighed, and taken to the nearest drop off location (Jewel) to be compacted and shipped to a Trex manufacturing plant. Trex is the maker of composite decking and railing. If we reach our goal within the year, will we be given a free Trex composite bench. The Community Outreach team is working with the Huntley Park District to see if we can donate the bench to the new park that will be built in the new neighborhood behind the church. More information will be going out about what products are and are not acceptable when the bins arrive. We hope you will help us reach our goal! 
