I love mystery and police dramas, whether in print or on film. It's one of my favorite ways to relax and unwind. Some of you may remember the series, "Castle" from the 2010s. Recently, it began streaming from the beginning and I have watched several episodes during our latest

snowstorms. In one of the early episodes, a woman loses her mother to a home invasion. At the end of the hour, this young woman asks the female lead, Kate Beckett (who also lost her mother to violence), "How do you get over it?" Detective Beckett answers, "You don't. But one day you wake up and find you don't mind carrying it."

While the line and the truth it speaks of was very profound, I was even more surprised and taken with the fact that even in a television show, God can speak a word of grace. We usually expect for God to speak to us through our Bible, the pastor's message, a hymn or song, or a daily devotion we read.

But I was reminded of the fact that God speaks in many and various ways; ways that are often quite simple. God speaks to each of us in diverse ways, a baby's smile, a beautiful sunset, the song of a bird, or a rainbow after a storm. God speaks in the wisdom of a child, the words of a song, a hug from a friend or family member. God can speak in the words of a poem, or a social media comment, a greeting on Facebook, a phone call or a text, a card in the mail. Sometimes I receive an "I Love You" emoji from a friend or family member and it reminds me that God's love is there for me too. We often can experience God's love and comfort through a pet.

While God's love comes through all these ways and more, we usually only hear and feel it if we are listening. God speaks, but we need to be open to hear God's voice. So, for the next few weeks, open your heart and mind to listen for God's speaking to you in a variety of ways . If you are open and listening, you may find God's "I love you" every day.




New Member Gathering Join Us!

Collecting Plastic Now Building a Bench

Now Here!

If your household is anything like mine, you probably have a bag full of plastic grocery bags. Maybe you have a good use for them or again, if you are like me, they just sit in a closet or under the sink – multiplying. Starting now, SOTP has the solution to all your unwanted plastic bag problems! The Community Outreach team will be enrolling SOTP in the NexTrex Recycling Challenge. Over the next 12 months, our goal is to reach over 1,000 lbs in approved plastic products, some of which are listed below. There will be labeled bins between the sets of doors leading into the church. As needed, the bins will be emptied, weighed, and taken to the nearest drop off location (Jewel) to be compacted and shipped to a Trex manufacturing plant. Trex is the maker of composite decking and railing. If we reach our goal within the year, will we be given a free Trex composite bench. The Community Outreach team is working with the Huntley Park District to see if we can donate the bench to the new park that will be built in the new neighborhood behind the church. More information will be going out about what products are and are not acceptable when the bins arrive. We hope you will help us reach our goal! What is the difference between a refugee, a migrant, an immigrant and an asylum seeker?

A "migrant" is a worker who comes over to work temporarily and returns to their home country each time.

An immigrant is technically some who comes to work permanently (i.e. green cards etc.)

Asylum seekers are when people flee their own country and seek sanctuary in another country, they apply for asylum – the right to be recognized as a refugee and receive legal protection and material assistance. (what is commonly now in the US referred to as immigrants.

A refugee is someone who has been forced to flee his or her country because of persecution, war or violence. A refugee has a wellfounded fear of persecution for reasons of race, religion, nationality, political opinion or membership in a particular social group. Most likely, they cannot return home or are afraid to do so. War and ethnic, tribal and religious violence are leading causes of refugees fleeing their countries.

Refugees apply to a country and are vigorously vetted <u>before arriving</u> and accepted into the country they have applied for.

Walk the Halls With Us From the SOTP Wellness Team

February is Heart Month, a time to bring attention to the importance of cardiovascular health and what we can do to reduce our risk of cardiovascular disease.

What you eat makes a difference to your heart. A heart-healthy eating plan

emphasizes vegetables, fruits, and whole grains, includes fat-free or low-fat dairy products, and limits foods high in saturated fat and sugar-sweetened beverages and sweets.

The Heart-Check Mark is a simple tool to help Eat Smart. Foods marked with the American Heart Association heart-check mark are required to meet specific criteria for:

- Nutrients
- Fat
- Sodium

There are 1000's of items stamped with this mark, which are always good options to look for.

This is some of what it takes to be Heart-Check certified*

Source of Nutrients

Beneficial Nutrients (naturally occurring): 10% or more of the Daily Value of 1 of these nutrients (vitamin A, vitamin C, calcium, protein or dietary fiber)



Limited in Bad Fats

Saturated Fat-1 g or less per serving size and 15% or less calories from saturated fat; Trans Fat: Less than .5 g per label serving size and per standard serving size. Products containing partially hydrogenated oils are not eligible for certification.

Limited in Sodium

Sodium: one of four sodium limits applies depending on the particular food category: up to 140 mg, 240 mg, or 360 mg per label serving, or 480 mg per label serving and per standard serving size.*
